A bill to amend 2018 PA 338, entitled "Paid medical leave act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 408.962), as amended by 2018 PA 369.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. (1) As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Benefit year" means any consecutive 12-month period used
- 3 by an employer to calculate an eligible employee's benefits.
- **4** (b) "Department" means the department of licensing and
- 5 regulatory affairs.labor and economic opportunity.
- 6 (c) "Director" means the director of the department or the





- 1 director's designee.
- 2 (d) "Domestic violence" means that term as defined in section
- 3 1 of 1978 PA 389, MCL 400.1501.
- 4 (e) "Eligible employee" means an individual engaged in service
- 5 to an employer in the business of the employer and from whom an
- 6 employer is required to withhold for federal income tax purposes.
- 7 Eligible Subject to subsection (2), eligible employee does not
- 8 include any of the following:
- 9 (i) An individual who is exempt from overtime requirements
- 10 under section 13(a)(1) of the fair labor standards act, 29 USC
- **11** 213 (a) (1).
- 12 (ii) An individual who is not employed by a public agency, as
- 13 that term is defined in section 3 of the fair labor standards act,
- 14 29 USC 203, and who is covered by a collective bargaining agreement
- 15 that is in effect.
- 16 (iii) An individual employed by the United States government,
- 17 another state, or a political subdivision of another state.
- 18 (iv) An individual employed by an air carrier as a flight deck
- 19 or cabin crew member that is subject to title II of the railway
- 20 labor act, 45 USC 151 to 188.
- (v) An employee as described in section 201 of the railway
- 22 labor act, 45 USC 181.
- (vi) An employee as defined in section 1 of the railroad
- 24 unemployment insurance act, 45 USC 351.
- 25 (vii) An individual whose primary work location is not in this
- 26 state.
- 27 (viii) An individual whose minimum hourly wage rate is
- 28 determined under section 4b of the improved workforce opportunity
- 29 wage act, 2018 PA 337, MCL 408.934b.

- 1 (ix) An individual described in section 29(1)(l) of the 2 Michigan employment security act, 1936 (Ex Sess) PA 1, MCL 421.29.
- 3 (x) An individual employed by an employer for 25 weeks or4 fewer in a calendar year for a job scheduled for 25 weeks or fewer.
- 5 (xi) A variable hour employee as defined in 26 CFR 54.4980H-1.
- 6 (xii) An individual who worked, on average, fewer than 25 hours
 7 per week during the immediately preceding calendar year.
- 8 (f) "Employer" means any person, firm, business, educational
 9 institution, nonprofit agency, corporation, limited liability
 10 company, government entity, or other entity that employs 50 or more
 11 individuals. Employer does not include the United States
 12 government, another state, or a political subdivision of another
 13 state.
- 14 (g) "Family member" includes all of the following:
- (i) A biological, adopted, or foster child, stepchild or legalward, or a child to whom the eligible employee stands in locoparentis.
- (ii) A biological parent, foster parent, stepparent, or
 adoptive parent or a legal guardian of an eligible employee or an
 eligible employee's spouse or an individual who stood in loco
 parentis when the eligible employee was a minor child.
- (iii) An individual to whom the eligible employee is legallymarried under the laws of any state.
- (iv) A grandparent.
- (v) A grandchild.
- **26** (*vi*) A biological, foster, or adopted sibling.
- (h) "Health care provider" means that term as defined insection 101 of the family and medical leave act, 29 USC 2611.

- (i) "Paid medical leave" means time off from work that is
 provided by an employer to an eligible employee and that can be
 used for the purposes described in section 4(1).
- 4 (j) "Sexual assault" means any act that violates section 520b,
 5 520c, 520d, 520e, or 520g of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328,
 6 MCL 750.520b, 750.520c, 750.520d, 750.520e, and 750.520g.
- 7 (2) Subsection (1) (e) (x), (xi), and (xii) does not apply during 8 a state of emergency declared under the emergency management act, 9 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to 30.421, or under 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33.
