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HOUSE BILL No. 4560

May 2, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Hammoud, Sabo, Geiss, Hoadley, Schor, Elder, Wittenberg, Love, Santana, Gay-Dagnogo and Sneller and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled

"The Michigan penal code,"

by amending sections 234d and 237a (MCL 750.234d and 750.237a), section 234d as amended by 1994 PA 158 and section 237a as amended by 2015 PA 26.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 234d. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person

 AN INDIVIDUAL shall not possess a firearm on the premises of any of
 the following:
 - (a) A depository financial institution or a subsidiary or affiliate of a depository financial institution.
 - (b) A church or other house of religious worship.
 - (c) A court.
 - (d) A theatre.

- 1 (e) A sports arena.
- 2 (f) A day care center.
- **3** (q) A hospital.
- 4 (h) An establishment licensed under the Michigan liquor
- 5 control act, Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the Extra Session of
- 6 1933, being sections 436.1 to 436.58 of the Michigan Compiled
- 7 Laws.CODE OF 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 TO 436.2303.
- 8 (I) A POLICE STATION, IF THE POLICE STATION HAS A SIGN POSTED
- 9 AT EACH ENTRANCE STATING THAT THE POSSESSION OF FIREARMS IS
- 10 PROHIBITED ON THE PREMISES.
- 11 (2) This section does not apply to any of the following:
- 12 (a) A person AN INDIVIDUAL who owns, or is employed by or
- 13 contracted by, an entity described in subsection (1) if the
- 14 possession of that firearm is to provide security services for that
- 15 entity.
- 16 (b) A peace officer.
- 17 (c) A person licensed by this state or another state to carry
- 18 a concealed weapon.
- 19 (C) (d) A person AN INDIVIDUAL who possesses a firearm on the
- 20 premises of an entity described in subsection (1) if that
- 21 possession is with the permission of the owner or an agent of the
- 22 owner of that entity.
- 23 (D) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO POSSESSES A FIREARM AT A POLICE STATION
- 24 IF THAT INDIVIDUAL POSSESSES THE FIREARM FOR 1 OF THE FOLLOWING
- 25 PURPOSES:
- 26 (i) TO RELINQUISH THAT FIREARM TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO BE
- 27 DESTROYED.

- 1 (ii) TO RELINQUISH THAT FIREARM TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AS
- 2 EVIDENCE.
- 3 (3) A person AN INDIVIDUAL who violates this section is guilty
- 4 of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90
- 5 days or a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both.
- 6 Sec. 237a. (1) An individual who engages in conduct proscribed
- 7 under section 224, 224a, 224b, 224c, 224e, 226, 227, 227a, 227f,
- 8 234a, 234b, or 234c, or who engages in conduct proscribed under
- 9 section 223(2) for a second or subsequent time, in a weapon free
- 10 school zone is guilty of a felony punishable by 1 or more of the
- 11 following:
- 12 (a) Imprisonment for not more than the maximum term of
- 13 imprisonment authorized for the section violated.
- 14 (b) Community service for not more than 150 hours.
- 15 (c) A fine of not more than 3 times the maximum fine
- 16 authorized for the section violated.
- 17 (2) An individual who engages in conduct proscribed under
- **18** section 223(1), 224d, 226a, 227c, 227d, 231c, 232a(1) or (4), 233,
- 19 234, 234e, 234f, 235, 236, or 237, or who engages in conduct
- 20 proscribed under section 223(2) for the first time, in a weapon
- 21 free school zone is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by 1 or more
- 22 of the following:
- 23 (a) Imprisonment for not more than the maximum term of
- 24 imprisonment authorized for the section violated or 93 days,
- 25 whichever is greater.
- (b) Community service for not more than 100 hours.
- (c) A fine of not more than \$2,000.00 or the maximum fine

