A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," (MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding section 5316a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 5316a. (1) The department shall update the nonpoint

- 10 (2) Actions that a local government, property assessment
- 11 program participant, or other eligible borrower can take under the
- 12 water pollution source categories created under subsection (1)
- 13 include, but are not limited to, reducing the demand for fossil
- 14 fuels in electric power generation, improving commercial,
- 15 industrial, and residential buildings, expanding advanced vehicle
- 16 infrastructure and deployment, and increasing the use of renewable
- 17 energy.
- 18 (3) The department shall develop both of the following:
- 19 (a) An application and application process for the nonpoint
- 20 source management program to allow a local government, property
- 21 assessment program participant, or other eligible borrower to seek
- 22 financial assistance from the state water pollution control
- 23 revolving fund established under section 16a of the shared credit
- 24 rating act, 1985 PA 227, MCL 141.1066a, or the state drinking water
- 25 revolving fund established under section 16b of the shared credit
- 26 rating act, 1985 PA 227, MCL 141.1066b.
- 27 (b) A principal forgiveness or forbearance program that a
- 28 local government, property assessment program participant, or other
- 29 eligible borrower can access under certain circumstances.



1 (4) As used in this section:

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- 2 (a) "Atmospheric deposition" means the transfer of atmospheric 3 pollutants, including particulate matter, gas, and dust, generated 4 by activities such as electric power generation and transportation, 5 from the air to terrestrial and aquatic surfaces.
 - (b) "Eligible borrower" means a person eligible to receive financial assistance as determined under section 319 of the federal water pollution control act, 33 USC 1329.
 - (c) "Property assessment program participant" means a residential property owner who upgrades his or her property through a property assessment program supported by the state water pollution control revolving fund established under section 16a of the shared credit rating act, 1985 PA 227, MCL 141.1066a, or the state drinking water revolving fund established under section 16b of the shared credit rating act, 1985 PA 227, MCL 141.1066b.
- (d) "Urban runoff" means stormwater runoff from urban areas that can contain contaminants including sediment, pathogens, petroleum, and mercury.
