THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2950. (1) Except as provided in subsections (27) and (28), by commencing an independent action to obtain relief under this section, by joining a claim to an action, or by filing a motion in an action in which the petitioner and the individual to be restrained or enjoined are parties, an individual may petition the family division of circuit court to enter a personal protection order to restrain or enjoin a spouse, a former spouse, an

- 1 individual with whom he or she has had a child in common, an
- 2 individual with whom he or she has or has had a dating
- 3 relationship, or an individual residing or having resided in the
- 4 same household as the petitioner from doing 1 or more of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (a) Entering onto premises.
- 7 (b) Assaulting, attacking, beating, molesting, or wounding a
- 8 named individual.
- 9 (c) Threatening to kill or physically injure a named
- 10 individual.
- 11 (d) Removing minor children from the individual having legal
- 12 custody of the children, except as otherwise authorized by a
- 13 custody or parenting time order issued by a court of competent
- 14 jurisdiction.
- (e) Purchasing or possessing a firearm.
- 16 (f) Interfering with petitioner's efforts to remove
- 17 petitioner's children or personal property from premises that are
- 18 solely owned or leased by the individual to be restrained or
- 19 enjoined.
- 20 (g) Interfering with petitioner at petitioner's place of
- 21 employment or education or engaging in conduct that impairs
- 22 petitioner's employment or educational relationship or environment.
- 23 (h) Having access to information in records concerning a minor
- 24 child of both petitioner and respondent that will inform respondent
- 25 about the address or telephone number of petitioner and
- 26 petitioner's minor child or about petitioner's employment address.
- (i) Engaging in conduct that is prohibited under section 411h

- 1 or 411i of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.411h and
- **2** 750.411i.
- 3 (j) Any other specific act or conduct that imposes upon or
- 4 interferes with personal liberty or that causes a reasonable
- 5 apprehension of violence.
- 6 (2) If the respondent is a person who is issued a license to
- 7 carry a concealed weapon and is required to carry a weapon as a
- 8 condition of his or her employment, a police officer certified by
- 9 the commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL
- 10 28.601 to 28.616, a sheriff, a deputy sheriff or a member of the
- 11 Michigan department of state police, a local corrections officer,
- 12 department of corrections employee, or a federal law enforcement
- 13 officer who carries a firearm during the normal course of his or
- 14 her employment, the petitioner shall notify the court of the
- 15 respondent's occupation prior to the issuance of the personal
- 16 protection order. This subsection does not apply to a petitioner
- 17 who does not know the respondent's occupation.
- 18 (3) A petitioner may omit his or her address of residence from
- 19 documents filed with the court under this section. If a petitioner
- 20 omits his or her address of residence, the petitioner shall provide
- 21 the court with a mailing address.
- 22 (4) The court shall issue a personal protection order under
- 23 this section if the court determines that there is reasonable cause
- 24 to believe that the individual to be restrained or enjoined may
- 25 commit 1 or more of the acts listed in subsection (1). In
- 26 determining whether reasonable cause exists, the court shall
- 27 consider all of the following:

- 1 (a) Testimony, documents, or other evidence offered in support
- 2 of the request for a personal protection order.
- 3 (b) Whether the individual to be restrained or enjoined has
- 4 previously committed or threatened to commit 1 or more of the acts
- 5 listed in subsection (1).
- 6 (5) A court shall not issue a personal protection order that
- 7 restrains or enjoins conduct described in subsection (1)(a) if all
- 8 of the following apply:
- 9 (a) The individual to be restrained or enjoined is not the
- 10 spouse of the moving party.
- 11 (b) The individual to be restrained or enjoined or the parent,
- 12 guardian, or custodian of the minor to be restrained or enjoined
- 13 has a property interest in the premises.
- 14 (c) The moving party or the parent, guardian, or custodian of
- 15 a minor petitioner has no property interest in the premises.
- 16 (6) A court shall not refuse to issue a personal protection
- 17 order solely due to the absence of any of the following:
- 18 (a) A police report.
- 19 (b) A medical report.
- (c) A report or finding of an administrative agency.
- 21 (d) Physical signs of abuse or violence.
- 22 (7) If the court refuses to grant a personal protection order,
- 23 it shall state immediately in writing the specific reasons it
- 24 refused to issue a personal protection order. If a hearing is held,
- 25 the court shall also immediately state on the record the specific
- 26 reasons it refuses to issue a personal protection order.
- 27 (8) A personal protection order shall not be made mutual.

