HOUSE BILL NO. 4404

March 19, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Miller, LaFave, Kahle, Bellino and Sheppard and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961,"

(MCL 600.101 to 600.9947) by adding section 2979.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2979. (1) In an action for personal injury arising from the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle, the total amount of damages awarded to a plaintiff for noneconomic loss, including any damages awarded to other plaintiffs as derivative noneconomic loss, against all the defendants must not exceed \$280,000.00, unless the personal injury has resulted in 1 of the





- 1 following, in which case the total amount of damages awarded for
- 2 noneconomic loss must not exceed \$500,000.00:
- 3 (a) Hemiplegia, paraplegia, or quadriplegia, resulting in a
- 4 total permanent functional loss of 1 or more limbs caused by either
- 5 of the following:
- 6 (i) Injury to the brain.
- 7 (ii) Injury to the spinal cord.
- 8 (b) Permanently impaired cognitive capacity, rendering the
- 9 plaintiff incapable of making independent, responsible life
- 10 decisions and permanently incapable of independently performing the
- 11 activities of normal, daily living.
- 12 (c) Permanent loss of or damage to a reproductive organ,
- 13 resulting in the inability to procreate.
- 14 (2) In awarding damages in an action arising from the
- 15 ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle, the trier of
- 16 fact shall itemize damages into economic and noneconomic losses.
- 17 Neither the court nor counsel for a party shall inform the jury of
- 18 the limitations under subsection (1). The court shall adjust an
- 19 award of damages for noneconomic loss to conform to the limitations
- 20 under subsection (1).
- 21 (3) On the effective date of the amendatory act that added
- 22 this section, the state treasurer shall adjust the limitations
- 23 under subsection (1) so that they are equal to the limitations
- 24 applicable on that date under section 1483. After that date, the
- 25 state treasurer shall adjust the limitations under subsection (1)
- 26 at the end of each calendar year so that they continue to be equal
- 27 to the limitations under section 1483.
- 28 (4) As used in this section, "noneconomic loss" means damages
- 29 or loss due to pain, suffering, inconvenience, physical impairment,



- 1 or physical disfigurement, loss of society and companionship,
- 2 whether claimed under section 2922 or otherwise, loss of
- 3 consortium, or other noneconomic loss.
- 4 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 5 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 6 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 7 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. (request no.
- 8 00650'19) of the 100th Legislature is enacted into law.
