HOUSE BILL No. 5664

June 11, 2014, Introduced by Rep. Dillon and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 5 (MCL 4.415), as amended by 1986 PA 83.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) "Legislative action" means introduction,
- 2 sponsorship, support, opposition, consideration, debate, vote,
- 3 passage, defeat, approval, veto, delay, or an official action by an
- 4 official in the executive branch or an official in the legislative
- 5 branch on a bill, resolution, amendment, nomination, appointment,
- 6 OR report __or any OTHER matter pending or proposed in a
- 7 legislative committee or either house of the legislature.

- 1 Legislative action does not include the representation of a person
- 2 who has been subpoenaed to appear before the legislature or an
- 3 agency of the legislature.
- 4 (2) "Lobbying" means communicating directly with an official
- 5 in the executive branch of state government or an official in the
- 6 legislative branch of state government for the purpose of
- 7 influencing legislative or administrative action. Lobbying does not
- 8 include the providing of technical information by a person other
- 9 than a person as defined in subsection (5) or an employee of a
- 10 person as defined in subsection (5) when appearing before an
- 11 officially convened legislative committee or executive department
- 12 hearing panel UNLESS THE INDIVIDUAL WHO IS PROVIDING THE
- 13 INFORMATION IS A LOBBYIST AGENT. As used in this subsection,
- 14 "technical information" means empirically verifiable data provided
- 15 by a person AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS recognized as an expert in the
- 16 subject area to which the information provided is related.
- 17 (3) "Influencing" means promoting, supporting, affecting,
- 18 modifying, opposing, or delaying by any means, including the
- 19 providing of or use of information, statistics, studies, or
- 20 analysis.
- 21 (4) "Lobbyist" means any of the following:
- 22 (a) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
- 23 \$1,000.00 in value in any 12-month period.
- 24 (b) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
- 25 \$250.00 in value in any 12-month period, if the amount is expended
- 26 on lobbying a single public official.
- (c) For the purpose of subdivisions (a) and (b), groups of 25

- 1 or more people shall not have their personal expenditures for food,
- 2 travel, and beverage included, providing those expenditures are not
- 3 reimbursed by a lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 4 (d) The state or a political subdivision which THAT contracts
- 5 for a lobbyist agent.
- 6 (5) "Lobbyist agent" means a person who receives compensation
- 7 or reimbursement of actual expenses, or both, in a combined amount
- 8 in excess of \$250.00 in any 12-month period for lobbying.
- 9 (6) "Representative of the lobbyist" means any of the
- 10 following:
- 11 (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 12 (b) For purposes of section 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b), a member of
- 13 the lobbyist or employee of a member of the lobbyist, when IF the
- 14 lobbyist is a membership organization or association, and when IF
- 15 the lobbyist agent or an employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent
- 16 is present during any part of the period during which the purchased
- 17 food or beverage is consumed.
- 18 (c) A person who is reimbursed by the lobbyist or lobbyist
- 19 agent for an expenditure, other than an expenditure for food or
- 20 beverage, which THAT was incurred for the purpose of lobbying.
- 21 (7) Lobbyist or lobbyist agent does not include:
- 22 (a) A publisher, owner, or working member of the press, radio,
- 23 or television while disseminating news or editorial comment to the
- 24 general public in the ordinary course of business.
- 25 (b) All elected or appointed public officials of state or
- 26 local government who are acting in the course or scope of the
- 27 office for no compensation, other than that provided by law for the

- 1 office. HOWEVER, THIS SUBDIVISION DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY OF THE
- 2 FOLLOWING:
- 3 (c) For the purposes of this act, subdivision (b) shall not
- 4 include:
- 5 (i) Employees of public or private colleges, community
- 6 colleges, junior colleges, or universities.
- 7 (ii) Employees of townships, villages, cities, counties, or
- 8 school boards.
- 9 (iii) Employees of state executive departments.
- 10 (iv) Employees of the judicial branch of government.
- 11 (C) (d) A member of a lobbyist, if the lobbyist is a
- 12 membership organization or association, and if the member of a
- 13 lobbyist does not separately qualify as a lobbyist under subsection
- **14** (4).
- 15 (8) "Mass mailing" means not less than 1,000 pieces of
- 16 substantially similar material mailed within a 7-day period.
- 17 (9) "Official in the executive branch" means the governor,
- 18 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, OR attorney general; or an
- 19 individual who is in the executive branch of state government and
- 20 not under civil service; AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS a classified
- 21 director, chief deputy director, or deputy director of a state
- 22 department; . This includes OR an individual who is elected or
- 23 appointed and has not yet taken, or an individual who is nominated
- 24 for appointment to, any of the THOSE offices or agencies.
- 25 enumerated in this subsection. An official in the executive branch
- 26 THE TERM does not include a person serving AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SERVES
- 27 in a clerical, nonpolicy-making, or nonadministrative capacity. In