- 1 Correlative separate personal protection orders are prohibited
- 2 unless both parties have properly petitioned the court pursuant to
- 3 UNDER subsection (1).
- 4 (9) A personal protection order is effective and immediately
- 5 enforceable anywhere in this state when signed by a judge. Upon
- 6 service, a personal protection order may also be enforced by
- 7 another state, an Indian tribe, or a territory of the United
- 8 States.
- 9 (10) The court shall designate the law enforcement agency that
- 10 is responsible for entering the personal protection order into the
- 11 law enforcement information network as provided by the L.E.I.N.
- 12 C.J.I.S. policy council act, of 1974, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to
- 13 $\frac{28.216}{}$ 28.215.
- 14 (11) A personal protection order shall include all of the
- 15 following, and to the extent practicable the following shall be
- 16 contained in a single form:
- 17 (a) A statement that the personal protection order has been
- 18 entered to restrain or enjoin conduct listed in the order and that
- 19 violation of the personal protection order will subject the
- 20 individual restrained or enjoined to 1 or more of the following:
- 21 (i) If the respondent is 17 years of age or more, immediate
- 22 arrest and the civil and criminal contempt powers of the court, and
- 23 that if he or she is found guilty of criminal contempt, he or she
- 24 shall be imprisoned for not more than 93 days and may be fined not
- 25 more than \$500.00.
- 26 (ii) If the respondent is less than 17 years of age, immediate
- 27 apprehension or being taken into custody, and subject to the

- 1 dispositional alternatives listed in section 18 of chapter XIIA of
- 2 the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.18.
- 3 (iii) If the respondent violates the personal protection order
- 4 in a jurisdiction other than this state, the respondent is subject
- 5 to the enforcement procedures and penalties of the state, Indian
- 6 tribe, or United States territory under whose jurisdiction the
- 7 violation occurred.
- 8 (b) A statement that the personal protection order is
- 9 effective and immediately enforceable anywhere in this state when
- 10 signed by a judge, and that, upon service, a personal protection
- 11 order also may be enforced by another state, an Indian tribe, or a
- 12 territory of the United States.
- 13 (c) A statement listing the type or types of conduct enjoined.
- 14 (d) An expiration date stated clearly on the face of the
- 15 order.
- 16 (e) A statement that the personal protection order is
- 17 enforceable anywhere in Michigan by any law enforcement agency.
- 18 (f) The law enforcement agency designated by the court to
- 19 enter the personal protection order into the law enforcement
- 20 information network.
- 21 (g) For ex parte orders, a statement that the individual
- 22 restrained or enjoined may file a motion to modify or rescind the
- 23 personal protection order and request a hearing within 14 days
- 24 after the individual restrained or enjoined has been served or has
- 25 received actual notice of the order and that motion forms and
- 26 filing instructions are available from the clerk of the court.
- 27 (12) An ex parte personal protection order shall be issued and

- 1 effective without written or oral notice to the individual
- 2 restrained or enjoined or his or her attorney if it clearly appears
- 3 from specific facts shown by verified complaint, written motion, or
- 4 affidavit that immediate and irreparable injury, loss, or damage
- 5 will result from the delay required to effectuate notice or that
- 6 the notice will itself precipitate adverse action before a personal
- 7 protection order can be issued.
- 8 (13) A personal protection order issued under subsection (12)
- 9 is valid for not less than 182 days. The individual restrained or
- 10 enjoined may file a motion to modify or rescind the personal
- 11 protection order and request a hearing under the Michigan court
- 12 rules. The motion to modify or rescind the personal protection
- 13 order shall be filed within 14 days after the order is served or
- 14 after the individual restrained or enjoined has received actual
- 15 notice of the personal protection order unless good cause is shown
- 16 for filing the motion after the 14 days have elapsed.
- 17 (14) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the
- 18 court shall schedule a hearing on the motion to modify or rescind
- 19 the ex parte personal protection order within 14 days after the
- 20 filing of the motion to modify or rescind. If the respondent is a
- 21 person described in subsection (2) and the personal protection
- 22 order prohibits him or her from purchasing or possessing a firearm,
- 23 the court shall schedule a hearing on the motion to modify or
- 24 rescind the ex parte personal protection order within 5 days after
- 25 the filing of the motion to modify or rescind.
- 26 (15) The clerk of the court that issues a personal protection
- 27 order shall do all of the following immediately upon issuance and

