HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.253

Reps. Manoogian, Frederick, Brixie, Clemente, Crawford, Garza, Greig, Haadsma, Hood, Kuppa, Liberati, Love, Sabo, Schroeder, Shannon, Sneller, Stone and Witwer offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare April 24, 2020, as a Day of
- 2 Remembrance in the state of Michigan for the Armenian Genocide of
- **3** 1915-1923.
- 4 Whereas, The state of Michigan recognizes that the Armenian
- 5 Genocide occurred from 1915 to 1923. Armenians, as well as Greeks,
- 6 Assyrian-Chaldeans, Syriacs, Arameans, Maronites, and other
- 7 Christians were subject to torture, starvation, mass murder, lethal
- 8 human medical experimentation, and exile from their historic
- 9 homeland. Over 1.5 million lost their lives. The Armenian Genocide
- 10 represented a deliberate attempt by the Ottoman Empire to eliminate



- 1 all traces of an ancient, thriving, and noble civilization that had
- 2 lived in these regions for millennia; and
- 3 Whereas, The majority of the Armenian population was displaced
- 4 from their homes and forced to escape to neighboring and faraway
- 5 communities and countries. Many refugees fled to the United States.
- 6 Today, Michigan is honored to be home to a vibrant Armenian-
- 7 American population of more than 17,000 Michiganders. This thriving
- 8 community is a proud reminder of survival and perseverance in the
- 9 face of extreme injustice; and
- 10 Whereas, the state of Michigan and its citizens played a vital
- 11 role in relief efforts to assist those persecuted by the Ottoman
- 12 Empire. As staunch supporters of the Near East Relief campaign,
- 13 Michiganders from all walks of life donated 100 tons of relief
- 14 supplies to Armenian refugees, collected on "Bundle Day" in 1923.
- 15 Michigan women also established collection drives for foodstuffs
- 16 packages through the "Say It with Flour" campaign; and
- 17 Whereas, Michigan Armenian churches and community
- 18 organizations have organized numerous charity and community drives
- 19 across the state, including, but not limited to, providing college
- 20 scholarships for deserving students and serving Armenian refugee
- 21 communities across the state; and
- 22 Whereas, Both houses of the 116th Congress of the United
- 23 States recently voted to commemorate and recognize the atrocities
- 24 of the Armenian Genocide, reject efforts to associate the United
- 25 States government with efforts to deny the existence of the
- 26 Armenian Genocide or any genocide, and encourage education and
- 27 public understanding about the Armenian Genocide; and
- 28 Whereas, By recognizing and consistently remembering the
- 29 Armenian Genocide, the Holocaust and all cases of past and ongoing

- 1 genocide, we help protect historic memory, ensure that similar
- 2 atrocities do not occur again, and remain vigilant against hatred,
- 3 persecution and tyranny. The Armenian community of Michigan has
- 4 used its deep understanding of historic pain and dispersal to
- 5 constantly and consistently stand alongside other persecuted
- 6 communities in Michigan and around the world; and Whereas, Armenian
- 7 communities around the world commemorate this tragedy on April 24,
- 8 2020. On this day, we honor the victims and survivors of the
- 9 Genocide and reaffirm our commitment to preventing future
- 10 atrocities from being committed against any people; now, therefore,
- **11** be it
- 12 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 13 this legislative body declare April 24, 2020, as a Day of
- 14 Remembrance in the state of Michigan for the Armenian Genocide of
- **15** 1915-1923.
