## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5987**

July 23, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Guerra, Hammoud, Brenda Carter, Camilleri, Cherry, Stone, Hoadley, Bolden, Brixie, Pagan, Yancey, Hope, Gay-Dagnogo and Koleszar and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 759a, 764a, and 765 (MCL 168.759a, 168.764a, and 168.765), section 759a as amended by 2012 PA 523, section 764a as amended by 2012 PA 128, and section 765 as amended by 2020 PA 95.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 759a. (1) An absent uniformed services voter or an





- 1 overseas voter who is not registered, but possessed the
- 2 qualifications of an elector under section 492, may apply for
- 3 registration by using the federal postcard application. The
- 4 department of state, bureau of elections, is responsible for
- 5 disseminating information on the procedures for registering and
- 6 voting to an absent uniformed services voter and an overseas voter.
- 7 (2) Upon the request of an absent uniformed services voter or
- 8 an overseas voter, the clerk of a county, city, township, or
- 9 village shall electronically transmit a blank voter registration
- 10 application or blank absent voter ballot application to the voter.
- 11 The clerk of a county, city, township, or village shall accept a
- 12 completed voter registration application or completed absent voter
- 13 ballot application electronically transmitted by an absent
- 14 uniformed services voter or overseas voter. A voter registration
- 15 application or absent voter ballot application submitted by an
- 16 absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter shall must
- 17 contain the signature of the voter.
- 18 (3) A spouse or dependent of an overseas voter who is a
- 19 citizen of the United States, is accompanying that overseas voter,
- 20 and is not a qualified and registered elector anywhere else in the
- 21 United States, may apply for an absent voter ballot even though the
- 22 spouse or dependent is not a qualified elector of a city or
- 23 township of this state.
- 24 (4) An absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter,
- 25 whether or not registered to vote, may apply for an absent voter
- 26 ballot. Upon receipt of an application for an absent voter ballot
- 27 under this section that complies with this act, a county, city,
- 28 village, or township clerk shall forward to the applicant the
- 29 absent voter ballots requested, the forms necessary for



- registration, and instructions for completing the forms. If theballots are not yet available at the time of receipt of the
- 3 application, the clerk shall immediately forward to the applicant
- 4 the registration forms and instructions  $\tau$  and forward the ballots
- 5 as soon as they are available. If a federal postcard application or
- 6 an application from the official United States department
- 7 Department of defense Defense website is filed, the clerk shall
- 8 accept the federal postcard application or the application from the
- 9 official United States department Department of defense Defense
- 10 website as the registration application and shall not send any
- 11 additional registration forms to the applicant. If the ballots and
- 12 registration forms are received before the close of the polls on
- 13 election day and if the registration complies with the requirements
- 14 of this act, the absent voter ballots shall must be delivered to
- 15 the proper election board to be counted and tabulated. If the
- 16 absent voter ballot return envelope containing a marked absent
- 17 voter ballot is postmarked before or on election day and the absent
- 18 voter ballot is received by the city or township clerk within 48
- 19 hours after the close of the polls on election day, the city or
- 20 township clerk shall count and tabulate that absent voter ballot.
- 21 Not later than the third day after election day, each city and
- 22 township clerk shall transmit the results of the absent voter
- 23 ballots tabulated after the election to the board of county
- 24 canvassers of the county in which that city or township is located.
- 25 If the registration does not comply with the requirements of this
- 26 act, the clerk shall retain the absent voter ballots until the
- 27 expiration of the time that the voted ballots must be kept and
- 28 shall then destroy the ballots without opening the envelope. The
- 29 clerk may retain registration forms completed under this section in

a separate file. The address in this state shown on a registrationform is the residence of the registrant.