- 1 without requiring a proof of service on the individual restrained
- 2 or enjoined:
- 3 (a) File a true copy of the personal protection order with the
- 4 law enforcement agency designated by the court in the personal
- 5 protection order.
- 6 (b) Provide the petitioner with not less than 2 true copies of
- 7 the personal protection order.
- 8 (c) If respondent is identified in the pleadings as a law
- 9 enforcement officer, notify the officer's employing law enforcement
- 10 agency, if known, about the existence of the personal protection
- 11 order.
- 12 (d) If the personal protection order prohibits respondent from
- 13 purchasing or possessing a firearm, notify the concealed weapon
- 14 licensing board in respondent's county of residence about the
- 15 existence and contents of the personal protection order.
- 16 (e) If the respondent is identified in the pleadings as a
- 17 department of corrections employee, notify the state department of
- 18 corrections about the existence of the personal protection order.
- 19 (f) If the respondent is identified in the pleadings as being
- 20 a person who may have access to information concerning the
- 21 petitioner or a child of the petitioner or respondent and that
- 22 information is contained in friend of the court records, notify the
- 23 friend of the court for the county in which the information is
- 24 located about the existence of the personal protection order.
- 25 (16) The clerk of the court shall inform the petitioner that
- 26 he or she may take a true copy of the personal protection order to
- 27 the law enforcement agency designated by the court in subsection

- 1 (10) to be immediately entered into the law enforcement information
- 2 network.
- 3 (17) The law enforcement agency that receives a true copy of
- 4 the personal protection order under subsection (15) or (16) shall
- 5 immediately and without requiring proof of service enter the
- 6 personal protection order into the law enforcement information
- 7 network as provided by the L.E.I.N. **C.J.I.S.** policy council act, of
- 8 1974, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.216 28.215.
- 9 (18) A personal protection order issued under this section
- 10 shall be served personally or by registered or certified mail,
- 11 return receipt requested, delivery restricted to the addressee at
- 12 the last known address or addresses of the individual restrained or
- 13 enjoined or by any other manner provided in the Michigan court
- 14 rules. If the individual restrained or enjoined has not been
- 15 served, a law enforcement officer or clerk of the court who knows
- 16 that a personal protection order exists may, at any time, serve the
- 17 individual restrained or enjoined with a true copy of the order or
- 18 advise the individual restrained or enjoined about the existence of
- 19 the personal protection order, the specific conduct enjoined, the
- 20 penalties for violating the order, and where the individual
- 21 restrained or enjoined may obtain a copy of the order. If the
- 22 respondent is less than 18 years of age, the parent, guardian, or
- 23 custodian of that individual shall also be served personally or by
- 24 registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, delivery
- 25 restricted to the addressee at the last known address or addresses
- 26 of the parent, guardian, or custodian of the individual restrained
- 27 or enjoined. A proof of service or proof of oral notice shall be

- 1 filed with the clerk of the court issuing the personal protection
- 2 order. This subsection does not prohibit the immediate
- 3 effectiveness of a personal protection order or its immediate
- 4 enforcement under subsections (21) and (22).
- 5 (19) The clerk of the court shall immediately notify the law
- 6 enforcement agency that received the personal protection order
- 7 under subsection (15) or (16) if either of the following occurs:
- 8 (a) The clerk of the court has received proof that the
- 9 individual restrained or enjoined has been served.
- 10 (b) The personal protection order is rescinded, modified, or
- 11 extended by court order.
- 12 (20) The law enforcement agency that receives information
- 13 under subsection (19) shall enter the information or cause the
- 14 information to be entered into the law enforcement information
- 15 network as provided by the L.E.I.N. C.J.I.S. policy council act, of
- 16 1974, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.216 28.215.
- 17 (21) Subject to subsection (22), a personal protection order
- 18 is immediately enforceable anywhere in this state by any law
- 19 enforcement agency that has received a true copy of the order, is
- 20 shown a copy of it, or has verified its existence on the law
- 21 enforcement information network as provided by the L.E.I.N.
- 22 C.J.I.S. policy council act, of 1974, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to
- $23 \quad \frac{28.216}{28.215}$
- 24 (22) If the individual restrained or enjoined has not been
- 25 served, the law enforcement agency or officer responding to a call
- 26 alleging a violation of a personal protection order shall serve the
- 27 individual restrained or enjoined with a true copy of the order or

