THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 2 (a) "Authority" means a promise zone authority created under

- **4** (b) "Board" means the governing body of an authority.
- 5 (c) "Eligible entity" means a city, township, county, local

- (h) "Promise of financial assistance" means a commitment by an

- 23 eligible students living in a promise zone and who have graduated
- 24 from a public high school or nonpublic high school located within

- 26 (i) "Promise zone" means that area created by a governing body

- 7 (m) "Qualified educational expenses" means tuition and fees
 8 required for the enrollment or attendance of a student at an
 9 educational institution and expenses for fees, books, supplies, and
 10 equipment required for courses of instruction at that educational
 11 institution. Qualified educational expenses also include expenses
 12 for on-campus room and board if provided for in an authority's
 13 promise zone development plan.
- 14 (n) "School district" means that term as defined in the 15 revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.
- 16 (o) "State education tax" means the tax levied under the state
 17 education tax act, 1993 PA 331, MCL 211.901 to 211.906.
