## **HOUSE BILL NO. 6546**

December 18, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Yancey, LaGrand, Gay-Dagnogo, Brenda Carter and Garrett and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961,"

by amending sections 1307a and 1312 (MCL 600.1307a and 600.1312), section 1307a as amended by 2012 PA 69 and section 1312 as amended by 2005 PA 6.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1307a. (1) To qualify as a juror, a person shall must
- 2 meet all of the following criteria:
- 3 (a) Be a citizen of the United States, 18 years of age or

- 1 older, and a resident in the county for which the person is
- 2 selected, and in the case of a district court in districts of the
- 3 second and third class, be a resident of the district.
- 4 (b) Be able to communicate in the English language.
- **5** (c) Be physically and mentally able to carry out the functions
- 6 of a juror. Temporary inability shall not be considered is not a
- 7 disqualification.
- 8 (d) Not have served as a petit or grand juror in a court of
- 9 record during the preceding 12 months.
- 10 (e) Not have been convicted of a felony or, if he or she has
- 11 been convicted of a felony, have completed his or her term of
- 12 imprisonment, including any term of parole, not less than 5 years
- 13 preceding the date he or she is summoned to serve as a juror.
- 14 (2) A person more than 70 years of age may claim exemption
- 15 from jury service and shall be exempt upon making the request.
- 16 (3) A nursing mother may claim exemption from jury service for
- 17 the period during which she is nursing her child and shall must be
- 18 exempt upon making the request if she provides a letter from a
- 19 physician, a lactation consultant, or a certified nurse midwife
- 20 verifying that she is a nursing mother.
- 21 (4) For the purposes of this section and sections 1371 to
- 22 1376, a person has served as a juror if that person has been paid
- 23 for jury service.
- 24 (5) Subsection (1)(e) does not apply to a conviction that has
- 25 been expunded or set aside.
- 26 (6) (5) For purposes of As used in this section:
- 27 (a) "Certified nurse midwife" means an individual licensed as
- 28 a registered professional nurse under article 15 of the public
- 29 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838, who has been

- 4 (b) "Felony" means a violation of a penal law of this state,
- 5 another state, or the United States for which the offender, upon
- 6 conviction, may be punished by death or by imprisonment for more
- 7 than 1 year or an offense expressly designated by law to be a
- 8 felony.
- 9 (c) "Lactation consultant" means a lactation consultant
- 10 certified by the international board of lactation consultant
- 11 examiners.
- 12 (d) "Physician" means an individual licensed by the state to
- 13 engage in the practice of medicine or osteopathic medicine and
- 14 surgery under article 15 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- **15** MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- Sec. 1312. The board shall apply the key number uniformly to
- 17 the names on the list received pursuant to section 1310 and compile
- 18 a list or card index, to be known as the first jury list, which
- 19 shall must include every name and only those names as the
- 20 application of the key number has designated. The board shall do
- 21 this as follows:
- 22 (a) Select by a random method a starting number between 0 and
- 23 the key number.
- 24 (b) Count down the list the number of names to reach the
- 25 starting number. That name shall must be placed on the first jury
- 26 list.
- (c) Continue from that name counting down the list, beginning
- 28 to count again with the number 1, until the key number is reached.
- 29 That name shall must be placed on the first jury list.

- (d) Repeat the process provided in subdivision (c) until the
   whole list has been counted and the names placed on the first jury
   list.
- (e) The board shall then remove from the first jury list the
  name of any person who its records show served, pursuant to the
  provisions of this chapter, as a petit or grand juror in any court
  of record in the county at any time in the preceding 1 year.
- 8 (f) The board, with the approval of the chief circuit judge,
  9 may remove from the first jury list the name of any person who has
  10 been convicted of a felony and is therefore disqualified from
  11 serving as a juror pursuant to under section 1307a(1)(e).
