HOUSE BILL No. 6171

June 12, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Chang, Sabo, Cochran, Lasinski, Guerra, Brinks, Geiss, Greig, Love, Green, Pagan, Yancey, Gay-Dagnogo, Wittenberg, Rabhi and Jones and referred to the Committee on Law and Justice.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 116, entitled

"An act to provide for the protection of children through the licensing and regulation of child care organizations; to provide for the establishment of standards of care for child care organizations; to prescribe powers and duties of certain departments of this state and adoption facilitators; to provide penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 5r (MCL 722.115r), as added by 2017 PA 256.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5r. (1) An individual required to undergo a criminal history check as described in section 5n is ineligible for that application only, to receive a license, be an adult member of the household, or be a child care staff member if the individual does either of the following:
 - (a) Refuses to consent to the criminal history check or central registry check as required under section 5q.

- 1 (b) Knowingly makes a materially false statement or knowingly
- 2 omits information in connection with a criminal history check or
- 3 central registry check as required under section 5q.
- 4 (2) An individual required to undergo a database check as
- 5 required under section 5n(1)(a) who has a confirmed history of
- 6 disciplinary action or violations as outlined in section 11(5) and
- 7 (6) may be considered ineligible to receive a license, be an adult
- 8 member of the household, or be a child care staff member.
- 9 (3) An individual required to undergo a criminal history check
- 10 as described in section 5n is ineligible to receive a license, be
- 11 an adult member of the household, or be a child care staff member
- 12 if the individual satisfies 1 or more of the following:
- 13 (a) Is registered, or is required to be registered, on a state
- 14 sex offender registry or repository or the national sex offender
- 15 registry.
- 16 (b) Has been convicted of a felony consisting of 1 or more of
- 17 the following or any other state or federal equivalent:
- 18 (i) Murder or homicide.
- 19 (ii) Child abuse or child neglect.
- 20 (iii) A crime against a minor child, including, but not
- 21 limited to, child pornography.
- 22 (iv) Spousal abuse or domestic violence.
- (v) A crime involving rape or sexual assault.
- (vi) Kidnapping.
- (vii) Arson.
- 26 (viii) Physical assault or battery.
- 27 (ix) Human trafficking or involuntary servitude.

- 1 (c) Has been convicted of a violent misdemeanor against a
- 2 child, including, but not limited to, 1 or more of the following
- 3 crimes:
- 4 (i) Child abuse.
- 5 (ii) Child endangerment.
- 6 (iii) Sexual assault.
- 7 (d) Has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving child
- 8 pornography.
- 9 (4) An individual required to undergo a criminal history check
- 10 as described in section 5n is ineligible to receive a license, be
- 11 an adult member of the household, or be a child care staff member
- 12 if the individual has been convicted of 1 or more of the following
- 13 felonies, an attempt or conspiracy to commit 1 or more of the
- 14 following felonies, or any other state or federal equivalent,
- 15 unless 10 years have lapsed since the conviction, before the date
- 16 of application or before the date a group child care home or family
- 17 child care home allows an individual to be an adult member of the
- 18 household, or a child care center, group child care home, or family
- 19 child care home allows an individual to be a child care staff
- 20 member:
- 21 (a) A felony involving harm or threatened harm to an
- 22 individual.
- 23 (b) A felony involving the use of a firearm or dangerous
- 24 weapon.
- 25 (c) A felony involving cruelty or torture of any person.
- 26 (d) A felony involving a substantial misrepresentation of any
- 27 material fact, bribery, fraud, larceny, embezzlement, theft, home

- 1 invasion, breaking and entering, receiving and concealing stolen
- 2 property or a crime of similar statute.
- 3 (e) A felony involving operating a motor vehicle while
- 4 intoxicated or impaired causing serious injury or death.
- 5 (f) A felony involving the use of a computer or the internet
- 6 to commit a crime.
- 7 (g) A felony involving cruelty to animals, including, but not
- 8 limited to, fighting, killing, torturing, and abandoning.
- 9 (h) A felony involving aggravated stalking, aggravated
- 10 indecent exposure, indecent exposure by a sexually delinquent
- 11 person, pandering, transporting an individual for prostitution,
- 12 COMMERCIAL SEX, and keeping, maintaining, or operating a house of
- 13 ill fame.
- 14 (i) A felony as a habitual offender.
- 15 (5) An individual required to undergo a criminal history check
- 16 as described in section 5n is ineligible to receive a license, be
- 17 an adult member of the household, or be a child care staff member
- 18 if the individual has been convicted of a felony drug offense, an
- 19 attempt or conspiracy to commit a felony drug offense, or any other
- 20 state or federal equivalent, unless 7 years have lapsed since the
- 21 conviction before the date of application or before the date a
- 22 group child care home or family child care home allows an
- 23 individual to be an adult member of the household or a child care
- 24 center, group child care home, or family child care home allows an
- 25 individual to be a child care staff member.
- 26 (6) An individual required to undergo a criminal history check
- 27 as described in section 5n is ineligible to receive a license, be

- 1 an adult member of the household, or be a child care staff member
- 2 if the individual has been convicted of 1 or more of the following
- 3 misdemeanors, an attempt or conspiracy to commit any of those
- 4 misdemeanors, or any other state or federal equivalent, unless 5
- 5 years have lapsed since the conviction before the date of
- 6 application or before the date a group child care home or family
- 7 child care home allows an individual to be an adult member of the
- 8 household or a child care center, group child care home, or family
- 9 child care home allows an individual to be a child care staff
- 10 member:
- 11 (a) A misdemeanor involving operating under the presence of a
- 12 controlled substance, use or possession of a controlled substance,
- 13 and selling or furnishing a controlled substance to a minor.
- 14 (b) A misdemeanor involving using computers to commit a crime,
- 15 a substantial misrepresentation of a material fact, embezzlement,
- 16 breaking and entering, and any other fraudulent crime except retail
- 17 fraud in the third degree, petty theft, or shoplifting.
- 18 (c) A misdemeanor involving stalking, assault, spousal abuse,
- 19 domestic violence, weapons offense, harboring runaways, aiding and
- 20 abetting, and arson.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
- Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 24 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 6169 (request no.
- 25 02879'17) of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.
