HOUSE BILL No. 5167

December 4, 2013, Introduced by Rep. Schmidt and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1951 PA 51, entitled

"An act to provide for the classification of all public roads, streets, and highways in this state, and for the revision of that classification and for additions to and deletions from each classification; to set up and establish the Michigan transportation fund; to provide for the deposits in the Michigan transportation fund of specific taxes on motor vehicles and motor vehicle fuels; to provide for the allocation of funds from the Michigan transportation fund and the use and administration of the fund for transportation purposes; to promote safe and efficient travel for motor vehicle drivers, bicyclists, pedestrians, and other legal users of roads, streets, and highways; to set up and establish the truck safety fund; to provide for the allocation of funds from the truck safety fund and administration of the fund for truck safety purposes; to set up and establish the Michigan truck safety commission; to establish certain standards for road contracts for certain businesses; to provide for the continuing review of transportation needs within the state; to authorize the state transportation commission, counties, cities, and villages to borrow money, issue bonds, and make pledges of funds for transportation purposes; to authorize counties to advance funds for the payment of deficiencies necessary for the payment of bonds issued under this act; to provide for the limitations, payment, retirement, and security of the bonds and pledges; to provide for appropriations and tax levies by counties and townships for county roads; to

authorize contributions by townships for county roads; to provide for the establishment and administration of the state trunk line fund, local bridge fund, comprehensive transportation fund, and certain other funds; to provide for the deposits in the state trunk line fund, critical bridge fund, comprehensive transportation fund, and certain other funds of money raised by specific taxes and fees; to provide for definitions of public transportation functions and criteria; to define the purposes for which Michigan transportation funds may be allocated; to provide for Michigan transportation fund grants; to provide for review and approval of transportation programs; to provide for submission of annual legislative requests and reports; to provide for the establishment and functions of certain advisory entities; to provide for conditions for grants; to provide for the issuance of bonds and notes for transportation purposes; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies and officials; to provide for the making of loans for transportation purposes by the state transportation department and for the receipt and repayment by local units and agencies of those loans from certain specified sources; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending sections 11 and 11c (MCL 247.661 and 247.661c), section 11 as amended by 2002 PA 639 and section 11c as amended by 2002 PA 498.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 11. (1) A fund to be known as the state trunk line fund
- 2 is established and shall be set up and maintained in the state
- 3 treasury as a separate fund. The money deposited in the state trunk
- 4 line fund is appropriated to the state transportation department
- 5 for the following purposes in the following order of priority:
- 6 (a) For the payment, but only from money restricted as to use
- 7 by section 9 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, of
- 8 bonds, notes, or other obligations in the following order of
- 9 priority:
- 10 (i) For the payment of contributions PLEDGED BEFORE JULY 18,
- 11 1979 AND required to be made by the state highway commission or the
- 12 state transportation commission under contracts entered into before
- 13 July 18, 1979, under 1941 PA 205, MCL 252.51 to 252.64, which

- 1 contributions have been pledged before July 18, 1979, for the
- 2 payment of the principal and interest on bonds issued under 1941 PA
- 3 205, MCL 252.51 to 252.64, for the payment of which a sufficient
- 4 sum is irrevocably appropriated.
- 5 (ii) For the payment of the principal and interest upon bonds
- 6 designated "State of Michigan, State Highway Commissioner, Highway
- 7 Construction Bonds, Series I", dated September 1, 1956, in the
- 8 aggregate principal amount of \$25,000,000.00, issued pursuant to
- 9 former 1955 PA 87 and the resolution of the state administrative
- 10 board adopted August 6, 1956, for the payment of which a sufficient
- 11 sum is irrevocably appropriated.
- 12 (iii) For the payment of the principal and interest on bonds
- 13 issued under section 18b for transportation purposes other than
- 14 comprehensive transportation purposes as defined by law and the
- 15 payment of contributions of PLEDGED TO THE PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND
- 16 INTEREST ON BONDS ISSUED UNDER SECTION 18D AND CONTRACTS ENTERED
- 17 INTO UNDER SECTION 18D BY the state highway commission or state
- 18 transportation commission to be made pursuant to contracts entered
- 19 into under section 18d. , which contributions are pledged to the
- 20 payment of principal and interest on bonds issued under the
- 21 authorization of section 18d and contracts executed pursuant to
- 22 that section. A sufficient portion of the fund is irrevocably
- 23 appropriated to pay, when due, the principal and interest on bonds
- 24 or notes issued under section 18b for purposes other than
- 25 comprehensive transportation purposes as defined by law, and to pay
- 26 the annual contributions of the state highway commission and the
- 27 state transportation commission as—THAT are pledged for the payment