- 1 advise the individual restrained or enjoined about the existence of
- 2 the personal protection order, the specific conduct enjoined, the
- 3 penalties for violating the order, and where the individual
- 4 restrained or enjoined may obtain a copy of the order. The law
- 5 enforcement officer shall enforce the personal protection order and
- 6 immediately enter or cause to be entered into the law enforcement
- 7 information network that the individual restrained or enjoined has
- 8 actual notice of the personal protection order. The law enforcement
- 9 officer also shall file a proof of service or proof of oral notice
- 10 with the clerk of the court issuing the personal protection order.
- 11 If the individual restrained or enjoined has not received notice of
- 12 the personal protection order, the individual restrained or
- 13 enjoined shall be given an opportunity to comply with the personal
- 14 protection order before the law enforcement officer makes a
- 15 custodial arrest for violation of the personal protection order.
- 16 The failure to immediately comply with the personal protection
- 17 order shall be—IS grounds for an immediate custodial arrest. This
- 18 subsection does not preclude an arrest under section 15 or 15a of
- 19 chapter IV of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL
- 20 764.15 and 764.15a, or a proceeding under section 14 of chapter
- 21 XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.14.
- 22 (23) An individual who is 17 years of age or more and who
- 23 refuses or fails to comply with a personal protection order under
- 24 this section is subject to the criminal contempt powers of the
- 25 court and, if found guilty, shall be imprisoned for not more than
- 26 93 days and may be fined not more than \$500.00. An individual who
- 27 is less than 17 years of age and who refuses or fails to comply

- 1 with a personal protection order issued under this section is
- 2 subject to the dispositional alternatives listed in section 18 of
- 3 chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.18.
- 4 The criminal penalty provided for under this section may be imposed
- 5 in addition to a penalty that may be imposed for another criminal
- 6 offense arising from the same conduct.
- 7 (24) An individual who knowingly and intentionally makes a
- 8 false statement to the court in support of his or her petition for
- 9 a personal protection order is subject to the contempt powers of
- 10 the court.
- 11 (25) A personal protection order issued under this section is
- 12 also enforceable under chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939,
- 13 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.1 to 712A.32, and section 15b of chapter IV
- 14 of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 764.15b.
- 15 (26) A personal protection order issued under this section is
- 16 also enforceable under chapter 17.
- 17 (27) A court shall not issue a personal protection order that
- 18 restrains or enjoins conduct described in subsection (1) if any of
- 19 the following apply:
- 20 (a) The respondent is the unemancipated minor child of the
- 21 petitioner.
- 22 (b) The petitioner is the unemancipated minor child of the
- 23 respondent.
- 24 (c) The respondent is a minor child less than 10 years of age.
- 25 (28) If the respondent is less than 18 years of age, issuance
- 26 of a personal protection order under this section is subject to
- 27 chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.1

- 1 to 712A.32.
- 2 (29) A personal protection order that is issued prior to the
- 3 effective date of the amendatory act that added this subsection
- 4 BEFORE MARCH 1, 1999 is not invalid on the ground that it does not
- 5 comply with 1 or more of the requirements added by this amendatory
- 6 act 1998 PA 477.
- 7 (30) IF THE PETITIONER FOR A PERSONAL PROTECTION ORDER UNDER
- 8 THIS SECTION IS A MINOR 12 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, THE PETITIONER
- 9 MAY PROCEED UNDER THIS SECTION WITHOUT A NEXT FRIEND.

- 19 rules. The motion to modify or rescind the personal protection
- 20 order shall be filed within 14 days after the order is served or
- 21 after the individual restrained or enjoined has received RECEIVES
- 22 actual notice of the personal protection order unless good cause is
- 23 shown for filing the motion after 14 days have elapsed.
- 24 (11) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the
- 25 court shall schedule a hearing on the motion to modify or rescind
- 26 the ex parte personal protection order within 14 days after the
- 27 <u>filing of</u> the motion to modify or rescind IS FILED. If the

