HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION EEE

May 4, 2010, Introduced by Rep. LeBlanc and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending sections 31 and 54 of article IV and by adding section 55 to article IV, to modify term limits for certain elected state offices, to provide that certain state budget bills be presented to and signed by the governor on or before a certain date, and to reduce compensation of state legislators, the governor, and the lieutenant governor when certain state budget bills are not presented to and signed by the governor on or before a certain date.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to modify term limits for certain elected

state offices, to provide that certain state budget bills be presented to and signed by the governor on or before a certain date, and to reduce compensation of state legislators, the governor, and the lieutenant governor when certain state budget bills are not presented to and signed by the governor on or before a certain date, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

ARTICLE IV

2 Sec. 31. The general appropriation bills for the succeeding fiscal period covering items set forth in the budget shall be 3 4 passed or rejected in either house of the legislature before that 5 house passes any appropriation bill for items not in the budget except bills supplementing appropriations for the current fiscal 6 7 year's operation. Any bill requiring an appropriation to carry out its purpose shall be considered an appropriation bill. One of the 8 9 general appropriation bills as passed by the legislature shall 10 contain an itemized statement of estimated revenue by major source 11 in each operating fund for the ensuing fiscal period, the total of 12 which shall not be less than the total of all appropriations made 13 from each fund in the general appropriation bills as passed. THE LEGISLATURE SHALL PRESENT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE GOVERNOR SHALL 14 15 SIGN ALL GENERAL APPROPRIATION BILLS FOR THE SUCCEEDING FISCAL