- 3 (5) Not later than 45 days before an election, a county, city,
  4 township, or village clerk shall electronically transmit or mail as
  5 appropriate an absent voter ballot to each absent uniformed
  6 services voter or overseas voter who applied for an absent voter
  7 ballot 45 days or more before the election.
- 8 (6) Upon the request of an absent uniformed services voter or 9 overseas voter, the clerk of a county, city, township, or village 10 shall electronically transmit an absent voter ballot to the voter. 11 The voter shall print the absent voter ballot and return the voted 12 ballot by mail to the appropriate clerk.
- 13 (7) The secretary of state shall prescribe electronic absent 14 voter ballot formats and electronic absent voter ballot 15 transmission methods. Each county, city, township, or village clerk shall employ the prescribed electronic ballot formats to fulfill an 16 17 absent voter ballot request received from an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter who wishes to receive his or her 18 absent voter ballot through an electronic transmission. The 19 20 secretary of state shall establish procedures to implement the requirements in this section and for the processing of a marked 21 absent voter ballot returned by an absent uniformed services voter 22 or overseas voter who obtained his or her absent voter ballot 23 24 through an electronic transmission.
  - (8) The secretary of state shall modify the printed statement provided under section 761(4) and the absent voter ballot instructions provided under section 764a as appropriate to accommodate the procedures developed for electronically transmitting an absent voter ballot to an absent uniformed services

- 2 certificate signed by the absent voter who obtained his or her

- 6 (11) An electronic mail address provided by an absent

- 9 freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 10 (12) Under the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting
- 11 act, the state director of elections shall approve a ballot form
- 12 and registration procedures for absent uniformed services voters
- 13 and overseas voters.
- 14 (13) An absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter
- 15 may use the federal write-in absentee ballot, in accordance with
- 16 the provisions of the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee
- 17 voting act, at a regular election or special election to vote for a
- 18 local, state, or federal office or on a ballot question. An absent
- 19 uniformed services voter or an overseas voter who uses the federal
- 20 write-in absentee ballot shall return his or her voted federal
- 21 write-in absentee ballot by mail to the appropriate clerk. The
- 22 state bureau of elections shall do both of the following:
- 23 (a) Make the ballot format for each election available to
- 24 absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters by electronic
- 25 mail or on an internet website maintained by the department of
- 26 state.
- 27 (b) Make the ballot information, including the offices, names
- 28 of candidates, and ballot proposals, for each election available to
- 29 absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters on an internet

2 (14) The clerk of a city, village, or township shall submit to the county clerk of the county in which that city, village, or 3 township is located a written statement no later than 45 days 4 5 before each election indicating whether absent voter ballots were 6 issued to absent uniformed services voters or overseas voters in 7 compliance with this section and the uniformed and overseas 8 citizens absentee voting act. The city, village, or township clerk 9 shall provide to the county clerk a written explanation describing 10 remedial actions taken by the city, village, or township clerk if 11 the city, village, or township clerk fails to comply with this section and the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting 12 act. Not later than 42 days before each election, each county clerk 13 shall submit to the state bureau of elections a written report 14 15 compiled from the written statements submitted by the city, village, and township clerks. The written report shall must 16 identify the cities, villages, and townships that complied with the 17 18 45-day deadline under this subsection, the cities, villages, and 19 townships that did not comply with the 45-day deadline under this 20 subsection, but provided a written explanation, and those cities, villages, and townships that did not comply with the 45-day 21 deadline under this subsection and that did not provide a written 22 23 explanation. The state bureau of elections may require the clerk of 24 a city, village, or township that did not comply with the 45-day 25 deadline under this subsection, but provided a written explanation, to provide additional information. The state bureau of elections 26 27 shall require the clerk of a city, village, or township that did not comply with the 45-day deadline and that did not provide a 28 29 written explanation to file a written explanation, describing the



- remedial actions taken by the city, village, or township clerk,
  within 1 business day after the state bureau of elections notifies
  the clerk of that city, village, or township.
- (15) For a presidential primary election, the secretary of 4 5 state shall prescribe procedures for contacting an elector who is 6 an absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter, as 7 described in this section, and who is eligible to receive an absent 8 voter ballot or who applies for an absent voter ballot for the presidential primary election, offering the elector the opportunity 9 10 to select a political party ballot for the presidential primary 11 election.
- (16) The secretary of state shall order a city, village, or 12 township clerk to extend the ballot receipt deadline for any 13 14 absentee voter ballots under this section that were not transmitted 15 to an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter in compliance with subsection (5). The extension shall must equal the 16 17 total number of days beyond the deadline as provided in subsection 18 (5) that the city, village, or township clerk transmitted the requested absentee voter ballots. These absentee voter ballots 19 20 received during the extension time shall must be counted and tabulated for the final results of the election provided that the 21 22 absentee voter ballots are executed and sent by the close of the 23 polls on election day. The election may be formally certified 24 before the end of the extension time if the number of outstanding 25 absentee voter ballots under this subsection will not alter the outcome of the election. 26
  - (17) As used in this section:
- 28 (a) "Absent uniformed services voter" means any of the 29 following:

