A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled
"The state school aid act of 1979,"
by amending sections 201, 201a, 206, 207a, 207b, 207c, 209, 210b,
217, 225, 226, 229, 229a, and 230 (MCL 388.1801, 388.1801a,
388.1806, 388.1807a, 388.1807b, 388.1807c, 388.1809, 388.1810b,
388.1817, 388.1825, 388.1826, 388.1829, 388.1829a, and 388.1830),
as amended by 2017 PA 108, and by adding section 209a.

2 Sec. 201a. It is the intent of the legislature to provide
3 appropriations for the fiscal year ending on September 30, ~~2019~~
4 ~~2020~~ for the items listed in section 201. The fiscal year ~~2018-2019~~
5 ~~2019-2020~~ appropriations are anticipated to be the same as those
6 for fiscal year ~~2017-2018, 2018-2019~~, except that the amounts will
7 be adjusted for changes in retirement costs, caseload and related
8 costs, federal fund match rates, economic factors, and available
9 revenue. These adjustments will be determined after the January
10 ~~2018-2019~~ consensus revenue estimating conference.

11 Sec. 206. (1) The funds appropriated in section 201 are
12 appropriated for community colleges with fiscal years ending June
13 30, ~~2018-2019~~ and shall be paid out of the state treasury and
14 distributed by the state treasurer to the respective community
15 colleges in 11 monthly installments on the sixteenth of each month,
16 or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16,

13 (g) The state budget director shall notify the chairs of the
14 house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges
15 at least 10 days before withholding funds from any community
16 college.

17 Sec. 207a. All of the following apply to the allocation of the
18 fiscal year ~~2017-2018~~**2018-2019** appropriations described in section
19 201(4):

20 (a) A community college that receives money under section
21 201(4) shall use that money solely for the purpose of offsetting a
22 portion of the retirement contributions owed by the college for
23 that fiscal year.

24 (b) The amount allocated to each participating community
25 college under section 201(4) shall be based on each college's
26 percentage of the total covered payroll for all community colleges
27 that are participating colleges in the immediately preceding fiscal

1 year.

2 Sec. 207b. All of the following apply to the allocation of the
3 fiscal year ~~2017-2018~~**2018-2019** appropriations described in section
4 201(5) for payments to community colleges that are participating
5 entities of the retirement system:

6 (a) The amount of a payment under section 201(5) shall be the
7 difference between the unfunded actuarial accrued liability
8 contribution rate as calculated under section 41 of the public
9 school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1341,
10 as calculated without taking into account the maximum employer rate
11 of 20.96% included in section 41 of the public school employees
12 retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1341, and the maximum

21 retirement contributions under section 201(5).

22 (c) Each participating college that receives funds under
23 section 201(5) shall forward an amount equal to the amount
24 allocated under subdivision (b) to the retirement system in a form
25 and manner determined by the retirement system.

14 of the Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692.

15 Sec. 209. (1) Within 30 days after the board of a community
16 college adopts its annual operating budget for the following fiscal
17 year, or after the board adopts a subsequent revision to that
18 budget, the community college shall make all of the following
19 available through a link on its website homepage:

20 (a) The annual operating budget and subsequent budget
21 revisions.

22 (b) A link to the most recent ~~"Activities Classification~~
23 ~~Structure Data Book and Companion"~~**"MICHIGAN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DATA**
24 **INVENTORY REPORT"**.

25 (c) General fund revenue and expenditure projections for the
26 current fiscal year and the next fiscal year.

27 (d) A listing of all debt service obligations, detailed by

1 project, anticipated fiscal year payment of each project, and total
2 outstanding debt for the current fiscal year.

3 (e) Links to all of the following for the community college:

4 (i) The current collective bargaining agreement for each
5 bargaining unit.

6 (ii) Each health care benefits plan, including, but not
7 limited to, medical, dental, vision, disability, long-term care, or
8 any other type of benefits that would constitute health care
9 services, offered to any bargaining unit or employee of the
10 community college.

11 (iii) Audits and financial reports for the most recent fiscal
12 year for which they are available.

13 (iv) A copy of the board of trustees resolution regarding
14 compliance with best practices for the local strategic value
15 component described in section 230(2).

