SUMMARY:

House Bill 6495 would amend the Public Health Code to provide that all emergency medical services personnel licenses that expired in 2020 on or after March 10 are considered unexpired and do not expire until April 1, 2021.

Similarly, all professional certifications in basic life support, advanced cardiac life support, and first aid that expired in 2020 on or after March 10 would be considered unexpired and would not expire until April 1, 2021.

The bill's provisions would no longer apply 120 days after taking effect.

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 6495 may create additional costs for the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, but the costs would likely be supported by existing appropriations. The bill would not affect any other unit of state or local government.