- 1 addition to all of the foregoing, an official in the executive
- 2 branch THE TERM ALSO includes all ANY of the following:
- 3 (a) In the executive office of the governor, the chief and
- 4 deputy chief of staff, press secretary, director of job training,
- 5 and director of personnel.
- 6 (b) In the department of agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT,
- 7 the racing commissioner and a member of the agriculture AND RURAL
- 8 **DEVELOPMENT** commission.
- 9 (c) In the department of civil rights, a A member of the civil
- 10 rights commission.
- 11 (d) In the department of civil service, a member of the civil
- 12 service commission.
- 13 (e) In the department of commerce, the commissioner of
- 14 financial institutions, LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS, the
- 15 executive director of the housing development authority , and a OR
- 16 ANY member of the liquor control commission, strategic fund board,
- 17 state housing development authority, travel commission, or public
- 18 service commission.
- 19 (f) In the department of education, a member of the state
- 20 board of education. , higher education facilities commission,
- 21 higher education facilities authority, higher education assistance
- 22 authority, higher education student loan authority, or state tenure
- 23 commission.
- 24 (g) In the department of labor, LICENSING AND REGULATORY
- 25 AFFAIRS, the director of the bureau of workers' disability
- 26 compensation, WORKERS' COMPENSATION AGENCY, the director of the
- 27 employment security commission, UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE AGENCY, and

- 1 a member of the construction code commission, employment relations
- 2 commission, employment security board of review, employment
- 3 security commission, or wage deviation board.MICHIGAN EMPLOYMENT
- 4 RELATIONS COMMISSION.
- 5 (h) In the department of licensing and regulation, the state
- 6 insurance commissioner.
- 7 (H) (i) In the department of **TECHNOLOGY**, management, and
- 8 budget, the lottery commissioner, the director of the office of
- 9 services to the aging, the director of the office of state
- 10 employer, the chairperson of the crime victims compensation board,
- 11 and a OR ANY member of the council for the arts, state
- 12 administrative board, OR state building authority. , toxic
- 13 substance control commission, or utility consumer participation
- 14 board.
- 15 (I) (j) In the department of natural resources, the supervisor
- of wells and a member of the air pollution control commission,
- 17 natural resources commission. , or water resources commission.
- 18 (J) IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY, THE SUPERVISOR
- 19 OF WELLS OR A MEMBER OF THE AIR POLLUTION CONTROL COMMISSION OR
- 20 WATER RESOURCES COMMISSION.
- 21 (k) In the department of public COMMUNITY health, a member of
- 22 the occupational health standards commission. THE DIRECTOR OF THE
- 23 OFFICE OF SERVICES TO THE AGING.
- 24 (1) In the STATE TRANSPORTATION department, of transportation,
- 25 a member of the aeronautics commission and a OR THE state
- 26 transportation commissioner.COMMISSION.
- 27 (m) In the department of treasury, a member of the hospital

- 1 MICHIGAN finance authority, investment advisory committee, or state
- 2 tax commission.
- 3 (N) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS CONDUCTING BUSINESS UNDER THE
- 4 AUSPICES OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR OR LIEUTENANT
- 5 GOVERNOR.
- 6 (10) "Official in the legislative branch" means a member of
- 7 the legislature, the auditor general, the deputy auditor general,
- 8 an employee of the consumer's council, the director of the
- 9 legislative retirement system, or any other employee of the
- 10 legislature other than an individual employed by the state in a
- 11 clerical or non-policy-making capacity.
- 12 (11) "Governmental body" means any state legislative or
- 13 governing body, including a board, commission, committee,
- 14 subcommittee, authority, or council, which THAT is empowered by
- 15 state constitution, statute, or rule to exercise governmental or
- 16 proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary
- 17 function. , or a lessee thereof THE TERM ALSO INCLUDES A LESSEE OF
- 18 A GOVERNMENTAL BODY THAT IS performing an essential public purpose
- 19 and function under the lease agreement.

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
