## **SENATE BILL No. 957**

October 28, 2009, Introduced by Senator OLSHOVE and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Bioeconomy.

A bill to amend 1997 PA 70, entitled "Compulsive gaming prevention act," by amending sections 4 and 5 (MCL 432.254 and 432.255).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. The director of the department of community health,
- 2 after consulting with the racing commissioner DIRECTOR OF THE
- 3 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, the commissioner of the state lottery,
- 4 and the chairperson of the Michigan gaming control board, shall
- 5 authorize the distribution of funds-MONEY from the compulsive
- 6 gaming prevention fund to be used exclusively for the treatment,
- 7 prevention, education, training, research, and evaluation of
- 8 pathological gamblers and their families.

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- 9 Sec. 5. (1) The results of funded studies and recommendations
- 10 for any changes in funding levels OF THE SERVICES, PROGRAMS, OR

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- 1 RESEARCH REQUIRED UNDER THIS ACT shall be submitted to the racing
- 2 commissioner DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, the
- 3 commissioner of the state lottery, the chairperson of the Michigan
- 4 gaming control board, the chairs of the senate and house STANDING
- 5 committees on WITH JURISDICTION OVER gaming issues, the senate and
- 6 house of representatives appropriations committees, and the
- 7 director of the department of community health.
- 8 (2) If the director of the department of community health
- 9 determines that the money in the compulsive gaming prevention fund
- 10 is inadequate to fund the services, programs, or research required
- 11 under this act, the Michigan gaming control board may assess a fee
- 12 on each of the 3 casinos licensed under the Michigan gaming control
- and revenue act, the Initiated Law of 1996, MCL 432.201 to 432.216,
- 14 CASINO LICENSEES that will equal the additional amount needed to
- 15 adequately fund the services, programs, and research required under
- 16 this act.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 18 unless Senate Bill No. 955
- of the 95th Legislature is enacted into law.
