A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled "The insurance code of 1956,"

(MCL 500.100 to 500.8302) by adding section 3406v.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3406v. (1) A health insurance policy delivered, issued
- 2 for delivery, or renewed in this state that provides pregnancy
- 3 coverage must include coverage for an outpatient in vitro
- 4 fertilization procedure if all of the following conditions are met:
- 5 (a) The fertilization or attempted fertilization of the
- 6 insured patient's oocytes is made with the sperm of only the

- 1 insured patient's spouse.
- 2 (b) The insured patient and the insured patient's spouse have
- 3 a history of infertility of at least 5 continuous years' duration
- 4 or the infertility is associated with any of the following:
- 5 (i) Endometriosis.
- 6 ( $\ddot{u}$ ) Exposure in utero to diethylstilbestrol.
- 7 (iii) Blockage of or surgical removal of 1 or both fallopian
- 8 tubes.

- (iv) Oligospermia.
- 10 (c) The insured patient has been unable to attain a successful
- 11 pregnancy through any less costly applicable infertility treatment
- 12 for which coverage is available under the health insurance policy.
- 13 (d) The in vitro fertilization procedure is performed at a
- 14 health facility that conforms to the minimum standards for programs
- 15 of in vitro fertilization adopted by the American Society for
- 16 Reproductive Medicine. As used in this subdivision, "health
- 17 facility" means that term as defined in section 2006.
- 18 (2) Coverage under subsection (1) must not be subject to any
- 19 dollar limit, copayment, deductible, or coinsurance provision that
- 20 does not apply to pregnancy coverage generally.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act applies to policies
- 22 delivered, executed, issued, amended, adjusted, or renewed in this
- 23 state, or outside of this state if covering residents of this
- 24 state, after December 31, 2022.
