CONTENT

The bill would amend Public Act 3 of 1939, the Public Service Commission (PSC) law, to require a provider (a municipally owned electric utility) to notify the PSC of any shut-off of service that resulted in death or serious injury.

Upon notification or on the PSC's own motion, the Commission could investigate any shutoff by a provider that resulted in death or serious injury. After completing its investigation, the Commission could refer the matter to the Attorney General for commencement of a civil action under proposed Section 9p.

(Section 9p would be added by Senate Bill 557. It would authorize the Attorney General or a municipally owned electric utility customer to commence a civil action for injunctive relief against a utility that failed to meet the applicable requirements of the PSC law. In issuing a final order, a court could award costs of litigation to the prevailing party.)

FISCAL IMPACT
