A bill to amend 2000 PA 274, entitled "Large carnivore act,"

by amending sections 18 and 20 (MCL 287.1118 and 287.1120).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 18. (1) A law enforcement officer may return a seized
- 2 large carnivore to the owner of the large carnivore if the law
- 3 enforcement officer is satisfied that the conditions resulting in
- 4 the seizure have been corrected. If the large carnivore was seized
- 5 pursuant to process issued by a court, the law enforcement officer

- 1 shall obtain approval of the court before returning the large
 2 carnivore.
- 3 (2) Unless the large carnivore has been returned, the law
 4 enforcement officer shall, within 10 days after the large carnivore
 5 is seized, give written notice of the seizure and intent to forfeit

 - (a) The owner of the large carnivore.

- 8 (b) Any person who was injured or whose property was damaged9 by the large carnivore.
- 10 (3) The Before January 1, 2022, the notice required under 11 subsection (2) shall must be delivered in person or sent by certified mail. If Before January 1, 2022, if the name and address 12 13 of the person are not reasonably ascertainable or personal delivery 14 of the notice cannot reasonably be accomplished, the notice shall 15 must be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the 16 county in which the large carnivore was seized for 10 successive publishing days. Beginning January 1, 2022, the notice required 17 18 under subsection (2) must be provided by sending the notice by certified mail. Beginning January 1, 2022, if the name and address 19 20 of the person are not reasonably ascertainable, the notice must be 21 provided using public notice as provided in the local government public notice act.  - (4) The law enforcement officer shall immediately after seizure of the large carnivore notify the prosecuting attorney for the county in which the large carnivore was seized or, if the attorney general is actively handling a case involving or relating to the large carnivore, the attorney general, of the seizure of the

- 6 (3) If the court orders a large carnivore to be forfeited, the
- 7 order of forfeiture shall direct that each large carnivore be
- 8 transferred to a wildlife sanctuary approved by the association of
- 9 sanctuaries, American Sanctuary Association, an animal protection
- 10 shelter, or a zoo accredited by the American zoo and aquarium
- 11 association, Association of Zoos and Aquariums, where the large
- 12 carnivore will be safely and humanely cared for. However, subject
- 13 Subject to section 10, if the large carnivore killed or injured a
- 14 human or an-animal, the order of forfeiture may direct that the
- 15 large carnivore be humanely euthanized by a veterinarian. An order
- 16 of forfeiture shall also revoke any permit that may have been
- 17 issued for the large carnivore under section 4 and order payment of
- 18 costs under subsection (4). The forfeiture is a civil forfeiture.
- 19 (4) If a large carnivore is seized, the owner of the large
- 20 carnivore is liable for the costs of placement and care for the
- 21 large carnivore from the time of seizure until the time of return
- 22 or forfeiture and, if a large carnivore is ordered to be forfeited
- 23 and euthanized, for the costs of humanely euthanizing and disposing
- 24 of the large carnivore. This subsection does not apply if the large
- 25 carnivore is returned under subsection (1) or section 19.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 27 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 6440 (request no.
- 28 02449'19) of the 100th Legislature is enacted into law.