- 1 of bonds issued pursuant to contracts authorized by section 18d.
- 2 (b) For the transfer of funds appropriated pursuant to section
- $3 \frac{10(1)(g)}{10(1)}$ (H) to the transportation economic development fund,
- 4 but the transfer shall be reduced each fiscal year by the amount of
- 5 debt service to be paid in that year from the state trunk line fund
- 6 for bonds, notes, or other obligations issued to fund projects of
- 7 the transportation economic development fund, which amount shall be
- 8 certified by the department.
- 9 (c) For the transfer of funds appropriated pursuant to section
- 10 (1)(a) to the railroad grade crossing account in the state trunk
- 11 line fund for expenditure for rail grade crossing improvement
- 12 purposes at rail grade crossings on public roads and streets under
- 13 the jurisdiction of the THIS state, counties, cities, or villages.
- 14 Projects shall be selected for funding in accordance with the
- **15** following:
- 16 (i) Not more than 50% or less than 30% of these funds and
- 17 matched federal funds shall be expended for state trunk line
- 18 projects.
- 19 (ii) In prioritizing projects for these funds, in whole or in
- 20 part, the department shall consider train and vehicular traffic
- 21 volumes, accident history, traffic control device improvement
- 22 needs, and the availability of funding.
- 23 (iii) Consistent with the other requirements for these funds,
- 24 the first priority for funds deposited pursuant to this subdivision
- 25 for rail grade crossing improvements and retirement shall be to
- 26 match federal funds from the railroad-highway grade crossing
- 27 improvement program or other comparable federal programs if a match

- 1 is required under federal law.
- 2 (iv) If the department and the road authority with jurisdiction
- 3 over the crossing formally agree that the grade crossing should be
- 4 eliminated by permanent closing of the public road or street, the
- 5 physical removal of the crossing, roadway within railroad rights of
- 6 way, and street termination treatment will be negotiated between
- 7 the road authority and railroad company. The funds provided to the
- 8 road authority as a result of the crossing closure will be credited
- 9 to its account representing the same road or street system on which
- 10 the crossing is located and shall be used for any transportation
- 11 purpose within that road authority's jurisdiction.
- 12 (d) For the total operating expenses of the state trunk line
- 13 fund for each fiscal year as appropriated by the legislature.
- 14 (e) For the preservation of state trunk line highways and
- 15 bridges.
- 16 (f) For the opening, widening, improving, construction, and
- 17 reconstruction of state trunk line highways and bridges, including
- 18 the acquisition of necessary rights of way and the work incidental
- 19 to that opening, widening, improving, construction, or
- 20 reconstruction. Those sums in the state trunk line fund not
- 21 otherwise appropriated, distributed, determined, or set aside by
- 22 law shall be used for the construction or reconstruction of the
- 23 national system of interstate and defense highways, referred to in
- 24 this act as "the interstate highway system", to the extent
- 25 necessary to match federal aid funds as the federal aid funds
- 26 become available for that purpose; and, for the construction and
- 27 reconstruction of the state trunk line system.

1 (g) The state transportation department may enter into 2 agreements with county road commissions and with cities and villages A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY OR A PRIVATE SECTOR COMPANY to perform 3 4 work on a highway, road, or street. The agreements may provide for 5 the performance by any of the contracting parties of any of the 6 work contemplated by the contract including MAINTENANCE, engineering services, and the acquisition of rights of way in 7 connection with the work, by purchase or condemnation by any of the 8 9 contracting parties in its own name, and for joint participation in 10 the costs, but only to the extent that the contracting parties are 11 otherwise authorized by law to expend money on the highways, roads, 12 or streets. The state transportation department also may contract with a county LOCAL road commission, city, and village AGENCY to 13 14 advance money to a county LOCAL road commission, city, and village 15 agency to pay their THE costs of improving railroad grade crossings on the terms and conditions agreed to in the contract. A contract 16 17 may be executed before or after the state transportation commission 18 borrows money for the purpose of advancing money to a county LOCAL 19 road commission, city, or village AGENCY, but the contract shall be 20 executed before the advancement of any money to a county LOCAL road commission, city, or village AGENCY by the state transportation 21 22 commission, and shall provide for the full reimbursement of any 23 advancement by a county_LOCAL road commission, city, or village 24 AGENCY to the state transportation department, with interest, within 15 years after advancement, from any available revenue 25 26 sources of the county LOCAL road commission, city, or village 27 AGENCY or, if provided in the contract, by deduction from the