- 1 respondent is a person described in subsection (2) and the personal
- 2 protection order prohibits him or her from purchasing or possessing
- 3 a firearm, the court shall schedule a hearing on the motion to
- 4 modify or rescind the ex parte personal protection order within 5
- 5 days after the filing of the motion to modify or rescind IS FILED.
- 6 (12) The clerk of the court that issues a personal protection
- 7 order shall do all of the following immediately upon issuance
- 8 without requiring proof of service on the individual restrained or
- 9 enjoined:
- 10 (a) File a true copy of the personal protection order with the
- 11 law enforcement agency designated by the court in the personal
- 12 protection order.
- 13 (b) Provide THE petitioner with not less than 2 OR MORE true
- 14 copies of the personal protection order.
- 15 (c) If respondent THE INDIVIDUAL RESTRAINED OR ENJOINED is
- 16 identified in the pleadings as a law enforcement officer, notify
- 17 the officer's employing law enforcement agency about OF the
- 18 existence of the personal protection order.
- 19 (d) If the personal protection order prohibits the respondent
- 20 INDIVIDUAL RESTRAINED OR ENJOINED from purchasing or possessing a
- 21 firearm, notify the concealed weapon licensing board in
- 22 respondent's THE INDIVIDUAL'S county of residence about OF the
- 23 existence and content of the personal protection order.
- 24 (e) If the respondent INDIVIDUAL RESTRAINED OR ENJOINED is
- 25 identified in the pleadings as a department of corrections
- 26 employee, notify the state department of corrections about OF the
- 27 existence of the personal protection order.

- 1 (f) If the respondent INDIVIDUAL RESTRAINED OR ENJOINED is
- 2 identified in the pleadings as being a person who may have access
- 3 to information concerning the petitioner or a child of the
- 4 petitioner or respondent INDIVIDUAL and that information is
- 5 contained in friend of the court records, notify the friend of the
- 6 court for the county in which the information is located about OF
- 7 the existence of the personal protection order.
- 8 (13) The clerk of the A court THAT ISSUES A PERSONAL
- 9 PROTECTION ORDER shall inform the petitioner that he or she may
- 10 take a true copy of the personal protection order to the law
- 11 enforcement agency designated by the court in UNDER subsection (7)
- 12 to be immediately entered into the L.E.I.N.
- 13 (14) The law enforcement agency that receives a true copy of
- 14 the A personal protection order under subsection (12) or (13) shall
- 15 immediately, without requiring proof of service, enter the personal
- 16 protection order into the L.E.I.N.
- 17 (15) A personal protection order issued under this section
- 18 shall be served personally, or by registered or certified mail,
- 19 return receipt requested, delivery restricted to the addressee at
- 20 the last known address or addresses of the individual restrained or
- 21 enjoined or by any other manner provided in METHOD ALLOWED BY the
- 22 Michigan court rules. If the individual restrained or enjoined has
- 23 not been served, a law enforcement officer or clerk of the court
- 24 who knows that a personal protection order exists may, at any time,
- 25 serve the individual restrained or enjoined with a true copy of the
- 26 order or advise the individual restrained or enjoined about OF the
- 27 existence of the personal protection order, the specific conduct

- 1 enjoined, the penalties for violating the order, and where the
- 2 individual restrained or enjoined may obtain a copy of the order.

- 14 (16) The clerk of the court THAT ISSUED A PERSONAL PROTECTION
- 15 ORDER shall immediately notify the law enforcement agency that
- 16 received the personal protection order under subsection (12) or
- 17 (13) if either OR BOTH of the following occurs OCCUR:
- 18 (a) The clerk of the court has received RECEIVES proof that
- 19 the individual restrained or enjoined has been served.
- 20 (b) The personal protection order is rescinded, modified, or
- 21 extended by court order.
- 22 (17) The law enforcement agency that receives information
- 23 under subsection (16) shall enter the information or cause the
- 24 information to be entered into the L.E.I.N.
- 25 (18) Subject to subsection (19), a personal protection order
- 26 is immediately enforceable anywhere in this state by any law
- 27 enforcement agency that has received a true copy of the order, is

