SENATE BILL No. 1112

October 18, 2016, Introduced by Senators KNOLLENBERG, JONES, KOWALL, HERTEL and WARREN and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending sections 1201, 1205, 1206, and 1207 (MCL 339.1201, 339.1205, 339.1206, and 339.1207), as amended by 1997 PA 97, and by adding section 1210b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1201. As used in this article:

- (a) "Apprentice" means an individual **WHO IS** engaged in learning cosmetology in a cosmetology establishment.
- (b) "Braiding" means providing or offering to the general public for compensation any of the following services solely for development or improvement of physical qualities of the natural hair structure:
 - (i) Intertwining in a systematic motion to create patterns in

- 1 a 3-dimensional form.
- 2 (ii) Inversion or outversion flat against the scalp along the
- 3 part of a straight or curved row.
- 4 (iii) Twisting in a systematic motion.
- 5 (iv) Extension with natural or synthetic fibers.
- 6 (c) "Cosmetologist" means an individual who renders or offers
- 7 to render cosmetology services.
- 8 (d) "Cosmetology" means 1 of the following services or a
- 9 combination of the following services:
- 10 (i) Hair care services.STYLING.
- 11 (ii) Skin care services.
- 12 (iii) Manicuring services.
- (iv) Electrology.
- 14 (e) "Cosmetology establishment" means the premises on which
- 15 cosmetology or 1 or more of its services are rendered or are
- 16 offered to be rendered. PERFORMED OR OFFERED. Cosmetology
- 17 establishment does not include a school of cosmetology.
- 18 (f) "Electrologist" means an individual who renders PERFORMS
- 19 or offers to render PERFORM electrology.
- 20 (g) "Electrology" means the permanent removal of hair from the
- 21 body of an individual by the use of electricity.
- (h) "Esthetician" means an individual who renders PERFORMS or
- 23 offers to render PERFORM skin care services.
- 24 (i) "Hair care services" STYLING" means arranging, cutting,
- 25 dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, singeing, bleaching,
- 26 coloring, tinting, trimming, styling, relaxing, perming,
- 27 straightening, or similar work upon the hair of the head or a wig

- 1 that an individual is wearing.
- 2 (J) "HAIR STYLIST" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO PERFORMS OR OFFERS
- 3 TO PERFORM HAIR STYLING.
- 4 (K) (i)—"Instructor" means an individual who teaches or offers
- 5 to teach 1 or more cosmetology services in a school of cosmetology.
- 6 (1) (k) "Manicuring services" means the cleansing, filing,
- 7 shaping, buffing, polishing, or beautifying of the nails of the
- 8 hands or feet, and the cleansing, massaging, stimulating,
- 9 exercising, or beautifying of the skin of the hands, arms, and
- 10 feet, manually or with the use of tools, appliances, or cosmetic
- 11 preparations, including the repair of nails, or the creation or
- 12 decoration of artificial nails. Manicuring services do not include
- 13 the practice of podiatric medicine and surgery as defined in
- 14 section 18001 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- **15** 333.18001.
- 16 (M) (l) "Manicurist" means an individual who renders PERFORMS
- 17 or offers to render PERFORM manicuring services.
- 18 (N) (m)—"Natural hair cultivation" means techniques that
- 19 result in tension on hair strands such as twisting, wrapping,
- 20 weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair by hand. 7
- 21 which work THE TERM does not include the application of dyes,
- 22 reactive chemicals, or other preparations to alter the color or to
- 23 straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair.
- 24 (0) (n) "Natural hair culturist" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL
- 25 WHO IS engaged in natural hair cultivation but does not include a
- 26 person AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS engaged in natural hair cultivation if
- 27 that activity is performed as part of the practice of a recognized

- 1 religion.
- 2 (P) (o) "Owner" means a person who THAT owns and conducts a
- 3 cosmetology establishment or a school of cosmetology.
- 4 (Q) (p) "School of cosmetology" means the premises where ON
- 5 WHICH cosmetology or 1 or more of its services are taught.
- 6 (R) (q) "Skin care services" includes the following services
- 7 or combination of services:
- 8 (i) Beautifying the skin of the body of an individual by the
- 9 use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
- 10 creams, including body wrapping.
- 11 (ii) Cleansing or stimulating the skin of the body by the use
- 12 of the hands, devices, apparatus, or appliances, with or without
- 13 the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
- 14 creams.
- 15 (iii) The temporary removal of hair from the body of an
- 16 individual by the use of depilatories, waxes, razors, scissors,
- 17 clippers, or tweezers.
- 18 (iv) Giving facials, applying removable makeup, applying
- 19 eyelashes, or any other application of a preparation or beauty
- 20 enhancement to the body of an individual but does not include
- 21 applying permanent makeup or the use of tanning equipment.
- 22 (S) (r) "Student" means an individual WHO IS engaged in
- 23 learning cosmetology or 1 or more of its services in a school of
- 24 cosmetology.
- 25 Sec. 1205. (1) The department shall issue a license to a
- 26 person for the operation of a school of cosmetology if all of the
- 27 following requirements are met:

