## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.64

Rep. Pohutsky offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare April 2019 as Sexual Assault Awareness
- 2 Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the
- 4 fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts women,
- 5 children, and men of all racial, cultural, and economic
- 6 backgrounds; and
- 7 Whereas, The term sexual assault refers to sexual contact or
- 8 behavior that occurs without explicit consent of the victim; and
- 9 Whereas, According to the National Institute of Justice &
- 10 Centers for Disease Control & Prevention's Prevalence, Incidence
- 11 and Consequences of Violence Against Women Survey, one out of every
- 12 six American women has been the victim of an attempted or completed
- 13 rape in her lifetime and approximately 3 percent of American men or

- 1 in 33, have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their
- 2 lifetime; and
- 3 Whereas, Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to
- 4 confront the reality. From 2009-2013, Child Protective Services
- 5 agencies substantiated, or found strong evidence to indicate that,
- 6 63,000 children a year were victims of sexual abuse and a majority
- 7 of child victims are ages 12-17. Of victims under the age of 18, 34
- 8 percent of victims of sexual assault and rape are under the age of
- 9 12 and 66 percent of victims of sexual assault and rape are ages
- **10** 12-17; and
- 11 Whereas, Michigan State Police statistics indicate that 11,873
- 12 sexual assault related offences were reported to law enforcement in
- **13** 2013; and
- 14 Whereas, Sexual violence can deeply and enduringly impact
- 15 survivors on psychological, emotional, and social levels. Ninety-
- 16 four percent of women who are raped experience posttraumatic stress
- 17 disorder (PTSD) symptoms during the two weeks following the rape
- 18 and approximately 70 percent of rape or sexual assault victims
- 19 experience moderate to severe distress, a larger percentage than
- 20 for any other violent crime studied in the National Crime
- 21 Victimization Survey by the Bureau of Justice Statistics. Access to
- 22 informed and supportive services can greatly increase survivors'
- 23 ability to heal from sexual assault; and
- 24 Whereas, Sexual violence is an intolerable violent crime with
- 25 public health implications for every person in Michigan. Our state
- 26 and individual communities must be committed to hold sexual assault
- 27 perpetrators accountable for their heinous crimes; and
- Whereas, When we actively increase education, awareness, and
- 29 community involvement, we can help prevent sexual violence and

- 1 create a safer environment for everyone. We must work together to
- 2 educate our entire population about what can be done to prevent
- 3 sexual assault, support survivors, and ensure that survivors are
- 4 not re-victimized; now, therefore, be it
- 5 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 6 this legislative body declare April 2019 as Sexual Assault
- 7 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We strongly support the
- 8 efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every
- 9 citizen, to actively engage in public and private efforts to
- 10 prevent sexual violence and will take appropriate action and
- 11 support one another to create a safer environment for all.
