

SENATE BILL NO. 775

February 04, 2020, Introduced by Senators MOSS, WOJNO, SANTANA, BULLOCK, POLEHANKI, MACDONALD, MCMORROW, BAYER, GEISS, CHANG, JOHNSON, VANDERWALL and BRINKS and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 2014 PA 325, entitled
"Human trafficking commission act,"
by amending section 4 (MCL 752.974).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 4. The commission shall do all of the following subject
2 to funding:

3 (a) Identify sources for grants that will assist in examining
4 and countering human trafficking in this state, and apply for those

1 grants when appropriate.

2 (b) Fund research programs to determine the extent and nature
3 of human trafficking in this state.

4 (c) Provide information and training regarding human
5 trafficking to police officers, prosecutors, court personnel,
6 health care providers, social services personnel, **owners,**
7 **operators, and employees engaged in the hospitality and lodging**
8 **industry,** and other individuals the commission considers
9 appropriate.

10 (d) Collect and analyze information regarding human
11 trafficking in this state.

12 (e) Identify state and local agencies within this state and
13 other states, as well as within the federal government, that are
14 involved with issues relating to human trafficking, and coordinate
15 the dissemination of information regarding human trafficking in
16 this state to those agencies.

17 (f) Review the existing services available to assist victims
18 of human trafficking, including crime victim assistance, health
19 care, and legal assistance, and establish a program to make those
20 victims better aware of the services that are available to them.

21 (g) Establish a program to improve public awareness of human
22 trafficking.

23 (h) Review existing state laws and administrative rules
24 relating to human trafficking and make recommendations to the
25 legislature to improve those laws and rules to address human
26 trafficking violations in this state.

27 (i) File an annual report with the governor, the secretary of
28 the senate, and the clerk of the house of representatives regarding
29 its activities under this act. The report shall be filed not later

1 than February 1 of the year following the year for which the report
2 is due.

3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
4 after the date it is enacted into law.

5 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
6 unless Senate Bill No. 776 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into
7 law.