- 1 (a) An application is submitted by the owner or manager of the
- 2 school.
- 3 (b) The application includes a drawing or diagram that
- 4 indicates the premises to be licensed, showing CONFIRMS that the
- 5 premises are fully partitioned from any other activity, business,
- 6 or dwelling, . The AND SHOWS THE location of required equipment and
- 7 facilities. shall also be shown on the diagram.
- 8 (c) A cash or surety bond of \$10,000.00 has been IS furnished
- 9 in favor of the people of this state for the use and benefit of
- 10 students and conditioned upon ON the faithful performance and
- 11 satisfaction of the contractual rights of students.
- 12 (d) Provisions have been made for the school to be under the
- 13 THE SCHOOL HAS MADE PROVISIONS FOR THE daily supervision of THE
- 14 SCHOOL BY a licensed instructor who has at least 3 years'
- 15 experience in all services of cosmetology being THAT ARE taught in
- 16 the school.
- 17 (e) The premises has successfully passed an inspection by the
- 18 department conducted for the purpose of determining whether the
- 19 school has met the standards set forth in this article and rules
- 20 promulgated by the director.
- 21 (2) A school of cosmetology shall fulfill all of the following
- 22 requirements:
- 23 (a) Shall maintain a course of practical training and
- 24 technical instruction, as outlined in the various curricula set
- 25 forth in rules promulgated by the director, equal to the
- 26 requirements for prelicensure training under this article. A school
- 27 of cosmetology shall teach hair care services, STYLING, skin care

- 1 services, and manicuring services and may hold a limited license
- 2 for the teaching of electrology. However, a school of cosmetology
- 3 with a license limited only to the teaching of electrology shall
- 4 teach only electrology and not any other cosmetology service.
- 5 (b) Shall possess efficient apparatus and equipment,
- 6 prescribed AS REQUIRED in rules promulgated by the director, THAT
- 7 ARE sufficient for the ready and full teaching of each subject in
- 8 the curriculum.
- 9 (c) Shall maintain 1 person licensed as an instructor WHO IS
- 10 LICENSED UNDER THIS PART AND IS competent to impart instruction in
- 11 each subject of its curriculum, for every 20 students.
- 12 (d) Shall be operated for teaching purposes only. Instructors
- 13 shall practice on the public only to demonstrate techniques to
- 14 students and to correct the work of students.
- 15 (e) Shall provide for the display of the license of the school
- 16 of cosmetology and of each instructor working in the school in a
- 17 prominent place that is visible to the public at all times. A sign
- 18 shall be displayed indicating THE SCHOOL SHALL DISPLAY A SIGN THAT
- 19 INDICATES that services are rendered PERFORMED by students of the
- 20 school.
- 21 (f) At the time of the enrollment of a student, shall furnish
- 22 the student a financial contract showing THAT STATES the total cost
- 23 and all charges involved in the complete course of study.
- 24 Advertising matter put out by schools, when mentioning IF ANY
- 25 ADVERTISING BY THE SCHOOL MENTIONS the cost of tuition or related
- 26 subjects, shall furnish THE SCHOOL SHALL INCLUDE the same financial
- 27 information as described in this subsection. SUBDIVISION IN THE

1 ADVERTISING.

- 2 (3) A cosmetology establishment exacting THAT CHARGES a fee
- 3 for the teaching of cosmetology or 1 or more services of
- 4 cosmetology is considered a school of cosmetology and is required
- 5 to comply with this section. A cosmetology establishment conducting
- 6 THAT CONDUCTS an apprenticeship program without charging a fee for
- 7 the teaching of cosmetology shall comply with subsection (5). A
- 8 cosmetology establishment which THAT has successfully trained 1
- 9 apprentice is eligible to train additional apprentices except that
- 10 a cosmetology establishment shall not have more than 2 apprentices
- 11 at the same time.
- 12 (4) The department may issue a limited school of cosmetology
- 13 license to a school teaching THAT TEACHES only electrology. A
- 14 school of cosmetology whose license is limited to teaching only
- 15 electrology shall fulfill all of the requirements of this section,
- 16 except that AN ELECTROLOGY INSTRUCTOR SHALL PROVIDE THE daily
- 17 supervision of the school shall be provided by an electrology
- 18 instructor and the curriculum offered and equipment and facilities
- 19 required shall be only those required for the teaching of
- 20 electrology.
- 21 (5) A school of cosmetology or a cosmetology establishment
- 22 conducting THAT CONDUCTS an apprenticeship program shall comply
- 23 with all of the following requirements:
- 24 (a) Require SHALL NOT REQUIRE that a student or apprentice be
- 25 in attendance not more than 7 hours per day or not more than 40
- 26 hours per week.
- 27 (b) Keep_SHALL KEEP a daily record of the attendance of each