- 1 periodic disbursements of any money returned by the state to the
- 2 county LOCAL road commission, city, or village.AGENCY.
- 3 (h) For providing inventories of supplies and materials
- 4 required for the activities of the state transportation department.
- 5 The state transportation department may purchase supplies and
- 6 materials for these purposes, with payment to be made out of the
- 7 state trunk line fund to be charged on the basis of issues from
- 8 inventory in accordance with the accounting and purchasing laws of
- 9 this state.
- 10 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, at least
- 11 90% of state revenue appropriated annually to the state trunk line
- 12 fund less the amounts described in subdivisions (a) to (i) shall be
- 13 expended annually by the state transportation department for the
- 14 preservation of highways, roads, streets, and bridges and for the
- 15 payment of debt service on bonds, notes, or other obligations
- 16 described in subsection (1)(a) issued after July 1, 1983 —for the
- 17 purpose of providing funds for the preservation of highways, roads,
- 18 streets, and bridges. Of the amounts appropriated for state trunk
- 19 line projects, the department shall, where possible, secure
- 20 warranties of not less than 5-year full replacement guarantee for
- 21 contracted construction work. If an appropriate certificate is

- 23 subsection shall DOES not prohibit the use of any amount of money

- 22 for the construction of a manufacturing or industrial facility.
- 23 (ii) A location for which a building permit has been obtained
- 24 for the renovation of, or addition to, a manufacturing or

- 26 (d) Amounts expended for capital outlay other than for
- 27 highways, roads, streets, and bridges or to pay debt service on

- 1 bonds, notes, or other obligations issued after July 1, 1983, for
- 2 the purpose of providing funds for capital outlay other than for
- 3 highways, roads, streets, and bridges.
- 4 (e) Amounts expended for the operating expenses of the state
- 5 transportation department other than the units of the department
- 6 performing the functions assigned on January 1, 1983 to the bureau
- 7 of highways.
- 8 (f) Amounts expended pursuant to contracts entered into before
- **9** January 1, 1983.
- 10 (g) Amounts expended for the purposes described in subsection
- **11** (5).
- 12 (h) Amounts appropriated for deposit in the transportation
- 13 economic development fund and the rail grade crossing account
- 14 pursuant to UNDER section $\frac{10(1)(9)}{10(1)(1)}$ and 10(1)(a).
- 15 (i) Upon the affirmative recommendation of the director of the
- 16 state transportation department and the approval by resolution of
- 17 the state transportation commission, those amounts expended for
- 18 projects vital to the economy of this state, a region, or local
- 19 area or the safety of the public. The resolution shall state the
- 20 cost of the project exempted from this subsection.
- 21 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, the state
- 22 transportation department shall expend annually at least 90% of the
- 23 federal revenue distributed to the credit of the state trunk line

- 21 from 1 or more of the following:
- 22 (a) The money to be received by the county LOCAL road
- 23 commission, city, or village AGENCY from the Michigan
- 24 transportation fund, except to the extent the money has been or may
- 25 in the future be pledged by contract in accordance with UNDER 1941

- 11 to UNDER subsection (4) if required by the state transportation
- 12 department may be ARE payable by deduction by the state treasurer,
- 13 upon direction of the state transportation department, from the
- 14 periodic disbursements of any money returned by the THIS state
- 15 under this act to the county LOCAL road commission, city, or
- 16 village AGENCY, but only after sufficient money has been returned

- 14 (8) The county LOCAL road commission, city, or village AGENCY
- 15 is not required to seek or obtain the approval of the electors, the

- 17 provided in this subsection, the department of treasury to borrow
- 18 money pursuant to UNDER subsection (5). The borrowing is not
- 19 subject to the revised municipal finance act, 2001 PA 34, MCL
- 20 141.2101 to 141.2821, or to section 5(g) of the home rule city act,
- 21 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.5. The state transportation department shall
- 22 give at least 10 days' notice to the state treasurer of its
- 23 intention to make a loan under subsection (4). If the state
- 24 treasurer gives notice to the director of the state transportation
- 25 department within 10 days of AFTER receiving the notice from the

- 11 (c) Modification, relocation, or modernization of railroad
