### **RATIONALE**

Mark V. Ingram II is a sophomore running back for the University of Alabama and the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner. He grew up in Flint, Michigan, and attended high school at Southwestern Academy, where he was ranked as the 17<sup>th</sup> best athlete in the nation and the 6<sup>th</sup> best athlete in Michigan by according to biographical Rivals.com, information on the University of Alabama website. Ingram has received a number of honors and awards after the Alabama Crimson Tide won its 13<sup>th</sup> National Football Championship in 2009. In recognition of his accomplishments, it has been suggested that a highway in the Flint area should be named after him.

## **CONTENT**

The bill would amend the Michigan Memorial Highway Act to designate highway I-475 beginning at the intersection of Hill Road and I-475 in Genesee County and continuing north to the intersection of Carpenter Road and I-475 as the "Mark V. Ingram II Freeway".

### **Supporting Argument**

With a longtime interest in a variety of sports, Mark Ingram has shown a capacity for leadership from an early age, and has always displayed a competitive edge and drive to succeed. Because of his record of strong academic performance and leadership community, he is considered a powerful role model for many Flint students. Naming a highway in his honor would be a fitting way to recognize those accomplishments.
