## **HOUSE BILL No. 4003**

January 11, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Lucido and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending section 12a (MCL 28.432a), as amended by 2016 PA 301.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- L Sec. 12a. (1) The requirements of this act for obtaining a
  - license to carry a concealed pistol do not apply to any of the
- 3 following:
  - (a) A peace officer of a duly authorized police agency of the

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- 1 United States or of this state or a political subdivision of this
- 2 state, who is regularly employed and paid by the United States or
- 3 this state or a subdivision of this state, except a township
- 4 constable.
- 5 (b) A constable who is trained and licensed or certified under
- 6 the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA
- 7 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.615, while engaged in his or her official
- 8 duties or going to or coming from his or her official duties, and
- 9 who is regularly employed and paid by a political subdivision of
- 10 this state.
- 11 (c) An individual regularly employed by the department of
- 12 corrections and authorized in writing by the director of the
- 13 department of corrections to carry a concealed pistol during the
- 14 performance of his or her duties or while going to or returning
- 15 from his or her duties.
- 16 (d) An individual regularly employed as a local corrections
- 17 officer by a county sheriff, who is trained in the use of force and
- 18 is authorized in writing by the county sheriff to carry a concealed
- 19 pistol during the performance of his or her duties.
- 20 (e) An individual regularly employed in a city jail or lockup
- 21 who has custody of individuals detained or incarcerated in the jail
- 22 or lockup, is trained in the use of force, and is authorized in
- 23 writing by the chief of police or the county sheriff to carry a
- 24 concealed pistol during the performance of his or her duties.
- 25 (f) A member of the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, or
- 26 Marine Corps while carrying a concealed pistol in the line of duty.
- 27 (g) A member of the National Guard, armed forces reserves, or

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- 1 other duly authorized military organization while on duty or drill
- 2 or while going to or returning from his or her place of assembly or
- 3 practice or while carrying a concealed pistol for purposes of that
- 4 military organization.
- 5 (h) A resident of another state who is licensed by that state
- 6 to carry a concealed pistol.
- 7 (i) The regular and ordinary transportation of a pistol as
- 8 merchandise by an authorized agent of a person licensed to
- 9 manufacture firearms.
- (j) An individual while carrying a pistol unloaded in a
- 11 wrapper or container in the trunk of his or her vehicle or, if the
- 12 vehicle does not have a trunk, from transporting that pistol
- 13 unloaded in a locked compartment or container that is separated
- 14 from the ammunition for that pistol from the place of purchase to
- 15 his or her home or place of business or to a place of repair or
- 16 back to his or her home or place of business, or in moving goods
- 17 from 1 place of abode or business to another place of abode or
- 18 business.
- (k) A peace officer or law enforcement officer from Canada.
- 20 (l) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AND WHO IS
- 21 NOT OTHERWISE PROHIBITED FROM POSSESSING A FIREARM.
- 22 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS CARRYING A CONCEALED PISTOL UNDER
- 23 SUBSECTION (1)(l) AND WHO DOES NOT HAVE A LICENSE TO CARRY A
- 24 CONCEALED PISTOL SHALL, WHEN STOPPED BY A PEACE OFFICER,
- 25 IMMEDIATELY DISCLOSE TO THE PEACE OFFICER THAT HE OR SHE IS
- 26 CARRYING A PISTOL CONCEALED UPON HIS OR HER PERSON OR IN HIS OR HER

27 VEHICLE.

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- 1 (3) IF A PEACE OFFICER STOPS AN INDIVIDUAL AND THAT INDIVIDUAL
- 2 IS CARRYING A CONCEALED PISTOL UNDER SUBSECTION (1) (l), THE PEACE
- 3 OFFICER MAY DETAIN THE INDIVIDUAL TEMPORARILY TO DETERMINE IF THE
- 4 INDIVIDUAL IS PROHIBITED FROM POSSESSING A FIREARM.
- 5 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (2) IS RESPONSIBLE
- 6 FOR A STATE CIVIL INFRACTION AND SHALL BE FINED NOT MORE THAN
- 7 \$500.00.
