A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending section 931a (MCL 168.931a), as added by 2012 PA 280.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 931a. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 2 contrary, and except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), the
- 3 name of an elected or appointed official of this state or a
- 4 political subdivision of this state, shall—OR ANY CONTACT
- 5 INFORMATION FOR AN ELECTED OR APPOINTED OFFICIAL OF THIS STATE OR A
 - POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE THAT INCLUDES THE ELECTED OR
- 7 APPOINTED OFFICIAL'S NAME OR ANY PART OF THE ELECTED OR APPOINTED
- 8 OFFICIAL'S NAME, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AN ELECTRONIC MAIL
- 9 ADDRESS, MUST not appear on any ballot-related material that is
- 10 provided to an elector. As used in this section, "ballot-related
- 11 material" includes any of the following:

- 1 (A) AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION.
- 2 (B) ANY MATERIAL PROVIDED TO AN ELECTOR WITH AN ABSENT VOTER
- 3 BALLOT APPLICATION INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AN ABSENT VOTER
- 4 BALLOT APPLICATION RETURN ENVELOPE.
- 5 (C) (a) Any material provided to an elector with an absent
- 6 voter ballot.
- 7 (D) (b) Absent voter ballot instructions.
- 8 (E) (c)—An envelope used to mail to an elector an absent voter
- 9 ballot or any other ballot material.
- 10 (F) (d)—An absent voter ballot return envelope.
- 11 (2) Any ballot-related material printed or prepared before the
- 12 effective date of the amendatory act that added this section that
- 13 contains the name of an elected or appointed official of this state
- 14 or a political subdivision of this state may be used if the elected
- or appointed official whose name appears on the ballot-related
- 16 materials is not a candidate at the election in which those ballot-
- 17 related materials are being used.
- 18 (2) (3)—A person who violates this section is guilty of a
- 19 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 for a
- 20 first offense and is quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine
- 21 of not more than \$250.00 for a second or subsequent offense.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 23 after the date it is enacted into law.
