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## **HOUSE BILL No. 4489**

April 19, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Marino and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 196, entitled

"An act to prescribe standards of conduct for public officers and employees; to create a state board of ethics and prescribe its powers and duties; and to prescribe remedies and penalties,"

by amending the title and section 2 (MCL 15.342), the title as amended by 1980 PA 481 and section 2 as amended by 1984 PA 53.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

An act to prescribe standards of conduct for public officers and employees AND OTHERS; to create a state board of ethics and prescribe its powers and duties; and to prescribe remedies and penalties.

Sec. 2. (1) A public officer or employee shall not divulge, to an unauthorized person, confidential information acquired in the course of employment in advance of BEFORE the time prescribed for

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- 1 its authorized release to the public.
- 2 (2) A public officer or employee shall not represent his or
- 3 her personal opinion as that of an agency.
- 4 (3) A public officer or employee shall use personnel
- 5 resources, property, and funds under the officer or employee's
- 6 official care and control judiciously and solely in accordance with
- 7 **PURSUANT TO** prescribed constitutional, statutory, and regulatory
- 8 procedures and not for personal gain or benefit.
- 9 (4) A public officer or employee, OR A MEMBER OF HIS OR HER
- 10 IMMEDIATE FAMILY, shall not solicit or accept a gift or loan of
- 11 money, goods, services, or other thing of value for the benefit of
- 12 a person or organization, other than the THIS state, which THAT
- 13 tends to influence the manner in which the public officer or
- 14 employee or another public officer or employee performs official
- 15 duties.
- 16 (5) A public officer or employee shall not engage in a
- 17 business transaction in which the public officer or employee, OR A
- 18 MEMBER OF HIS OR HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY, may profit from his or her
- 19 official position or authority or benefit financially from
- 20 confidential information which THAT the public officer or employee
- 21 has obtained or may obtain by reason of that position or authority.
- 22 Instruction which THAT is not done during regularly scheduled
- 23 working hours except for annual leave or vacation time shall—IS not
- 24 be considered a business transaction pursuant to UNDER this
- 25 subsection if the instructor does not have any direct dealing with
- 26 or influence on the employing or contracting facility associated
- 27 with his or her course of employment with this state.

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- 1 (6) Except as provided in section 2a, a public officer or
- 2 employee shall not engage in or accept employment or render
- 3 services for a private or public interest when IF that employment
- 4 or service is incompatible or in conflict with the discharge of the
- 5 officer or employee's official duties or when IF that employment
- 6 may tend to impair his or her independence of judgment or action in
- 7 the performance of official duties.
- 8 (7) Except as provided in section 2a, a public officer or
- 9 employee shall not participate in the negotiation or execution of
- 10 contracts, making of loans, granting of subsidies, fixing of rates,
- 11 issuance of permits or certificates, or other regulation or
- 12 supervision relating to a business entity in which the public
- 13 officer or employee, OR A MEMBER OF HIS OR HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY,
- 14 has a financial or personal interest.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 16 after the date it is enacted into law.
