1 A resolution to urge the President of the United States to 2 nominate commissioners to fill the vacancies on the Federal 3 Election Commission.

Whereas, A strong campaign finance enforcement system is vital to democracy. The administration of campaign finance laws and regulations helps ensure transparency and accountability in our elections and government; and

Whereas, The Federal Election Commission (FEC), led by six commissioners that may not include more than three people from the same political party, is charged with administering federal

- 1 campaign finance law. With jurisdiction over the U.S. House,
- 2 Senate, and presidential elections, the FEC deals with the
- 3 disclosure of campaign funds and the enforcement of limits to
- 4 contributions and expenditures. The FEC is necessary to having
- 5 integrity, transparency, and accountability in the federal campaign
- 6 finance system; and
- 7 Whereas, Beginning September 2019, the FEC will have three
- 8 vacancies on its six-member commission, leaving the body without a
- 9 quorum to conduct much of its important business. The commission
- 10 will not be able to hold meetings, engage in rulemaking, decide
- 11 enforcement matters, and carry out other critical functions. While
- 12 the FEC will still function in some capacity, it will be
- 13 significantly limited without a quorum on its board of
- 14 commissioners; now, therefore, be it
- 15 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the
- 16 President of the United States to nominate commissioners to fill
- 17 the vacancies on the Federal Election Commission; and be it further
- 18 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 19 President of the United States.
