## **HOUSE BILL No. 4823**

August 18, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Price, Yonker, Garcia, Kelly, Crawford and Santana and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2007 PA 32.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1	Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the
2	superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
3	requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
4	teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
5	an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
6	endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an
7	elementary grade in the public schools of the state.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching certificate to a person who has passed appropriate examinations as follows:

- 1 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 2 both the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 3 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 4 applies to be certified.
- 5 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 6 the basic skills examination and, if it is available, the
- 7 elementary certification examination, and has passed the
- 8 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 9 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 10 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 11 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
- 12 teaching certificate to a person holding a certificate from another
- 13 state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher preparation
- 14 institution who applies for a Michigan teaching certificate only if
- 15 the person passes appropriate examinations as follows:
- 16 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass both the
- 17 basic skills examination and the appropriate available subject area
- 18 examination for each subject area in which he or she applies to be
- 19 certified. The superintendent of public instruction may accept
- 20 passage of an equivalent examination approved by the superintendent
- 21 of public instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass the
- 23 basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elementary
- 24 certification examination, and pass the appropriate available
- 25 subject area examination for each subject area, if any, in which he
- 26 or she applies to be certified. The superintendent of public
- 27 instruction may accept passage of an equivalent examination

- 1 approved by the superintendent of public instruction to meet 1 or
- 2 more of these requirements.
- 3 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 4 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 5 certificate to a person who has met the elementary or secondary, as
- 6 applicable, reading credit requirements established under
- 7 superintendent of public instruction rule. If a person holds a
- 8 teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009, notwithstanding
- 9 IN ADDITION, BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY, AS APPLICABLE:
- 10 (A) FOR A PERSON NOT COVERED BY SUBDIVISION (B),
- 11 NOTWITHSTANDING any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of
- 12 public instruction shall not advance the person's certification to
- 13 professional certification unless the person has successfully
- 14 completed at least a 3-credit course of study with appropriate
- 15 field experiences in the diagnosis and remediation of reading
- 16 disabilities and differentiated instruction. To meet this
- 17 requirement, the course of study should include the following
- 18 elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the
- 19 person's certification level and endorsements: interest
- 20 inventories, English language learning screening, visual and
- 21 auditory discrimination tools, language expression and processing
- 22 screening, phonemics, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension,
- 23 spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional
- 24 strategies. BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2016, THE COURSE OF STUDY MUST
- 25 INCLUDE DATA-DRIVEN INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS. A person may complete
- 26 the course of study either as part of his or her teacher
- 27 preparation program or during the first 6 years of his or her

- 1 employment in classroom teaching.
- 2 (B) FOR A PERSON WHO ENROLLS IN A TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM
- 3 FOR THE FIRST TIME AFTER JULY 1, 2015, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY RULE TO
- 4 THE CONTRARY, THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL NOT
- 5 ADVANCE THE PERSON'S CERTIFICATION TO PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION
- 6 UNLESS THE PERSON HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AS PART OF HIS OR HER
- 7 TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM AT LEAST A 6-CREDIT COURSE OF STUDY
- 8 WITH APPROPRIATE FIELD EXPERIENCES IN THE DIAGNOSIS AND REMEDIATION
- 9 OF READING DISABILITIES AND DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTION. TO MEET
- 10 THIS REQUIREMENT, THE COURSE OF STUDY MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING
- 11 ELEMENTS, AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO BE APPROPRIATE FOR THE
- 12 PERSON'S CERTIFICATION LEVEL AND ENDORSEMENTS: INTEREST
- 13 INVENTORIES, ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING SCREENING, VISUAL AND
- 14 AUDITORY DISCRIMINATION TOOLS, LANGUAGE EXPRESSION AND PROCESSING
- 15 SCREENING, PHONEMICS, PHONICS, VOCABULARY, FLUENCY, COMPREHENSION,
- 16 SPELLING AND WRITING ASSESSMENT TOOLS, AND INSTRUCTIONAL
- 17 STRATEGIES. BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2016, THE COURSE OF STUDY MUST
- 18 INCLUDE DATA-DRIVEN INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS.
- 19 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of
- 20 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum
- 21 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading
- 22 standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
- 23 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 24 disorders.
- 25 (6) Subject to subsection (8), if a person holding a teaching
- 26 certificate from another state applies to the superintendent of
- 27 public instruction for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets

- 1 the requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public
- 2 instruction shall issue to the person a Michigan professional
- 3 education teaching certificate and applicable endorsements
- 4 comparable to those the person holds in the other state, without
- 5 requiring the person to pass a basic skills examination or the
- 6 applicable subject area examination otherwise required under
- 7 subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan
- 8 professional education teaching certificate under this subsection,
- 9 a person shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department that
- 10 he or she meets all of the following requirements:
- 11 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
- 12 for which the person's teaching certification from the other state
- 13 was valid.
- 14 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 15 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 16 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 17 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 18 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
- 19 of public instruction.
- (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 21 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
- 22 public instruction rule.
- 23 (7) A person who receives a teaching certificate and
- 24 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to
- 25 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
- 26 endorsements the person holds in another state only if the person
- 27 passes the appropriate subject area examinations required under

