SENATE BILL No. 325

April 25, 2017, Introduced by Senators ANANICH, WARREN, KNEZEK, HERTEL, HOOD, HOPGOOD, GREGORY, JOHNSON, YOUNG and BIEDA and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 609, entitled "Full employment planning act of 1978," by amending section 3 (MCL 408.903), as amended by 1981 PA 131.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) Not later than November 1 , 1981 and annually
- 2 thereafter, EACH YEAR, the department of labor TALENT AND ECONOMIC
- ${f 3}$ ${f DEVELOPMENT}$ shall submit to the governor a report setting forth
- 4 projections for the immediately subsequent 5 years which THAT
- 5 includes all of the following:
 - (a) Projected trends in the levels of employment, production, and purchasing power, and a review of economic conditions affecting these economic trends.
 - (b) Projected levels and types of employment available in both

- 1 the private and public sectors.
- 2 (c) Projected levels and characteristics of the labor force in
- 3 this state.
- 4 (d) Projected levels of unemployment by type and area.
- 5 (e) The identity by race, age, sex, occupation, education,
- 6 income, and geographic location of persons in this state who will
- 7 not be provided a job opportunity or commensurate employability
- 8 service as identified in subdivision (b) and subsection (8), and
- 9 who will require income support —OR other supportive services, or
- **10** both.
- 11 (F) CURRENT AND PROJECTED LEVELS OF PAY DIFFERENTIAL FOR MEN
- 12 AND WOMEN WHO PERFORM THE SAME WORK.
- (G) (f) Full supporting social and economic data upon which
- 14 mandatory statements required by subdivisions (a) to $\frac{(e)}{(F)}$ are
- 15 based, including demographics, labor force statistics and
- 16 characteristics, and additional data upon which the statements are
- 17 based. To the degree feasible, the data shall MUST include
- 18 indicators which THAT clearly depict the distribution of social and
- 19 economic benefits by race, age, sex, income, residence, and other
- 20 relevant demographic characteristics.
- 21 (H) (g)—A status report of the recommendations in the biennial
- 22 employment plan submitted by the governor in accordance with
- 23 subsection (6).
- 24 (2) On NOT LATER THAN November 1 , 1981, and on OF every even
- 25 numbered year, thereafter, the department of labor TALENT AND
- 26 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT shall submit to the governor an employment
- 27 plan setting forth recommendations by priority for all of the

- 2 (a) Increasing the number of unsubsidized employment
- 3 opportunities.
- 4 (b) Increasing the employability of the unskilled, low-
- 5 skilled, and obsoletely skilled members of the labor force.
- 6 (c) Creating subsidized job opportunities that will provide
- 7 labor for the production of essential goods or services.
- 8 (d) Increasing the effectiveness of the public education
- 9 system in equipping youth with skills, attitudes, and experiences
- 10 necessary for a successful transition to the labor force.
- 11 (e) Legislation THAT, which—if enacted, would cause the
- 12 creation of new employment opportunities or the retention of
- 13 existing employment.
- 14 (F) DECREASING THE WAGE DISPARITY BETWEEN MEN AND WOMEN WHO
- 15 PERFORM THE SAME WORK.
- 16 (3) The recommendations referred to in subsection (2) which
- 17 THAT require the AN appropriation of funds shall MUST be supported
- 18 by a concise statement of resource requirements. Other
- 19 recommendations shall MUST be supported by sufficient explanation
- 20 to enable the legislature to clearly understand the course of
- 21 action to be taken and the agency which THAT has been, or will be,
- 22 charged by the governor to carry out the proposed action.
- 23 (4) The department of labor TALENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
- 24 and the department of social HEALTH AND HUMAN services shall
- 25 include, as a part of the initial submission of the employment plan
- 26 to the governor, a report analyzing the relationship of income
- 27 maintenance programs and the full employment policies of this act.

- 1 (5) Not later than 10 days after the legislature convenes in
- 2 January of 1982, and annually thereafter, EACH YEAR, the governor
- 3 shall transmit to the legislature a report which meets the
- 4 requirements prescribed AS DESCRIBED in subsection (1).
- **5** (6) Not later than 10 days after the legislature convenes in
- 6 January of 1982, and in every odd numbered year, thereafter, the
- 7 governor shall transmit to the legislature a full employment plan
- 8 which meets the requirements prescribed AS DESCRIBED in subsections
- **9** (2) and (3).
- 10 (7) Each state department shall cooperate and assist the
- 11 department of labor TALENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT in the
- 12 collection and analysis of COLLECTING AND ANALYZING data , and in
- 13 advising of ON priorities and recommended courses of action to
- 14 achieve the goals and objectives set forth in the biennial
- 15 employment plan UNDER SUBSECTION (6) and the annual report required
- 16 by subsection (1).
- 17 (8) The governor shall annually submit to the legislature a
- 18 report which THAT lists with appropriate description,
- 19 quantification, and dollar value, all federal decisions which THAT
- 20 will affect employment or which will provide for the financing of
- 21 goods or services in this state.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 23 after the date it is enacted into law.
