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HOUSE BILL No. 4107

January 26, 2017, Introduced by Rep. LaFave and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1917 PA 350, entitled

"An act to regulate and license second hand dealers and junk dealers; and to prescribe penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act,"

by amending sections 1, 2, 3, and 6 (MCL 445.401, 445.402, 445.403, and 445.406), sections 1 and 2 as amended by 2008 PA 432 and section 3 as amended by 2006 PA 675.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. (1) A person , corporation, copartnership, or firm shall not carry on the business of dealer in second hand goods or junk dealer in any of the counties, cities, or villages, OR

TOWNSHIPS of this state without having first obtained, from the

mayor of the city or the chief executive officer of the county, or

village, OR TOWNSHIP where the business is to be carried on, a

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- 1 license under this act authorizing that person , corporation,
- 2 copartnership, or firm to carry on that business.
- 3 (2) This section does not require an internet drop-off store
- 4 complying THAT COMPLIES with subsection (3), or a person AN
- 5 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS engaged in the sale, purchase, consignment, or
- 6 trade of personal property or other valuable thing for himself or
- 7 herself, to obtain a license under this act.
- 8 (3) An internet drop-off store in compliance with THAT MEETS
- 9 ALL OF the following conditions is exempt from licensure as a
- 10 second hand dealer or junk dealer under this act:
- 11 (a) Has a fixed place of business within this state except
- 12 that he or she THE PERSON exclusively transacts all purchases or
- 13 sales by means of the internet and the purchases and sales are not
- 14 physically transacted on the premises of that fixed place of
- 15 business.
- 16 (b) Has the personal property or other valuable thing
- 17 available on a website for viewing by photograph, if available, by
- 18 the general public at no charge, which—AND THE website shall be—IS
- 19 searchable by zip code or state, or both. The website viewing shall
- 20 include, as applicable, serial number, make, model, and other
- 21 unique identifying marks, numbers, names, or letters appearing on
- 22 the personal property or other valuable thing.
- (c) Maintains records of the sale, purchase, consignment, or
- 24 trade of the personal property or other valuable thing for at least
- 25 2 years, which AND THOSE records shall contain a description,
- 26 including a photograph, if available, and, if applicable, serial
- 27 number, make, model, and other unique identifying marks, numbers,

- 1 names, or letters appearing on the personal property or other
- valuable thing.
- 3 (d) Provide PROVIDES the local law enforcement agency with any
- 4 name under which it conducts business on the website and access to
- 5 the business premises at any time during normal business hours for
- 6 purposes of inspection.
- 7 (e) Within 24 hours after a request from a local law
- 8 enforcement agency, provide PROVIDES an electronic copy of the
- 9 seller's or consignor's name, address, telephone number, driver
- 10 license number and issuing state, the buyer's name and address if
- 11 applicable, and a description of the personal property or other
- 12 valuable thing as described in subdivision (c). The provision of
- 13 information shall be **PROVIDED** in a format **THAT IS** acceptable to the
- 14 local law enforcement agency but shall at least be in a legible
- 15 format and in the English language.
- 16 (f) Provide PROVIDES that payment for the personal property or
- 17 other valuable thing is executed by means of check or other
- 18 electronic payment system; , so long as THAT the payment is not
- 19 made in cash; . No AND THAT payment shall be provided IS NOT MADE
- 20 to the seller until the item is sold.
- 21 (q) Immediately remove—REMOVES the personal property or other
- 22 valuable thing from the website if the local law enforcement agency
- 23 determines that the personal property or other valuable thing is
- 24 stolen.
- 25 (4) This section does not exempt a person **THAT IS** purchasing
- 26 or selling articles of nonferrous metals from compliance with the
- 27 nonferrous metal regulatory act.SCRAP METAL REGULATORY ACT, 2008 PA

