

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 258

Reps. LaFave, Allor, Bollin, Brixie, Calley, Cherry, Haadsma, Hoadley, Hood, Liberati, Sabo, Schroeder, Shannon, Slagh, Sneller, Tate, Warren, Witwer and Yaroch offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to declare May 10-16, 2020, as Police Week in the
2 state of Michigan.

3 Whereas, In 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May 15
4 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week in
5 which May 15th falls as National Police Week. Established by a
6 joint resolution of Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays
7 special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost
8 their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of
9 others; and

10 Whereas, There are more than 800,000 law enforcement officers
11 serving in communities across the United States, including the



1 approximately 19,000 full-time uniformed police officers in
2 Michigan, serving 583 agencies; and

3 Whereas, Members of law enforcement deserve the appreciation
4 and respect of the people of Michigan for the merit, dignity,
5 bravery, and reliability they exhibit each and every day. We must
6 also honor the sacrifices made by families of police officers, as
7 each day they must face constant fear as their loved one works to
8 protect us; and

9 Whereas, In 2019 alone, 133 law enforcement officers were
10 killed and many, many more assaulted in the line of duty across the
11 country. The names of these dedicated public servants who made the
12 ultimate sacrifice are engraved on the walls of the National Law
13 Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.; and

14 Whereas, Michigan's fallen officers will never be forgotten,
15 nor will their service to their respective communities. By choosing
16 to commit themselves to law enforcement, these brave individuals
17 answered the call for service and willingly put their lives in
18 jeopardy. We commend them for recognizing service as a noble
19 career, protecting the public safety; and all of those who are
20 serving without incident to date; and

21 Whereas, Michigan and all Michigan citizens have turned to
22 members of law enforcement for assistance and support in times of
23 distress, whether they are coping with a personal crisis, or
24 struggling through civil disorder or a natural disaster. Our
25 communities rely on these courageous individuals when it is
26 difficult to stand on our own and we are indebted to the unwavering
27 public service of our local and state police. We are indeed
28 fortunate and grateful for the contributions of law enforcement
29 officers to the people of this state; and

1 Whereas, Law enforcement officers signed up for a hazardous
2 and naturally dangerous job. With this current COVID-19 pandemic,
3 law enforcement officers are dealing with especially challenging
4 circumstances and are dealing with the potential of exposing their
5 families every day when they come home. To protect their families
6 and loved ones, there are law enforcement officers across Michigan
7 living separate from their families in hotels, tents, garages, and
8 other temporary living arrangements to help protect their families.
9 These actions demonstrate the commitment that law enforcement
10 personnel have to our communities and the state of Michigan; now,
11 therefore, be it

12 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
13 this legislative body declare May 10-16, 2020, as Police Week in
14 the state of Michigan. We publicly salute the service of law
15 enforcement officers in our community as well as those of our state
16 and nation and honor police who place their lives on the line for
17 the safety and security of their communities.