16 (2) For statewide consistency and public visibility, community
17 colleges must use the icon badge provided by the department of
18 technology, management, and budget consistent with the icon badge
19 developed by the department of education for K-12 school districts.
20 It must appear on the front of each community college's homepage.
21 The size of the icon may be reduced to 150 x 150 pixels.

22 (3) The state budget director shall determine whether a
23 community college has complied with this section. The state budget
24 director may withhold a community college's monthly installments
25 described in section 206 until the community college complies with
26 this section. The state budget director shall notify the chairs of
27 the house and senate appropriations subcommittee on community

1 colleges at least 10 days before withholding funds from any
2 community college.

3 (4) Each community college shall report the following
4 information to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on
5 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the
6 state budget office by November 15 of each fiscal year and post
7 that information on its website as required under subsection (1):

8 (a) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
9 tuition and fees.

10 (b) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
11 state appropriations.

12 (c) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
13 property taxes.

14 (d) Budgeted current fiscal year total general fund revenue.

15 (e) Budgeted current fiscal year total general fund
16 expenditures.

17 (5) By November 15 of each year, a community college shall
18 report the following information to the center and post the
19 information on its website under the budget transparency icon
20 badge:

21 (a) Opportunities for earning college credit through the
22 following programs:

23 (i) State approved career and technical education or a tech
24 prep articulated program of study.

25 (ii) Direct college credit or concurrent enrollment.

26 (iii) Dual enrollment.

27 (iv) An early college/middle college program.

1 (b) For each program described in subdivision (a) that the
2 community college offers, all of the following information:

3 (i) The number of high school students participating in the
4 program.

5 (ii) The number of school districts that participate in the
6 program with the community college.

7 (iii) Whether a college professor, qualified local school
8 district employee, or other individual teaches the course or
9 courses in the program.

10 (iv) The total cost to the community college to operate the
11 program.

12 (v) The cost per credit hour for the course or courses in the
13 program.

14 (vi) The location where the course or courses in the program
15 are held.

16 (vii) Instructional resources offered to the program
17 instructors.

18 (viii) Resources offered to the student in the program.

19 (ix) Transportation services provided to students in the
20 program.

21 **SEC. 209A. (1) A PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL DEVELOP,**
22 **MAINTAIN, AND UPDATE A "CAMPUS SAFETY INFORMATION AND RESOURCES"**
23 **LINK, PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED ON THE HOMEPAGE OF ITS WEBSITE, TO A**
24 **SECTION OF ITS WEBSITE CONTAINING ALL OF THE INFORMATION REQUIRED**
25 **UNDER SUBSECTION (2).**

26 **(2) THE "CAMPUS SAFETY INFORMATION AND RESOURCES" SECTION OF A**
27 **PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S WEBSITE SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE**

1 LIMITED TO, ALL OF THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

2 (A) EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBERS FOR POLICE, FIRE, HEALTH, AND
3 OTHER SERVICES.

4 (B) HOURS, LOCATIONS, PHONE NUMBERS, AND ELECTRONIC MAIL
5 CONTACTS FOR CAMPUS PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICES AND TITLE IX OFFICES.

6 (C) A LIST OF SAFETY AND SECURITY SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE
7 COMMUNITY COLLEGE, INCLUDING TRANSPORTATION, ESCORT SERVICES,
8 BUILDING SURVEILLANCE, ANONYMOUS TIP LINES, AND OTHER AVAILABLE
9 SECURITY SERVICES.

10 (D) A PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S POLICIES APPLICABLE TO MINORS
11 ON COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROPERTY.

12 (E) A DIRECTORY OF RESOURCES AVAILABLE AT THE COMMUNITY
13 COLLEGE OR SURROUNDING COMMUNITY FOR STUDENTS OR EMPLOYEES WHO ARE
14 SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT OR SEXUAL ABUSE.

15 (F) AN ELECTRONIC COPY OF "A RESOURCE HANDBOOK FOR CAMPUS
16 SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS, FRIENDS AND FAMILY," PUBLISHED IN 2018 BY
17 THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE FIRST LADY OF
18 MICHIGAN.

