 Uniform Services Savings. The Governor recommended \$6.0 million GF/GP attrition savings, a reduction in trooper overtime (\$1,175,800 GF/GP), and a shift of \$2.2 million restricted from the Secondary Road Patrol Grant Program into Uniform Services to supplant a reduction in GF/GP. 	(7,175,800)
Fleet Leasing. The Governor recommended a GF/GP reduction to Fleet Leasing appropriations.	(856,800)
 Office of Drug Control Policy Transfer. The Governor included a shift of the Office of Drug Control Policy, which disburses federal law enforcement grants, from the Department of Community Health to the Department of State Police, per E.O. 2009-42. The transfer includes 4.0 FTEs. 	8,488,900
 Forensic Science Overtime. The Governor included a GF/GP reduction in overtime appropriations for State Police Crime Laboratory personnel. 	(298,400)
Eliminate Capitol Security Guards. The Governor recommends ending the program at the Capitol, reducing GF/GP and 7.0 FTEs.	(543,000)
6. School Bus Inspection Downsizing. The Governor recommended downsizing the unit from 15.0 FTEs and \$1,432,900 in School Aid Revenue to 4.0 FTES and \$450,000 in School Aid Revenue. The unit would reduce activities to only perform spot-check inspections in the state.	(1,047,400)
7. Secondary Road Patrol Grants. The Governor recommended the reduction of \$2.2 million to the grant program and shifting that restricted revenue over to Uniform Services to support trooper salaries. The Governor for FY 2010-11, recommended \$11,840,300 for Secondary Road Patrol Grants.	(2,200,000)
8. Fee Increase Proposal. The Governor recommended raising the ICHAT fee from \$10 to \$15 and the fingerprint processing fee from \$30 to \$40, to be used to supplant reduced GF/GP, \$1,763,000 and \$3,150,000 respectively.	0
 Other Fund Shifts The Governor proposed a fund shift of \$2.0 million GF/GP to ARRA funds for Multi-Jurisdictional Task Forces and \$1,053,300 from Victim's Rights Fund revenue to GF/GP. 	0
 Adjustment for Federal/Restricted Funds Received. The Governor's budget reflects reductions to expected appropriated lower levels of Federal (\$2,858,900) and restricted (\$1,808,100) fund support and in other instances increases in Federal (\$2.0 million) and in restricted (\$296,200). 11. Administrative Savings. The Governor's recommended the transfer of the Officers Survivor Tuition Program to the Higher Ed budget (\$48,500 GF/GP) and other administrative reductions across several program lines totaling \$1,152,300 GF/GP.	(1,200,800)
 Economic Adjustments. The Governor's FY11 economic adjustments for the department included \$12,791,500 gross (\$9,599,500 GF/GP). For DIT, a total of \$790,400 (\$521,100 GF/GP). 	13,581,900

Deleted Boilerplate Sections

- 1. Hiring Freeze. Required hiring freeze with exceptions permitted by budget director; requires report. (Sec. 205)
- 2. Privatization. Required privatization plan notice. (Sec. 207)
- 3. Personnel Reimbursement. Required reimbursement of expenses per DMB Act. (Sec. 211)
- 4. Contractual Services. Prohibits subsidization of any contractual services supplied by the Department. (Sec. 213)
- 5. Report Requirements. Required the Department to create and retain reports. (Sec. 214)
- 6. Casino Oversight Report. Required report of the Department casino oversight activity. (Sec. 215)
- 7. VIN Information. Required sharing of crash data and provision for use of fees for data. (Sec. 216)
- 8. School Violence Hotline. Required funds to be spent on toll-free school violence hotline. (Sec. 217)
- 9. Post Closing Notice. Required legislative notice of 180 days prior to post closing or consolidation. (Sec. 219)
- 10. Community Assistance. Required MSP to assist communities underserved by local law enforcement. (Sec. 220)
- 11. Marshall Post. Required pursuit of funding for new Marshall State Police Post. (Sec. 221)
- 12. **Disciplinary Actions.** Prohibits action against employees for communicating with Legislature. (Sec. 224)
- 13. Interoperability. Required statewide effort to obtain communications interoperability. (Sec. 226)
- 14. Hiring and Recruiting. Required hiring priority to be given to MCOLES certified officers. (Sec. 232)
- 15. Forensic/Uniform Services Transfers. Allows transfers into, but not out of, these programs. (Sec. 235)
- 16. Cost Review. Required the DMB and the Department to reduce building operations and leasing costs. (Sec. 238)
- 17. M.I.S. Assistance. Language allowing traffic support for the Michigan International Speedway. (Sec. 239)
- 18. Lapse Report. Requires report of projected year end GF/GP lapse. (Sec. 242)
- 19. LEIN/Bridge Systems. Requires coordination between LEIN and DHS Bridge systems for data retrieval. (Sec. 245)
- 20. Expenditure Posting. Requires Internet posting of expenditures. (Sec. 253)
- 21. FTE Report. Requires bimonthly FTE report to Legislature. (Sec. 254)
- 22. Lease Contracts. States intent for state to honor the leases it signs. (Sec. 255)
- 23. Purchase of New MSP Headquarter Building. Authorizes purchase of building. (Sec. 256)
- 24. Information Technology Projects. Allows designation as a work project. (Sec. 303)
- LEIN Report. Required report on security of information in LEIN system. (Sec. 304)
- 26. **LEIN Monitoring.** Required department to monitor misuse of LEIN system. (Sec. 305)
- 27. **LEIN Probation Information.** Required inclusion of probation information on LEIN system. (Sec. 306)
- 28. Local Tower Usage. Required department to act as liaison to foster local use of state radio towers. (Sec. 307)
- 29. LEIN Fees. Required 60 day notice and report on any LEIN fee increase. (Sec. 308)
- 30. Data Systems for Insurance. Language allowing the bidding out for and insurance enforcement system. (Sec. 309)
- 31. State Radio Communication System. Calls for improvements to allow for more local users. (Sec. 310)
- 32. Evidence Collection. Required department to ensure proper collection of evidence in sexual assault cases. (Sec. 502)
- 33. **Officer Training.** Allows use of Justice Training Funds to be used for Motor Carrier Officers and Capitol Security personnel for the purpose of qualifying them for MCOLES certification. (Sec. 604)
- 34. Homeland Security. Required grants primarily for first responders and not to supplant GF/GP. (Sec. 803)
- 35. Capitol Security. Prohibits other use of funds appropriated for Capitol Security. (Sec. 902)
- 36. Prison Policing. Required that prison areas do not experience a downgrading of MSP services. (Sec. 1101)
- 37. Meth Lab Data. Required report of methamphetamine-related criminal activities. (Sec. 1102)
- 38. **School Bus Inspections.** Required annual inspections of each school bus in the State, plus a report. (Sec. 1201)

Amended Boilerplate Sections

- 39. DNA Protocol. The Governor changed the section to only require notification if DNA protocol changes. (Sec. 501)
- 40. Trooper School. Governor included only language limiting trooper funding to certain expenses. (Sec. 218)
- 41. Out-of-state Travel Policy. Governor removed an exception to travel rules. (Sec. 223)
- 42. Secondary Road Patrol. Governor changed required quarterly report to bi-annual. (Sec. 401)
- 43. **Canine Unit Donations.** The Governor removed prohibition of using donations to supplant GF/GP. (Sec. 1002) **New Boilerplate Section**
- 44. Byrne Grant. Requires the department to provide a \$1.8 million Byrne grant to the Judiciary. (Sec. 241)
