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SENATE BILL No. 1473

August 24, 2010, Introduced by Senators HUNTER and BASHAM and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 223, entitled

"An act to create an agency concerned with crime victim services; to prescribe its powers and duties; to provide compensation to certain victims of crimes; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide for penalties,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 18.354), as amended by 2008 PA 390.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 4. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), thefollowing persons are eligible for awards:
 - (a) A victim or an intervenor of a crime.
 - (b) A surviving spouse, parent, grandparent, child, sibling, or grandchild of a victim of a crime who died as a direct result of the crime.
 - (c) A surviving person related to the victim by blood or

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- 1 affinity, a guardian, personal representative, or member of the
- 2 same household as the victim.
- 3 (d) A health care provider seeking payment under section 5a.
- 4 (E) A FUNERAL SERVICES PROVIDER SEEKING PAYMENT FOR THE COST
- 5 OF A DECEASED VICTIM'S FUNERAL EXPENSES.
- 6 (2) A person is not eligible to receive an award if the person
- 7 is either of the following:
- 8 (a) Criminally responsible for the crime.
- 9 (b) An accomplice to the crime.
- 10 (3) An award shall not be made on a claim unless the claimant
- 11 has incurred a minimum out-of-pocket loss of \$200.00 or has lost at
- 12 least 2 continuous weeks' earnings or support, but the commission
- 13 may waive the limitations of this subsection in the case of a
- 14 claimant retired by reason of age or disability. If the claimant is
- 15 a victim of criminal sexual conduct in the first, second, or third
- 16 degree, the commission may waive the limitations of this
- 17 subsection. The commission shall waive this limitation for health
- 18 care providers seeking payment under section 5a AND FUNERAL
- 19 SERVICES PROVIDERS.
