

# SENATE BILL NO. 774

February 04, 2020, Introduced by Senators HOLLIER, CHANG, WOJNO, ALEXANDER, BAYER, GEISS, BULLOCK, MCMORROW and JOHNSON and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled  
"The revised school code,"  
(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding sections 1526b and 1526c.

## **THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

**1        Sec. 1526b. (1) The board of a school district or intermediate**  
**2        school district or the board of directors of a public school**

1 academy shall biannually provide at least 4 hours of professional  
2 development concerning the recognition, prevention, and reporting  
3 of human trafficking to each teacher who is employed by the school  
4 district, intermediate school district, or public school academy.

5 (2) The professional development required under subsection (1)  
6 must include recommendations by the human trafficking commission  
7 for minimum standards for training on the recognition, prevention,  
8 and reporting of human trafficking. The human trafficking  
9 commission shall provide recommendations for minimum standards for  
10 training as described under this subsection to school districts,  
11 intermediate school districts, and public school academies.

12 (3) Professional development provided under this section may  
13 be counted toward the professional development required under  
14 section 1527.

15 (4) As used in this section:

16 (a) "Human trafficking" means a violation under chapter LXVIIA  
17 of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.462a to 750.462h.

18 (b) "Human trafficking commission" means the human trafficking  
19 commission established under section 3 of the human trafficking  
20 commission act, 2014 PA 325, MCL 752.973.

21 Sec. 1526c. (1) The board of a school district or intermediate  
22 school district or the board of directors of a public school  
23 academy shall biannually provide at least 4 hours of professional  
24 development concerning the recognition, prevention, and reporting  
25 of human trafficking to each individual who is qualified to act in  
26 a counseling role under section 1233 or 1233a and who is employed  
27 by the school district, intermediate school district, or public  
28 school academy.

29 (2) The professional development required under subsection (1)

1 must include recommendations by the human trafficking commission  
2 for minimum standards for training on the recognition, prevention,  
3 and reporting of human trafficking. The human trafficking  
4 commission shall provide recommendations for minimum standards for  
5 training as described under this subsection to school districts,  
6 intermediate school districts, and public school academies.

7 (3) As used in this section:

8 (a) "Human trafficking" means a violation under chapter LXVIIA  
9 of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.462a to 750.462h.

10 (b) "Human trafficking commission" means the human trafficking  
11 commission established under section 3 of the human trafficking  
12 commission act, 2014 PA 325, MCL 752.973.

13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect  
14 unless Senate Bill No. 772 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into  
15 law.
