

SENATE RESOLUTION NO.101

Senators Geiss, McCann, Brinks, Alexander, Bullock, Wojno, Lucido, McMorrow, Zorn, Polehanki, McBroom, Chang, Moss, Bayer, Irwin Hollier, Santana and Lieutenant Governor Gilchrist offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to recognize February 2020 as Black History
2 Month.

3 Whereas, The origins of Black History Month began in 1915
4 after the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution
5 abolished slavery in the United States. Since 1976, every U.S.
6 President has adopted the month of February as Black History Month,
7 an annual celebration of African-American achievements and roles in
8 our history; and

9 Whereas, As a result of the Civil Rights Movement and a

1 growing awareness of black identity, Black History Month is a time
2 to reflect on the burdens of racial prejudice and explore,
3 understand, and appreciate the identities and cultures across and
4 within the African diaspora; and

5 Whereas, We pay tribute to Dr. Carter G. Woodson who organized
6 a national Negro History Week as an initiative to bring national
7 attention to the contributions of black people throughout American
8 history, evolving into a month-long celebration of black progress
9 and power; and

10 Whereas, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black
11 History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to "seize the
12 opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of
13 black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history";
14 and

15 Whereas, Michigan recognizes the injustices that African-
16 Americans have endured and commends the African-American community
17 for the continuous pursuit of overcoming those injustices while
18 changing the course and nature of history. We honor the prominent
19 leaders and activists who have paved the way for equality and
20 justice; now, therefore, be it

21 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
22 body recognize February 2020 as Black History Month; and be it
23 further

24 Resolved, That we honor the contributions and sacrifices made
25 toward building pride in black history and educating all Americans;
26 and be it further

27 Resolved, That we join other organizations throughout the
28 state of Michigan and this country to use this occasion to raise
29 awareness about the hardships African-Americans have endured,