- 1 429, MCL 445.421 TO 445.443.
- 2 Sec. 2. (1) The mayor of a city or chief executive officer of
- 3 a county, $\frac{\partial r}{\partial t}$ village, **OR TOWNSHIP** may grant to any person τ
- 4 corporation, copartnership, or firm, a license authorizing THAT
- 5 AUTHORIZES that person , corporation, copartnership, or firm to
- 6 carry on the business of a second hand dealer or junk dealer IN
- 7 THAT CITY, COUNTY, VILLAGE, OR TOWNSHIP, subject to the provisions
- 8 of this act.
- 9 (2) The—A license GRANTED UNDER THIS SECTION shall designate
- 10 the particular place where that THE person , corporation,
- 11 copartnership, or firm shall carry on that THE business OF A SECOND
- 12 HAND DEALER OR JUNK DEALER. The DEALER SHALL ONLY CONDUCT THAT
- 13 business shall be conducted only in AT the place designated in the
- 14 license.
- 15 (3) The TERM OF A license shall be for the period of GRANTED
- 16 UNDER THIS SECTION EXPIRES 1 year from AFTER THE date of issuance,
- 17 unless sooner revoked for cause, and is not transferable. The
- 18 legislative body of any city OR TOWNSHIP, or the trustees and chief
- 19 executive officer of any county or village, shall establish the fee
- 20 for the processing and issuance of the license in accordance with
- 21 its charter or local ordinance, based upon ON the cost of issuance
- 22 and administration of that license.
- 23 (4) The A city, village, TOWNSHIP, or county may inspect the
- 24 premises of a licensed second hand or junk dealer during normal
- 25 business hours.
- Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 27 (a) "Automotive recycler" means a person who THAT engages in

- 1 business primarily for the purpose of selling retail salvage
- 2 vehicle parts and secondarily for the purpose of selling retail
- 3 salvage motor vehicles or manufacturing or selling a product of
- 4 gradable scrap metal or a person employed as a salvage vehicle
- 5 agent as that term is defined in section 56c of the Michigan
- 6 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.56c.
- 7 (b) "Industrial scrap" means materials that are a direct
- 8 product or by-product of any form of manufacturing, shaping, or
- 9 cutting process from a person , company, corporation,
- 10 copartnership, or firm—whose principal business is the
- 11 manufacturing, shaping, or cutting of materials at a fixed place of
- 12 business.
- (c) "Internet drop-off store" means a person , corporation, or
- 14 firm—that contracts with other persons , corporations, or firms—to
- 15 offer its personal property or other valuable thing for sale,
- 16 purchase, consignment, or trade through means of an internet
- 17 website and meets the conditions described in section 1(3).
- 18 (d) "Local law enforcement agency" means the police agency of
- 19 the city, village, or township, or if none, the county sheriff of
- 20 the county in which the internet drop-off store conducts business.
- 21 (E) "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, CORPORATION, LIMITED
- 22 LIABILITY COMPANY, PARTNERSHIP, ASSOCIATION, OR OTHER LEGAL ENTITY.
- **23 (F)** "Scrap processor" means a person, utilizing machinery
- 24 and equipment and operating from a fixed location, whose principal
- 25 business is the processing and manufacturing of iron, steel,
- 26 nonferrous metals, paper, plastic, or glass, into prepared grades
- 27 of products suitable for consumption by recycling mills, foundries,

- 1 and other scrap processors.
- 2 (G) (f) "Second hand dealer" or "junk dealer" means any person
- 3 recorporation, or member or members of a copartnership or firm
- 4 whose principal business is that of purchasing, selling,
- 5 exchanging, storing, or receiving second hand articles of any kind,
- 6 scrap metals, cast iron, old iron, old steel, tool steel, aluminum,
- 7 copper, brass, lead pipe or tools, or lighting and plumbing
- 8 fixtures. Second hand dealer or junk dealer does not include a
- 9 scrap processor, an automotive recycler, or a junkyard that deals
- 10 principally in industrial scrap and is licensed by a city, village,
- 11 TOWNSHIP, or county.
- Sec. 6. If the purchaser or receiver, by exchange or
- 13 otherwise, as OF AN ARTICLE described in section 3 , is a peddler
- 14 or goes about with a wagon to purchase or obtain by exchange or
- 15 otherwise, any of such THOSE articles, and does not have a place of
- 16 business in a building, he OR SHE need not retain such THOSE
- 17 articles for 15 days before selling them, provided—IF on Monday of
- 18 each week he OR SHE files with the chief of police or chief police
- 19 officer of the city, or village, OR TOWNSHIP in which he OR SHE is
- 20 located a report showing the place of business of the person to
- 21 whom such WHICH THE sale was made; AND a copy of the record
- 22 required by such section to be UNDER SECTION 3 IS kept in a
- 23 separate book of the articles purchased or received during the
- 24 preceding week, including a description of such THE articles sold,
- 25 to whom sold and his THE PERSON TO WHICH THEY WERE SOLD, AND THAT
- 26 PERSON'S place of business.
- 27 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days

1 after the date it is enacted into law.