- (i) A member of a uniformed service on active duty who, by
   reason of being on active duty, is absent from the place of
   residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote.
- 4 (ii) A member of the merchant marine who, by reason of service
  5 in the merchant marine, is absent from the place of residence where
  6 the member is otherwise qualified to vote.
- 7 (iii) A spouse or dependent of a member referred to in
  8 subparagraph (i) or (ii) who, by reason of the active duty or service
  9 of the member, is absent from the place of residence where the
  10 spouse or dependent is otherwise qualified to vote.
- (i) Employed as an officer or crew member of a vessel
  documented under the laws of the United States, a vessel owned by
  the United States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under
  charter to or control of the United States.
- 19 (ii) Enrolled with the United States for employment or training 20 for employment, or maintained by the United States for emergency 21 relief service, as an officer or crew member of a vessel documented 22 under the laws of the United States, a vessel owned by the United 23 States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under charter to or 24 control of the United States.
  - (c) "Overseas voter" means any of the following:
- (i) An absent uniformed services voter who, by reason of active
  duty or service, is absent from the United States on the date of an
  election.
- (ii) A person who resides outside of the United States and is

- 1 qualified to vote in the last place in which the person was
  2 domiciled before leaving the United States.
- 3 (iii) A person who resides outside of the United States and who,
  4 but for such residence outside of the United States, would be
  5 qualified to vote in the last place in which he or she was
  6 domiciled before leaving the United States.
  - (d) "Uniformed services" means the army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard, Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard, the commissioned corps Commissioned Corps of the public health service, Public Health Service, the commissioned corps Commissioned Corps of the national oceanic National Oceanic and atmospheric administration, Atmospheric Administration, a reserve component of a uniformed service, or the Michigan national guard National Guard as that term is defined in section 105 of the Michigan military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.

Sec. 764a. The following instructions for an absent voter shall must be included with each ballot or set of ballots furnished an absent voter:

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR ABSENT VOTERS

- Step 1. Enclosed you will find voting instructions as to the method of voting. Read these carefully and then vote the ballot.
- Step 2. After voting a ballot, place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve, if any. If a secrecy sleeve is not provided, refold the ballot to conceal your votes.
- 27 Step 3. Place the ballot or ballots in the return envelope and securely seal the envelope.
- Step 4. Sign and date the return envelope in the place



- 1 designated. Your signature must appear on the return envelope or
- 2 the ballot will not be counted. If you are disabled or otherwise
- 3 unable to mark the ballot and required assistance in voting your
- 4 absent voter ballot, have the person who assisted you complete the
- 5 section on the return envelope entitled "TO BE COMPLETED ONLY IF
- 6 VOTER IS ASSISTED IN VOTING BY ANOTHER PERSON".
- 7 Step 5. Deliver the return envelope by 1 of the following
- 8 methods:
- 9 (a) Place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and
- 10 deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal
- 11 service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common
- 12 carrier.
- 13 (b) Deliver the envelope personally to the office of the
- 14 clerk, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
- 15 (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of
- 16 the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law,
- 17 sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or
- 18 grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may mail
- 19 or deliver a ballot to the clerk for the voter.
- (d) You may request by telephone that the clerk who issued the
- 21 ballot provide assistance in returning the ballot. The clerk is
- 22 required to provide assistance if you are unable to return your
- 23 absent voter ballot as specified in (a), (b), or (c) above, if it
- 24 is before 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately preceding the election,
- 25 and if you are asking the clerk to pickup pick up the absent voter
- 26 ballot within the jurisdictional limits of the city, township, or
- 27 village in which you are registered. Your absent voter ballot will
- 28 then be picked up by the clerk or an election assistant sent by the
- 29 clerk. All persons authorized to pick up absent voter ballots are



1 required to carry credentials issued by the clerk. If using this
2 absent voter ballot return method, do not give your ballot to
3 anyone until you have checked their credentials.

marked absent voter ballot must be postmarked before or on election day and must reach the clerk or an authorized assistant of the clerk before the close of the polls on within 48 hours after the close of the polls on election day. An If the return envelope containing an absent voter ballot is postmarked after election day or is received by the clerk or assistant of the clerk after the close of the polls on more than 48 hours after the close of the polls on election day, the absent voter ballot will not be counted.