- 1 authorized for the section violated, whichever is greater.
- 2 (3) Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to conduct proscribed
- 3 under a section enumerated in those subsections to the extent that
- 4 the proscribed conduct is otherwise exempted or authorized under
- 5 this chapter.
- **6** (4) Except as provided in subsection (5), an individual who
- 7 possesses a weapon in a weapon free school zone is guilty of a
- 8 misdemeanor punishable by 1 or more of the following:
- **9** (a) Imprisonment for not more than 93 days.
- 10 (b) Community service for not more than 100 hours.
- 11 (c) A fine of not more than \$2,000.00.
- 12 (5) Subsection (4) does not apply to any of the following:
- 13 (a) An individual employed by or contracted by a school if the
- 14 possession of that weapon is to provide security services for the
- 15 school.
- 16 (b) A peace officer.
- 17 (c) An individual licensed by this state or another state to
- 18 carry a concealed weapon.
- 19 (C) (d)—An individual who possesses a weapon provided by a
- 20 school or a school's instructor on school property for purposes of
- 21 providing or receiving instruction in the use of that weapon.
- 22 (D) (e) An individual who possesses a firearm on school
- 23 property if that possession is with the permission of the school's
- 24 principal or an agent of the school designated by the school's
- 25 principal or the school board.
- **26 (E)** An individual who is 18 years of age or older who is
- 27 not a student at the school and who possesses a firearm on school

- 1 property while transporting a student to or from the school if any
- 2 of the following apply:
- 3 (i) The individual is carrying an antique firearm, completely
- 4 unloaded, in a wrapper or container in the trunk of a vehicle while
- 5 en route to or from a hunting or target shooting area or function
- 6 involving the exhibition, demonstration or sale of antique
- 7 firearms.
- 8 (ii) The individual is carrying a firearm unloaded in a
- 9 wrapper or container in the trunk of the person's vehicle, while in
- 10 possession of a valid Michigan hunting license or proof of valid
- 11 membership in an organization having shooting range facilities, and
- 12 while en route to or from a hunting or target shooting area.
- 13 (iii) The person INDIVIDUAL is carrying a firearm unloaded in
- 14 a wrapper or container in the trunk of the person's INDIVIDUAL'S
- 15 vehicle from the place of purchase to his or her home or place of
- 16 business or to a place of repair or back to his or her home or
- 17 place of business, or in moving goods from one place of abode or
- 18 business to another place of abode or business.
- 19 (iv) The person-INDIVIDUAL is carrying an unloaded firearm in
- 20 the passenger compartment of a vehicle that does not have a trunk,
- 21 if the person-INDIVIDUAL is otherwise complying with the
- 22 requirements of subparagraph (ii) or (iii) and the wrapper or
- 23 container is not readily accessible to the occupants of the
- 24 vehicle.
- 25 (6) As used in this section:
- 26 (a) "Antique firearm" means either of the following:
- 27 (i) A firearm not designed or redesigned for using rimfire or

- 1 conventional center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and
- 2 manufactured in or before 1898, including a matchlock, flintlock,
- 3 percussion cap, or similar type of ignition system or a replica of
- 4 such a firearm, whether actually manufactured before or after the
- **5** year 1898.
- 6 (ii) A firearm using fixed ammunition manufactured in or
- 7 before 1898, for which ammunition is no longer manufactured in the
- 8 United States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels
- 9 of commercial trade.
- 10 (b) "School" means a public, private, denominational, or
- 11 parochial school offering developmental kindergarten, kindergarten,
- 12 or any grade from 1 through 12.
- 13 (c) "School property" means a building, playing field, or
- 14 property used for school purposes to impart instruction to children
- 15 or used for functions and events sponsored by a school, except a
- 16 building used primarily for adult education or college extension
- 17 courses.
- 18 (d) "Weapon" includes, but is not limited to, a pneumatic gun.
- (e) "Weapon free school zone" means school property and a
- 20 vehicle used by a school to transport students to or from school
- 21 property.

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