- 1 subsection (2) or (3).
- 2 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
- 3 Michigan teaching certificate to a person described in subsection
- 4 (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or concealment in the
- 5 person's application for a certificate or for a conviction for
- 6 which a person's teaching certificate may be revoked under section
- 7 1535a.
- 8 (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended pursuant
- 9 to subsection (11), shall provide to approved teacher education
- 10 institutions guidelines and criteria approved by the superintendent
- 11 of public instruction for use in the development or selection of a
- 12 basic skills examination and approved guidelines and criteria for
- 13 use in the development or selection of subject area examinations.
- 14 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of
- 15 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended pursuant to
- 16 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or
- 17 more basic skills examinations and subject area examinations. In
- 18 addition, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon
- 19 criteria recommended pursuant to subsection (11), shall approve an
- 20 elementary certification examination and a reading subject area
- 21 examination.
- 22 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an
- 23 11-member teacher examination advisory committee comprised of
- 24 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and
- 25 Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than
- 26 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be certified
- 27 teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be used by the

- 1 superintendent of public instruction in the development, selection,
- 2 or development and selection of 1 or more basic skills
- 3 examinations, and criteria to be used by the superintendent of
- 4 public instruction in the development, selection, or development
- 5 and selection of subject area examinations. In addition, the
- 6 committee shall recommend guidelines for the use and administration
- 7 of those examinations. The basic skills examinations referred to in
- 8 this subsection may be developed by the superintendent of public
- 9 instruction or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 10 from commercially or university developed examinations. In
- 11 addition, an approved teacher education institution, pursuant to
- 12 guidelines and criteria described in subsection (9), may develop an
- 13 examination at its own expense for approval by the superintendent
- 14 of public instruction. An approved teacher education institution
- 15 that develops its own examination is liable for any litigation that
- 16 results from the use of its examination.
- 17 (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a
- 18 7-member standing technical advisory council comprised of persons
- 19 who are experts in measurement and assessment. This council shall
- 20 advise the superintendent of public instruction and the teacher
- 21 examination committee on the validity, reliability, and other
- 22 technical standards of the examinations that will be used or are
- 23 being used and of the administration and use of those examinations.
- 24 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 26 report on the development or selection and use of the basic skills
- 27 examination, the elementary certification examination, and the

- 1 subject area examinations to the house and senate education
- 2 committees. The report shall also contain a financial statement
- 3 regarding revenue received from the assessment of fees levied
- 4 pursuant to subsection (15) and the amount of and any purposes for
- 5 which that revenue was expended.
- 6 (14) The basic skills examination, the elementary
- 7 certification examination, and the subject area examinations
- 8 required by this section may be taken at different times during an
- 9 approved teacher preparation program, but the basic skills
- 10 examination must be passed before a person is enrolled for student
- 11 teaching and the elementary certification examination and the
- 12 subject area examinations, as applicable, must be passed before a
- 13 person is recommended for certification.
- 14 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of
- 15 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for
- 16 taking the basic skills examination, elementary certification
- 17 examination, and the subject area examinations. The fees, which
- 18 shall be set by the superintendent of public instruction, shall not
- 19 exceed \$50.00 for a basic skills examination or \$75.00 for an
- 20 elementary certification examination or a subject area examination.
- 21 However, if a subject area examination for vocational education
- 22 includes a performance examination, an additional fee may be
- 23 assessed for taking the performance examination, not to exceed the
- 24 actual cost of administering the performance examination. Fees
- 25 received by the department shall be expended solely for
- 26 administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing this
- 27 section.

- 1 (16) If a person holding a teaching certificate from another
- 2 state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all
- 3 requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage
- 4 of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 5 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 6 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the person. The
- 7 superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
- 8 teaching certificate to the person after expiration of the
- 9 temporary teaching certificate unless the person passes appropriate
- 10 examinations as described in subsection (3).
- 11 (17) As used in this section:
- 12 (a) "Basic skills examination" means an examination developed
- 13 or selected by the superintendent of public instruction or
- 14 developed pursuant to subsection (11) by an approved teacher
- 15 education institution for the purpose of demonstrating the
- 16 applicant's knowledge and understanding of basic language and
- 17 mathematical skills and other skills necessary for the certificate
- 18 sought, and for determining whether or not an applicant is eligible
- 19 for a provisional Michigan teaching certificate.
- 20 (b) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 21 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 22 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 23 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 24 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 25 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 26 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- (c) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to

- 1 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 2 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 3 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 4 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
- 5 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- 6 (18) The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate
- 7 rules for the implementation of this section.
- 8 (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state
- 10 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates pursuant
- 11 to R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan administrative code to persons who
- 12 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and
- 13 who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If
- 14 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state
- 15 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to a
- 16 person described in this section, the superintendent of public
- 17 instruction shall consider the person to have a state elementary or
- 18 secondary, as applicable, continuing education certificate.
