

SENATE BILL No. 559

September 26, 2013, Introduced by Senators BOOHER, COLBECK, ROBERTSON, SCHUITMAKER, KAHN, PAPPAGEORGE, BRANDENBURG and CASWELL and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979," by amending sections 209 and 245 (MCL 388.1809 and 388.1845), as amended by 2013 PA 60.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 209. (1) Within 30 days after the board of a community
2 college adopts its annual operating budget for the following school
3 fiscal year, or after the board adopts a subsequent revision to
4 that budget, the community college shall make all of the following
5 available through a link on its website homepage:

6 (a) The annual operating budget and subsequent budget
7 revisions.

8 (b) A link to the most recent "Activities Classification
9 Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges".

1 (c) General fund revenue and expenditure projections for
2 fiscal year 2013-2014 and fiscal year 2014-2015.

3 (d) A listing of all debt service obligations, detailed by
4 project, anticipated fiscal year 2013-2014 payment of each project,
5 and total outstanding debt.

6 (e) The estimated cost to the community college resulting from
7 the patient protection and affordable care act, Public Law 111-148,
8 as amended by the health care and education reconciliation act of
9 2010, Public Law 111-152.

10 (f) Links to all of the following for the community college:

11 (i) The current collective bargaining agreement for each
12 bargaining unit.

13 (ii) Each health care benefits plan, including, but not limited
14 to, medical, dental, vision, disability, long-term care, or any
15 other type of benefits that would constitute health care services,
16 offered to any bargaining unit or employee of the community
17 college.

18 (iii) Audits and financial reports for the most recent fiscal
19 year for which they are available.

20 (iv) A copy of the board of trustees resolution regarding
21 compliance with best practices for the local strategic value
22 component described in section 230(3).

23 **(G) IF THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE USES ANY PART OF THE TUITION**
24 **PAYMENTS IT RECEIVES FROM SOME STUDENTS TO PROVIDE GRANTS,**
25 **SCHOLARSHIPS, WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS, STUDENT LOANS, OR STUDENT LOAN**
26 **REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE TO OTHER STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THAT COMMUNITY**
27 **COLLEGE, THE AMOUNT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE USED FOR THAT PURPOSE IN**

1 THE MOST RECENT FISCAL YEAR FOR WHICH THAT INFORMATION IS
2 AVAILABLE.

3 (2) For statewide consistency and public visibility, community
4 colleges must use the icon badge provided by the department of
5 technology, management, and budget consistent with the icon badge
6 developed by the department of education for K-12 school districts.
7 It must appear on the front of each community college's homepage.
8 The size of the icon may be reduced to 150 x 150 pixels.

9 (3) The state budget director shall determine whether a
10 community college has complied with this section. The state budget
11 director may withhold a community college's monthly installments
12 described in section 206 until the community college complies with
13 this section. The state budget director shall notify the chairs of
14 the house and senate appropriations subcommittee on community
15 colleges at least 10 days before withholding funds from any
16 community college.

17 (4) Each community college shall report the following
18 information to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on
19 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the
20 state budget office by November 15, 2013, and post that information
21 on the internet website required under subsection (1):

22 (a) Budgeted fiscal year 2013-2014 general fund revenue from
23 tuition and fees.

24 (b) Budgeted fiscal year 2013-2014 general fund revenue from
25 state appropriations.

26 (c) Budgeted fiscal year 2013-2014 general fund revenue from
27 property taxes.

1 (d) Budgeted fiscal year 2013-2014 total general fund revenue.

2 (e) Budgeted fiscal year 2013-2014 total general fund
3 expenditures.

4 Sec. 245. (1) Within 30 days after the board of a public
5 university adopts its annual operating budget for the following
6 school fiscal year, or after the board adopts a subsequent revision
7 to that budget, the public university shall make all of the
8 following available through a link on its website homepage:

9 (a) The annual operating budget and subsequent budget
10 revisions.

11 (b) A summary of current expenditures for the most recent
12 fiscal year for which they are available, expressed as pie charts
13 in the following 2 categories:

14 (i) A chart of personnel expenditures, broken into the
15 following subcategories:

16 (A) Earnings and wages.

17 (B) Employee benefit costs, including, but not limited to,
18 medical, dental, vision, life, disability, and long-term care
19 benefits.

20 (C) Retirement benefit costs.

21 (D) All other personnel costs.

22 (ii) A chart of all current expenditures the public university
23 reported as part of its higher education institutional data
24 inventory data under section 241(2), broken into the same
25 subcategories in which it reported those data.

26 (c) Links to all of the following for the public university:

27 (i) The current collective bargaining agreement for each

1 bargaining unit.

2 (ii) Each health care benefits plan, including, but not limited
3 to, medical, dental, vision, disability, long-term care, or any
4 other type of benefits that would constitute health care services,
5 offered to any bargaining unit or employee of the public
6 university.

7 (iii) Audits and financial reports for the most recent fiscal
8 year for which they are available.

9 (iv) Campus security policies and crime statistics pursuant to
10 the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law 101-
11 542, 104 Stat. 2381. Information shall include all material
12 prepared pursuant to the public information reporting requirements
13 under the crime awareness and campus security act of 1990, title II
14 of the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law
15 101-542, 104 Stat. 2381.

16 (d) A list of all positions funded partially or wholly through
17 institutional general fund revenue that includes the position title
18 and annual salary or wage amount for each position.

19 (e) General fund revenue and expenditure projections for
20 fiscal year 2013-2014 and fiscal year 2014-2015.

21 (f) A listing of all debt service obligations, detailed by
22 project, anticipated fiscal year 2013-2014 payment for each
23 project, and total outstanding debt.

24 (g) The institution's policy regarding the transferability of
25 core college courses between community colleges and the university.

26 (h) A listing of all community colleges that have entered into
27 reverse transfer agreements with the university.

1 (I) IF THE UNIVERSITY USES ANY PART OF THE TUITION PAYMENTS IT
2 RECEIVES FROM SOME UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS TO PROVIDE GRANTS,
3 SCHOLARSHIPS, WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS, STUDENT LOANS, OR STUDENT LOAN
4 REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE TO OTHER UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN
5 THAT UNIVERSITY, THE AMOUNT THE UNIVERSITY USED FOR THAT PURPOSE IN
6 THE MOST RECENT FISCAL YEAR FOR WHICH THAT INFORMATION IS
7 AVAILABLE.

8 (2) A public university shall provide a dashboard or report
9 card demonstrating the university's performance in several "best
10 practice" measures. The dashboard or report card shall include at
11 least all of the following for the 3 most recent school years for
12 which the data are available:

13 (a) Enrollment.

14 (b) Student retention rate.

15 (c) Six-year graduation rates.

16 (d) Number of Pell grant recipients and graduating Pell grant
17 recipients.

18 (e) Geographic origination of students, categorized as in-
19 state, out-of-state, and international.

20 (f) Faculty to student ratios and total university employee to
21 student ratios.

22 (g) Teaching load by faculty classification.

23 (h) Graduation outcome rates, including employment and
24 continuing education.

25 (3) For statewide consistency and public visibility, public
26 universities must use the icon badge provided by the department of
27 technology, management, and budget consistent with the icon badge

1 developed by the department of education for K-12 school districts.
2 It must appear on the front of each public university's homepage.
3 The size of the icon may be reduced to 150 x 150 pixels. The font
4 size and style for this reporting must be consistent with other
5 documents on each university's website.

6 (4) The state budget director shall determine whether a public
7 university has complied with this section. The state budget
8 director may withhold a public university's monthly installments
9 described in section 241 until the public university complies with
10 this section.

11 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect October
12 1, 2013.