19 (G) CAMPUS SECURITY POLICIES AND CRIME STATISTICS PURSUANT TO
20 THE STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW AND CAMPUS SECURITY ACT, PUBLIC LAW 101-
21 542, 104 STAT 2381. INFORMATION SHALL INCLUDE ALL MATERIAL PREPARED
22 PURSUANT TO THE PUBLIC INFORMATION REPORTING REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE
23 CRIME AWARENESS AND CAMPUS SECURITY ACT OF 1990, TITLE II OF THE
24 STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW AND CAMPUS SECURITY ACT, PUBLIC LAW 101-542,
25 104 STAT 2381.

26 (3) THE STATE BUDGET DIRECTOR SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER A PUBLIC

9 activities and programs of the transfer steering committee since
10 the March 1, ~~2017~~ 2018 report required under this section,

12 community college operations under section 201(2) in fiscal year

16 base appropriations, 30%.

17 (b) Based on a weighted student contact hour formula as
18 provided for in the 2016 recommendations of the performance
19 indicators task force, 30%.

2 (ii) The community college provides customized on-site

7 (iv) The community college supports technological advancement
8 through industry partnerships, incubation activities, or operation
9 of a Michigan technical education center or other advanced

11 (v) The community college has active partnerships with local
12 or regional workforce and economic development agencies.

13 (b) For Category B, educational partnerships, the following:

14 (i) The community college has active partnerships with
15 regional high schools, intermediate school districts, and career-
16 tech centers to provide instruction through dual enrollment,
17 concurrent enrollment, direct credit, middle college, or academy
18 programs.

19 (ii) The community college hosts, sponsors, or participates in
20 enrichment programs for area K-12 students, such as college days,
21 summer or after-school programming, or Science Olympiad.

22 (iii) The community college provides, supports, or
23 participates in programming to promote successful transitions to
24 college for traditional age students, including grant programs such
25 as talent search, upward bound, or other activities to promote
26 college readiness in area high schools and community centers.

27 (iv) The community college provides, supports, or participates

1 in programming to promote successful transitions to college for new
2 or reentering adult students, such as adult basic education, a high
3 school equivalency test preparation program and testing, or
4 recruiting, advising, or orientation activities specific to adults.
5 As used in this subparagraph, "high school equivalency test
6 preparation program" means that term as defined in section 4.

7 (v) The community college has active partnerships with
8 regional 4-year colleges and universities to promote successful
9 transfer, such as articulation, 2+2, or reverse transfer agreements
10 or operation of a university center.

11 (c) For Category C, community services, the following:

12 (i) The community college provides continuing education
13 programming for leisure, wellness, personal enrichment, or
14 professional development.

15 (ii) The community college operates or sponsors opportunities
16 for community members to engage in activities that promote leisure,
17 wellness, cultural or personal enrichment such as community sports
18 teams, theater or musical ensembles, or artist guilds.

19 (iii) The community college operates public facilities to
20 promote cultural, educational, or personal enrichment for community
21 members, such as libraries, computer labs, performing arts centers,
22 museums, art galleries, or television or radio stations.

23 (iv) The community college operates public facilities to
24 promote leisure or wellness activities for community members,
25 including gymnasiums, athletic fields, tennis courts, fitness
26 centers, hiking or biking trails, or natural areas.

27 (v) The community college promotes, sponsors, or hosts

1 community service activities for students, staff, or community
2 members.

3 (4) Payments for performance funding under section 201(2)
4 shall be made to a community college only if that community college
5 actively participates in the Michigan Transfer Network sponsored by
6 the Michigan Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions
7 Officers and submits timely updates, including updated course
8 equivalencies at least every 6 months, to the Michigan transfer
9 network. The state budget director shall determine if a community
10 college has not satisfied this requirement. The state budget
11 director may withhold payments for performance funding until a
12 community college is in compliance with this section.

13 Enacting section 1. In accordance with section 30 of article
14 IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from
15 state sources for community colleges for fiscal year 2018-2019
16 under article II of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94,
17 MCL 388.1801 to 388.1830, is estimated at \$408,206,000.00 and the
18 amount of that state spending from state sources to be paid to
19 local units of government for fiscal year 2018-2019 is estimated at
20 \$408,206,000.00.

21 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act takes effect October
