HOUSE BILL No. 4643

May 26, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Glenn, Price, McCready and Graves and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Trade.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 176, entitled

"An act to create a commission relative to labor disputes, and to prescribe its powers and duties; to provide for the mediation and arbitration of labor disputes, and the holding of elections thereon; to regulate the conduct of parties to labor disputes and to require the parties to follow certain procedures; to regulate and limit the right to strike and picket; to protect the rights and privileges of employees, including the right to organize and engage in lawful concerted activities; to protect the rights and privileges of employers; to make certain acts unlawful; to make appropriations; and to prescribe means of enforcement and penalties for violations of this act,"

by amending section 9f (MCL 423.9f).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 9f. (1) It shall be unlawful (1) for any person or persons to hinder A PERSON SHALL NOT DO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

(A) HINDER or prevent by masspicketing, MASS PICKETING, unlawful threats, or force, the pursuit of any lawful work or employment. (2) to obstruct

- 1 BEEN ENJOINED FOR A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (1) IS SUBJECT TO A
- 2 CIVIL FINE OF \$1,000.00 FOR EACH DAY OF THE VIOLATION. IF A UNION
- 3 OR ORGANIZATION CONTINUES TO SPONSOR OR ASSIST IN THE PROHIBITED
- 4 ACTIVITY IN VIOLATION OF AN INJUNCTION, THE UNION OR ORGANIZATION
- 5 IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL FINE OF \$10,000.00 FOR EACH DAY OF THE
- 6 VIOLATION. THE CIVIL FINE ASSESSED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE
- 7 PAID TO THE COURT, AND UPON A SHOWING OF DAMAGES TO BUSINESS SALES,
- 8 BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES, OR PROPERTY, THE EMPLOYER, UNION,

- 12 (6) AN EMPLOYER THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF PICKETING MAY OBTAIN
- 13 INJUNCTIVE RELIEF AGAINST THE PICKETERS WITHOUT A SHOWING OF
- 14 IRREPARABLE HARM IF THE COURT FINDS THE PICKETING VIOLATES
- 15 SUBSECTION (1).
