SENATE RESOLUTION NO.75

Senators McCann, Wojno, Brinks, Moss, Santana, Bullock, Chang, Geiss, Polehanki and Hollier, Bayer, Johnson and McMorrow offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize September 22-29, 2019, as Michigan 2 Trails Week.
- 3 Whereas, Michigan's wealth of trails provides an abundance of
- 4 opportunities for residents and visitors to enjoy our state's
- 5 spectacular natural resources. Michigan is known as The Trails
- 6 State because of the more than 12,500 miles of designated land
- 7 trails and 4,280 miles of locally-designated water trails; and
- 8 Whereas, The state's trail system is the result of a
- 9 successful partnership between state agencies, local trails groups,
- 10 local units of government, and non-profit organizations and

businesses all over the state coming together to connect 1 communities and people; and 2 Whereas, Our trail systems are designed to accommodate both 3 motorized and nonmotorized activities in appropriate areas to allow 4 5 for a variety of uses and, through a carefully-designed master 6 plan, will continue to reflect emerging trail needs in the state 7 while also striving to meet the number one recreational need of 8 citizens for more miles of trails at the local level; and 9 Whereas, Destination trails continue to be an emerging need to 10 attract both residents and out-of-state visitors; and 11 Whereas, Route 1 of the Great Lake to Lake Trails will be the state's first fully-marked destination trail stretching from South 12 Haven to Port Huron. When ultimately completed, The Iron Belle 13 14 Trail, stretching from Belle Isle in Detroit to Ironwood in the 15 western Upper Peninsula, will also be a destination trail and one 16 of the longest such trails in the nation; and 17 Whereas, The state's trails and trail towns are prominently featured in the new Pure Michigan Trail Designation program that 18 19 will be helpful in promoting the state's specially-designated 20 trails. Our state's trail system plays a significant role in 21 strengthening Michigan's economy and supporting thousands of jobs, 22 primarily through small-business owners; and 23 Whereas, The state's trail system provides residents with broad access to a low-cost, accessible, and enjoyable way to 24 25 improve health and reduce obesity; and

Whereas, Trail-related activities, including hiking, walking, snowmobiling, running, biking, horseback riding, cross-country skiing, paddling and using off-road vehicles, are among the most popular and growing means of outdoor enjoyment; and

Whereas, The state of Michigan hosts more than 5,000 miles of 1 hiking trails designed for walkers, hikers, trail runners, and 2 other outdoor enthusiasts to explore the state's natural areas, 3 including 1,200 miles of the nation's longest National Scenic 4 5 Trail, the North Country National Scenic Trail; and 6 Whereas, Michigan is also known as one of the top states for 7 mountain biking, with an unmatched diversity of trail systems and over 1,600 miles of natural surface trails. Many people already 8 9 refer to Michigan as the mountain biking capital of the Midwest; 10 and 11 Whereas, The Department of Natural Resources, working in conjunction with the Michigan Trails and Greenways Alliance, has 12 established a new water trail designation process that resulted in 13 14 eight new water trail designations this past year, will continue to 15 designate new inland water trails in the future; and Whereas, The existence of quality trails helps to strengthen 16 the appeal of communities by boosting quality-of-life amenities 17 18 that attract businesses and increase property values. Trails provide alternative, scenic transportation routes that help to 19 20 decrease road congestion and pollution and serve to connect communities to each other; now, therefore, be it 21 22 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative 23 body recognize September 22-29, 2019, as Michigan Trails Week; and 24 be it further 25 Resolved, That Michigan's rich network of trails throughout the Upper and Lower peninsulas continue to provide residents and 26 27 visitors with scenic spaces to explore nature, appreciate wildlife,

experience solitude, or enjoy time with family and friends.
