- 1 A resolution to declare June 2019 as Alzheimer's Awareness
- 2 Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Alzheimer's disease, a progressive neurodegenerative
- 4 brain disorder, tragically robs individuals of their memories and
- 5 leads to progressive mental and physical impairments; and
- 6 Whereas, There are no known treatments to prevent, cure, or
- 7 even delay the onset or slow the progression of Alzheimer's
- 8 disease; and

- Whereas, An estimated 5.6 million people aged 65 and over have 1 Alzheimer's disease and another 200,000 people under age 65 have 2 vounger-onset Alzheimer's disease; and 3 4 Whereas, In Michigan, there are an estimated 190,000 people 5 aged 65 and over currently living with Alzheimer's; and 6 Whereas, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of 7 death in the United States and the fifth leading cause among the 8 elderly; and 9 Whereas, According to the Alzheimer's Association's Facts and Figures report, the direct costs of caring for those with 10 11 Alzheimer's to American society is valued at \$290 billion and more than 16 million caregivers provided over 18 billion hours of unpaid 12 care for those with Alzheimer's and other dementias in 2018. In 13 14 Michigan, 517,000 family members and friends cared for people with 15 Alzheimer's and other dementias, providing 589 million hours of unpaid care, with the annual value of this caregiving totaling 16 \$7,444,000,000; and 17 18 Whereas, The state of Michigan recognizes the efforts of the Alzheimer's Association to raise funds and promote awareness to 19 20 fight Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, thereby improving 21 the quality of human life for those living with Alzheimer's disease and their caregivers; and 22 23 Whereas, The month of June 2019 has been declared Alzheimer's 24 Month to help spread awareness and educate the public on this 25 debilitating disease and the need to increase efforts to combat its 26 human and economic costs; now, therefore, be it
- 27 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 28 this legislative body declare June 2019 as Alzheimer's Awareness 29 Month in the state of Michigan. We recognize the individuals,

- 1 families, friends, and caregivers dealing with Alzheimer's disease
- 2 and the researchers who are seeking a cause or cure, and urge all
- 3 residents to wear purple to help spread awareness of the
- 4 Alzheimer's Association's vision of imagining a world without
- 5 Alzheimer's disease.
