## **HOUSE BILL No. 4431**

February 24, 2009, Introduced by Reps. Meadows, LeBlanc, Hammel and Gonzales and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled
"The Michigan penal code,"
by amending sections 239 and 239a (MCL 750.239 and 750.239a),
section 239a as added by 1996 PA 496.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 239. (1) All—EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) AND
- 2 SUBJECT TO SECTION 239A, ALL pistols, weapons, or devices carried,
- 3 possessed, or used contrary to this chapter are hereby declared
- 4 forfeited to the state —and shall be turned over to the
- 5 commissioner of the Michigan state police or his designated
- 6 representative, DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE for such disposition as
- 7 the commissioner may prescribe DETERMINED APPROPRIATE BY THE
  - DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE.

- 1 (2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT PROHIBIT A POLICE AGENCY FROM
- 2 RETAINING ANY PISTOL, WEAPON, OR DEVICE CARRIED OR POSSESSED IN
- 3 VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER FOR OFFICIAL USE BY THAT POLICE AGENCY,
- 4 INCLUDING FOR TRAINING OR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES. THE POLICE AGENCY
- 5 SHALL COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 239A FOR ANY PISTOL,

- 13 (E) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
- 14 RESOURCES.
- Sec. 239a. (1) Before a firearm is turned over for disposal
- under section 239 239(1) OR IS RETAINED UNDER SECTION 239(2), the
- 17 police agency that recovered or confiscated the firearm shall
- 18 determine if there is a known legal owner of the firearm and
- 19 whether the firearm has been reported stolen. If the police agency
- 20 determines a serial number has been eradicated from the firearm,
- 21 the police agency shall submit the firearm to the department of
- 22 state police or a forensic laboratory for serial number restoration
- 23 to determine legal ownership. In making the determination of
- 24 ownership required under this subsection, the police agency shall
- 25 review information contained in the law enforcement information
- 26 network and examine that police agency's stolen property reports.
- 27 If the police agency determines the firearm is stolen, the police

- 1 agency shall notify the agency reporting the firearm as stolen and
- 2 return the firearm to that agency at the conclusion of the criminal
- 3 case. The agency receiving the firearm shall notify the legal owner
- 4 and provide for disposition of the firearm in compliance with
- 5 subsections (3) and (4).
- 6 (2) If the owner is not alleged to have been involved in the
- 7 violation for which forfeiture is required or did not knowingly
- 8 allow the firearm to be possessed illegally, notification shall be
- 9 given at the conclusion of the criminal case but not later than 90
- 10 days before the firearm is disposed of OR RETAINED under section
- 11 239. Notification under this subsection may be given by certified
- 12 mail sent to the owner's last known address, or by personal contact
- 13 with the owner.
- 14 (3) The police agency shall return a firearm to its owner if
- 15 the owner claims the firearm within the notification period and
- 16 that police agency determines that the owner was not involved in
- 17 the violation for which the firearm was seized. Except as otherwise
- 18 provided in subsection (2), a firearm shall be returned under this
- 19 subsection within 30 days after the firearm is claimed by the owner
- 20 unless the owner is prohibited from possessing a firearm under
- 21 state or federal law.
- 22 (4) An individual claiming ownership of a firearm may petition
- 23 the circuit court for return of a firearm under this section if
- 24 return of the firearm is denied by the police agency or if the
- 25 firearm is not returned within 30 days as required under subsection
- 26 (3). The police agency shall not dispose of OR RETAIN a firearm
- 27 until the expiration of the 30-day period or, if a petition is

- 2 (5) A police agency shall turn confiscated weapons over to the
- 3 department of state police under section 239 239(1) not more than 1
- 4 year after final conclusion of the criminal case and expiration of
- 5 the appeal period. The police agency shall first make a reasonable
- 6 effort to contact the owner of the firearm to determine whether a
- 7 demand for the firearm is forthcoming.
- 8 (6) A police agency that seizes a firearm for forfeiture under
- 9 this act shall exercise reasonable care to protect the firearm from
- 10 loss or damage while the firearm is in its custody.
- 11 (7) As used in this section, "police agency" means 1 or more
- 12 of the following:
- 13 (a) The department of state police.
- 14 (b) A county sheriff's department.
- 15 (c) A—THE police department or public safety department of a
- 16 local unit of government CITY, VILLAGE, OR TOWNSHIP.
- 17 (d) A-THE police department or public safety department of a
- 18 COMMUNITY COLLEGE, college, or university.
- 19 (E) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
- 20 RESOURCES.