- 1 student or apprentice, SEND a copy of which shall be sent EACH
- 2 DAILY RECORD OF ATTENDANCE to the department monthly, establish
- 3 grades, and require a student or apprentice to pass an examination
- 4 before certifying to the department that an individual has
- 5 completed training.
- 6 (c) Permit a cosmetology student or apprentice to practice on
- 7 the public only after completing at least 350 hours of instruction
- 8 in the general cosmetology curriculum, including both theory and
- 9 practical hours. A student or apprentice in a natural hair
- 10 cultivation, HAIR STYLING, manicuring, skin care, or electrology
- 11 curriculum may practice on the public only after completing at
- 12 least 1/4 of the hours required by the applicable curriculum,
- including both theory and practical hours.
- 14 (6) The transfer of ownership or location of a school of
- 15 cosmetology voids the license. The filing of a new license
- 16 application is a predicate to the REQUIRED BEFORE ANY change in
- 17 ownership or location of a school.
- 18 Sec. 1206. (1) The department shall issue a license as a
- 19 cosmetology instructor to an individual who meets all of the
- 20 following requirements:
- 21 (a) Is of good moral character.
- 22 (b) Has a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- (c) Is licensed as a cosmetologist under this article.
- 24 (d) Has at least 3 years of practical experience in natural
- 25 hair cultivation, hair care services, STYLING, skin care services,
- 26 and manicuring services, at least 1 year of which shall be IS in a
- 27 cosmetology establishment.

- 1 (e) Has completed not less than 500 hours of instructor
- 2 training.
- 3 (f) Has passed an examination approved by the department and
- 4 the board.
- 5 (2) The department shall issue a license as an electrology
- 6 instructor to an individual who meets all of the following
- 7 requirements:
- 8 (a) Is of good moral character.
- 9 (b) Has a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 10 (c) Is licensed as an electrologist under this article.
- 11 (d) Has at least 3 years of practical experience in
- 12 electrology, at least 1 year of which shall be IS in a cosmetology
- 13 establishment holding a limited license for the practice of
- 14 electrology.
- 15 (e) Has completed not less than 300 hours of instructor
- 16 training.
- 17 (f) Has passed an examination approved by the department and
- 18 the board.
- 19 (3) The department may issue a limited instructor's license to
- 20 an individual who meets all of the requirements of either
- 21 subsection (1) except for subsection (1)(d) or subsection (2)
- 22 except for subsection (2)(d). The holder of a limited instructor's
- 23 license shall not supervise a school of cosmetology at any time.
- 24 (4) The department may issue a limited specialist instructor's
- 25 license to an individual who meets all of the following
- 26 requirements:
- 27 (a) Is of good moral character.

- 1 (b) Has a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 2 (c) Is licensed as a manicurist, natural hair culturist, HAIR
- 3 STYLIST, or esthetician.
- 4 (d) Has completed not less than 300 hours of instructor
- 5 training.
- 6 (e) Has passed an examination approved by the department and
- 7 the board.
- 8 (5) The—A specialist instructor's license ISSUED UNDER
- 9 SUBSECTION (4) shall limit the instruction given by that THE
- 10 individual IS AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE to only the service in which he
- 11 or she is licensed.
- 12 Sec. 1207. The department shall issue a cosmetologist license
- 13 to an individual who fulfills all of the following requirements:
- 14 (a) Is not less than AT LEAST 17 years of age.
- (b) Is of good moral character.
- 16 (c) Has had an education equivalent to the completion of the
- 17 ninth grade.
- 18 (d) Has completed either not less than a 1,500-hour course of
- 19 study in a licensed school of cosmetology or has served as an
- 20 apprentice for not less than 2 years in a licensed cosmetology
- 21 establishment in which hair care services, STYLING, skin care
- 22 services, and manicuring services are offered. The training shall
- 23 include a minimum number of practical applications as prescribed in
- 24 rules promulgated by the director.
- 25 (e) Has passed an examination prescribed by the department and
- 26 the board.
- 27 SEC. 1210B. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A LICENSE AS A HAIR

- 1 STYLIST TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO FULFILLS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (A) IS AT LEAST 17 YEARS OF AGE.
- 3 (B) IS OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.
- 4 (C) HAS HAD AN EDUCATION EQUIVALENT TO THE COMPLETION OF THE
- 5 NINTH GRADE.
- 6 (D) HAS COMPLETED AT LEAST 1,100 HOURS OF TRAINING IN A
- 7 LICENSED SCHOOL OF COSMETOLOGY IN WHICH THE PRACTICE OF HAIR
- 8 STYLING IS TAUGHT OR HAS STUDIED FOR AT LEAST 2 YEARS AS AN
- 9 APPRENTICE IN A LICENSED COSMETOLOGY ESTABLISHMENT WHERE HAIR
- 10 STYLING SERVICES ARE OFFERED. THE TRAINING SHALL INCLUDE A MINIMUM
- 11 NUMBER OF PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS AS PRESCRIBED IN RULES PROMULGATED
- 12 BY THE DIRECTOR.
- 13 (E) HAS PASSED AN EXAMINATION PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD AND THE
- 14 DEPARTMENT.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 16 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 17 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 18 unless Senate Bill No.____ or House Bill No.____ (request no.
- 19 06385'16) of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.