14 WARNING

All of the following actions are violations of the Michigan election law and are illegal in this state:

- 18 (1) To vote an absent voter ballot at a meeting or gathering19 at which other people are voting absent voter ballots.
  - (2) For a person who is assisting an absent voter in marking the ballot to suggest or in any manner attempt to influence the absent voter on how he or she should vote.
  - (3) For a person who is present and knows that a person is voting an absent voter ballot to suggest or in any manner attempt to influence the absent voter on how he or she should vote.
  - (4) For a person other than those listed in these instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or solicit to return an absent voter ballot to the clerk.
- 29 (5) For a person other than the absent voter; a person listed



1 in these instructions; or a person whose job it is to handle mail

2 before, during, or after being transported by a public postal

3 service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common

4 carrier, but only during the normal course of his or her employment

5 to be in possession of a voted or unvoted absent voter ballot.

Sec. 765. (1) A clerk who receives an absent voter ballot return envelope containing the marked ballots of an absent voter shall not open that envelope before delivering the envelope to the board of election inspectors as provided in this section. The city or township clerk shall safely keep in his or her office until election day any absent voter ballot return envelopes received by the clerk before election day containing the marked ballots of an absent voter.

- (2) Before the opening of the polls on election day or as soon after the opening of the polls as possible, the clerk shall deliver the absent voter ballot return envelopes to the chairperson or other member of the board of election inspectors in the absent voter's precinct, together with the signed absent voter ballot applications received by the clerk from any voters of that precinct and the clerk's list or record kept relative to those absent voters. However, if higher numbered ballots are used under section 717, the clerk shall retain the applications and lists in his or her office and shall keep the applications and lists open to public inspection at all reasonable hours. Absent voter ballots must not be tabulated before the opening of the polls on election day.
- (3) The city or township clerk, or authorized designee of the clerk, shall call for and receive absent voter ballots from the post office at which the city or township clerk regularly receives mail addressed to the city or township clerk on election day. Any

1 envelopes containing absent voter ballots that are received from

2 the post office or from voters who voted by absentee ballot in

3 person in the clerk's office on election day must be delivered to

4 the board of election inspectors or, except as otherwise provided

5 in section 764d, the absent voter counting boards to be tabulated.

- (4) If the absent voter ballot return envelope containing a marked absent voter ballot is postmarked before or on election day and the absent voter ballot is received by the city or township clerk within 48 hours after the close of the polls on election day, the city or township clerk shall count and tabulate that absent voter ballot. Not later than the third day after election day, each city and township clerk shall transmit the results of the absent voter ballots tabulated after the election to the board of county canvassers of the county in which that city or township is located. If the absent voter ballot return envelope containing a marked absent voter ballot is postmarked after election day or is received by the clerk more than 48 hours after the close of the polls on election day, the clerk shall plainly mark the return envelope with the time and date of receipt and shall file the return envelope in his or her office.
- (5) On or before 8 a.m. on election day, the clerk shall post in the clerk's office or otherwise make public the number of absent voter ballots the clerk distributed to absent voters and the number of absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots of absent voters received by the clerk before election day and to be delivered to the board of election inspectors or the absent voter counting boards under this act. On or before 9 p.m. on election day, the clerk shall post in the clerk's office or otherwise make public the number of absent voter ballot return

envelopes containing the marked ballots of absent voters received 1 2 by the clerk on election day and delivered to the board of election 3 inspectors, under subsection (3), along with the total number of absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots 4 5 of absent voters received by the clerk both before and on election 6 day and delivered to the board of election inspectors or the absent 7 voter counting boards under this act. As soon as possible after all 8 precincts in the city or township are processed, the clerk shall 9 post in the clerk's office or otherwise make public the number of 10 absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots 11 of absent voters received by the election inspectors at the precincts on election day, along with the total number of absent 12 voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots of 13 14 absent voters received in the city or township for that election. 15 This subsection applies only to elections in which a federal or 16 state office appears on the ballot.
