A bill to amend 2018 PA 337, entitled "Improved workforce opportunity wage act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 408.932) and by adding section 4e.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- (a) "Commissioner" means the director of the department of
 licensing labor and regulatory affairs.economic opportunity.
- 4 (b) "Employ" means to engage, suffer, or permit to work.
- 5 (c) "Employee" means an individual not less than 16 years of6 age employed by an employer on the premises of the employer or at a





- 1 fixed site designated by the employer, and includes a minor
- 2 employed subject to section 15(1) of the youth employment standards
- 3 act, 1978 PA 90, MCL 409.115.
- 4 (d) "Employer" means a person, firm, or corporation, including
- 5 this state and its political subdivisions, agencies, and
- 6 instrumentalities, and a person acting in the interest of the
- 7 employer, who employs 2 or more employees at any 1 time within a
- 8 calendar year, and includes a person acting in the interest of the
- 9 employer. An employer is subject to this act during the remainder
- 10 of that calendar year. Except as specifically provided in the
- 11 franchise agreement, as between a franchisee and franchisor, the
- 12 franchisee is considered the sole employer of workers for whom the
- 13 franchisee provides a benefit plan or pays wages.
- 14 (e) "Essential worker" means an employee whose continued
 15 employment during a state of emergency is necessary for the public
 16 health, safety, or welfare, as determined by the commissioner.
- Sec. 4e. (1) Beginning on June 15, 2020, the minimum hourly wage rate for an essential worker is \$15.00.
- 19 (2) Every January beginning in January 2021, the state
- 20 treasurer shall adjust the minimum hourly wage rate then in effect
- 21 under this section by an amount determined by the state treasurer
- 22 at the end of the immediately preceding calendar year to reflect
- 23 the average annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index
- 24 for the most recent 5-year period for which data are available. The
- 25 wage and hours division of the department of labor and economic
- 26 opportunity shall post the adjusted minimum hourly wage rate on its
- 27 website before February 2 of the year it is calculated. The
- 28 adjusted rate is effective beginning April 1 of that year.
 - (3) As used in this section, "Consumer Price Index" means the