- 1 shown a copy of it, or has verified its existence on the L.E.I.N.
- 2 (19) If the individual restrained or enjoined BY A PERSONAL
- 3 PROTECTION ORDER has not been served, the A law enforcement agency
- 4 or officer responding to a call alleging a violation of a THE
- 5 personal protection order shall serve the individual restrained or
- 6 enjoined with a true copy of the order or advise the individual
- 7 restrained or enjoined about OF the existence of the personal
- 8 protection order, the specific conduct enjoined, the penalties for
- 9 violating the order, and where the individual restrained or
- 10 enjoined may obtain a copy of the order. The law enforcement
- 11 officer shall enforce the personal protection order and immediately
- 12 enter or cause to be entered into the L.E.I.N. that the individual
- 13 restrained or enjoined has actual notice of the personal protection
- 14 order. The law enforcement officer also shall file a proof of
- 15 service or proof of oral notice with the clerk of the court issuing
- 16 THAT ISSUED the personal protection order. If the individual
- 17 restrained or enjoined has not received notice of the personal
- 18 protection order, the individual restrained or enjoined shall be
- 19 given an opportunity to comply with the personal protection order
- 20 before the law enforcement officer makes a custodial arrest for

- 2 or fails to comply with a personal protection order issued under
- 3 this section is subject to the criminal contempt powers of the
- 4 court and, if found guilty of criminal contempt, shall be
- 5 imprisoned for not more than 93 days and may be fined not more than
- 6 \$500.00. An individual less than 17 years of age who refuses or
- 7 fails to comply with a personal protection order issued under this
- 8 section is subject to the dispositional alternatives listed in
- 9 section 18 of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA
- 10 288, MCL 712A.18. The criminal penalty provided for under this
- 11 section may be imposed in addition to any penalty that may be
- 12 imposed for any other criminal offense arising from the same
- 13 conduct.
- 14 (21) An individual who knowingly and intentionally makes a
- 15 false statement to the A court in support of his or her petition
- 16 for a personal protection order is subject to the contempt powers
- 17 of the court.
- 18 (22) A personal protection order issued under this section is
- 19 also enforceable under chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939,
- 20 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.1 to 712A.32, and section 15b of chapter IV
- 21 of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 764.15b.
- 22 (23) A personal protection order issued under this section may
- 23 enjoin or restrain an individual from purchasing or possessing a
- 24 firearm.
- 25 (24) A personal protection order issued under this section is
- 26 also enforceable under chapter 17.
- 27 (25) A court shall not issue a personal protection order that

- 1 restrains or enjoins conduct described in subsection (1) if any of
- 2 the following apply:
- 3 (a) The respondent is the unemancipated minor child of the
- 4 petitioner.
- 5 (b) The petitioner is the unemancipated minor child of the
- 6 respondent.
- 7 (c) The respondent is a minor child less than 10 years of age.
- 8 (26) If the respondent is less than 18 years of age OLD,
- 9 issuance of a personal protection order under this section is
- 10 subject to chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288,
- 11 MCL 712A.1 to 712A.32.
- 12 (27) A personal protection order that is—issued before March
- 13 1, 1999 is not invalid on the ground that it does not comply with 1
- 14 or more of the requirements added by 1998 PA 476.
- 15 (28) A court shall not issue a personal protection order under
- 16 this section if the petitioner is a prisoner. If a personal
- 17 protection order is issued in violation of this subsection, a court
- 18 shall rescind the personal protection order upon notification and
- 19 verification that the petitioner is a prisoner.
- 20 (29) IF THE PETITIONER FOR A PERSONAL PROTECTION ORDER UNDER
- 21 THIS SECTION IS A MINOR 12 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, THE PETITIONER
- 22 MAY PROCEED UNDER THIS SECTION WITHOUT A NEXT FRIEND.
- 23 (30) $\frac{(29)}{}$ As used in this section:
- 24 (a) "Federal law enforcement officer" means an officer or
- 25 agent employed by a law enforcement agency of the United States
- 26 government whose primary responsibility is the enforcement of laws
- 27 of the United States.

- 1 (b) "L.E.I.N." means the law enforcement information network
- 2 administered under the $\frac{L.E.I.N.}{}$ C.J.I.S. policy council act, of
- 3 1974, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.216 28.215.
- 4 (c) "Personal protection order" means an injunctive order
- 5 issued by THE circuit court or the family division of circuit court
- 6 restraining or enjoining conduct prohibited under section 411h or
- 7 411i of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.411h and
- 8 750.411i.
- 9 (d) "Prisoner" means a person subject to incarceration,
- 10 detention, or admission to a prison who is accused of, convicted
- 11 of, sentenced for, or adjudicated delinquent for violations of
- 12 federal, state, or local law or the terms and conditions of parole,
- 13 probation, pretrial release, or a diversionary program.

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
