Reps. Vaupel and LaFave offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to declare May 4-11, 2019, as Tardive Dyskinesia 2 Awareness Week in the state of Michigan. 3 Whereas, Tardive Dyskinesia (TD) is a condition of involuntary muscle movements of the face, trunk, and extremities that can vary 4 in frequency and amplitude; and 5 Whereas, TD is a condition that may occur with certain 6 7 medications used to treat mental illness. TD results from treatment 8 with dopamine receptor blocking agents used for both psychiatric and non-psychiatric conditions, and can persist even after 9 continuing treatment; and 10 Whereas, Research done by The Citizens Commission on Human 11 12 Rights shows that more than 12 million Americans take

- 1 antipsychotics and that more than 500,000 of those patients may
- 2 have TD; and
- 3 Whereas, Anyone taking an antipsychotic medication may develop
- 4 TD, but people who are elderly, female, diabetic, or have a mental
- 5 illness are at a greater risk of developing TD; now, therefore, be

- 7 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 8 this legislative body declare May 4-11, 2019, as Tardive Dyskinesia
- 9 Awareness Week in the state of Michigan; and be it further
- 10 Resolved, That we acknowledge the significant interest of the
- 11 state of Michigan to increase public awareness of Tardive
- 12 Dyskinesia, a neurological disorder that is characterized by
- 13 repetitive, involuntary muscle movements and may occur as a side
- 14 effect of long-term use of antipsychotic and other medications.
