THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5516. (1) A—THE DEPARTMENT MAY HOLD A public hearing with
- 2 reference to pollution control. may be held before the department.
- 3 Persons INDIVIDUALS designated to conduct the hearing shall be
- 4 described as presiding officers and shall be disinterested and
- 5 technically qualified persons. INDIVIDUALS. IF THE HEARING CONCERNS
- 6 THE ISSUANCE OR MODIFICATION OF A PERMIT THAT WILL RESULT IN AN
- 7 INCREASE IN EMISSIONS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE THE PERSON
- 8 REQUESTING THE PERMIT OR MODIFICATION, OR HIS OR HER
- 9 REPRESENTATIVE, TO ATTEND THE HEARING AND RESPOND TO QUESTIONS FROM

10 THE PUBLIC.

- 1 (2) A copy of each permit, permit application, order, 2 compliance plan and schedule of compliance, emissions or compliance monitoring report, sample analysis, compliance certification, or 3 4 other report or information required under this part, rules 5 promulgated under this part, or permits or orders issued under this part shall be available to the public to the extent provided by the 6 freedom of information act, Act No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, 7 being sections 15.231 to 15.246 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.1976 8
- 9 PA 442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 10 (3) A person whose activities are regulated under this part 11 may designate a record or other information, or a portion of a 12 record, permit application, or other information furnished to or 13 obtained by the department or its agents, as being only for the 14 confidential use of the department. The department shall notify the person asserting confidentiality of a request for public records 15 under section 5 of the freedom of information act, Act No. 442 of 16 17 the Public Acts of 1976, being section 15.235 of the Michigan 18 Compiled Laws, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.235, the scope of which includes 19 information that has been designated by the regulated person as 20 being confidential. The person asserting confidentiality has 25 21 days after the receipt of the notice to demonstrate to the 22 department that the information designated as confidential should 23 not be disclosed because the information is a trade secret or secret process, or is production, commercial, or financial 24 25 information the disclosure of which would jeopardize the competitive position of the person from whom the information was 26

- 13 use of the information by the department in compiling or publishing
- 14 analyses or summaries relating to ambient air quality if the
- 15 analyses or summaries do not identify the person or reveal
- 16 information which THAT is otherwise confidential under this
- 17 section. This section does not render data on the quantity,
- 18 composition, or quality of emissions from any source confidential.
- 19 Data on the amount and nature of air contaminants emitted from a
- 20 source shall be available to the public.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
