## **SENATE BILL No. 566**

October 15, 2015, Introduced by Senators KNOLLENBERG, HORN and MARLEAU and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to provide protection from civil liability for individuals who take certain actions to prevent harm to minors or animals.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "emergency minor and animal rescue act".
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) An individual who acts as described in subsection
- 4 (2) is immune from civil liability for any damage resulting from
- 5 the forcible entry into a motor vehicle for the purpose of removing
  - a minor or animal from the vehicle.
  - (2) An individual is immune under subsection (1) if all of the

- 1 (a) The individual determines that the vehicle is locked and
- 2 there is otherwise no reasonable method for the minor or animal to
- 3 exit the vehicle.
- 4 (b) The individual has a good-faith belief that forcible entry
- 5 into the vehicle is necessary because the minor or animal is in
- 6 imminent danger of suffering harm if not immediately removed from
- 7 the vehicle and, based on the circumstances known to the individual
- 8 at the time, the belief is reasonable.
- 9 (c) The individual has contacted either the local law
- 10 enforcement agency, fire department, or 9-1-1 operator before <<or
- 11 forcibly entering the vehicle.
- 12 (d) The individual places a notice on the vehicle's windshield
- 13 with the individual's contact information, the reason the entry was
- 14 made, the location of the minor or animal, and a statement that the
- 15 local authorities have been notified.
- 16 (e) The individual remains with the minor or animal in a safe
- 17 location, out of the elements but reasonably close to the vehicle,
- 18 until a law enforcement, fire, or other emergency responder
- 19 arrives.
- 20 (f) The individual does not use any more force to enter the
- 21 vehicle and remove the minor or animal from the vehicle than is
- 22 necessary under the circumstances.
- 23 (3) This section does not affect an individual's civil
- 24 liability if the individual attempts to render aid to a minor or
- 25 animal in addition to what is authorized by this section.
