"An act to grant scholarships to students enrolled in postsecondary education institutions; and to provide for the administration of the scholarship program,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 390.973), as amended by 1980 PA 500.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) The Subject to subsection (4), the authority shall
- 2 conduct a competitive examination among eligible applicants for
- 3 state competitive scholarships at times and places as determined by
- 4 the authority. The authority may designate a competitive

- 1 examination to be administered among eligible applicants for state
- 2 competitive scholarships. The authority shall annually establish
- 3 the examination scores necessary to qualify for the competitive
- 4 scholarship shall be established annually by the authority
- 5 according to the funding available to meet the award levels
- 6 established pursuant to section 6.
- 7 (2) The authority may also use scholastic achievement in
- 8 determining award winners and shall issue appropriate certificates
- 9 of recognition to persons individuals awarded scholarships. The
- 10 authority shall grant annual renewal of scholarships.
- 11 (3) Rules—The authority shall promulgate rules to implement
- 12 this act pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969,
- 13 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, including rules for the conduct
- 14 of examinations for the award of scholarships, and for the

- 23 pandemic, the authority may waive the examination requirement
- 24 described in subsection (1) and rely on scholastic achievement to
- 25 determine eligibility for scholarships awarded under this act.
