## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.11

Senators Victory, Outman, Barrett, Daley, McBroom, Lauwers, Stamas, McCann, Brinks, Theis, LaSata, VanderWall and Schmidt offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the
- 2 founding of the Michigan Farm Bureau.
- 3 Whereas, February 4, 2019, marks 100 years of the Michigan
- 4 Farm Bureau's presence in the state of Michigan; and
- 5 Whereas, The origins of the Michigan Farm Bureau began in 1914
- 6 when President Woodrow Wilson signed the Smith-Lever Act which
- 7 created the extension service; and
- 8 Whereas, This provided local agricultural agents from land-
- 9 grant universities through a partnership with the United States
- 10 Department of Agriculture. Before these agents could be approved,

- 1 counties had to organize into local farmers bureaus to help direct
- 2 the extension project; and
- 3 Whereas, Michigan organized a state federation of county Farm
- 4 Bureaus in 1919, following Missouri, Massachusetts, and Vermont,
- 5 who did so in 1915. The organization began when county extension
- 6 agents and farmers from 57 counties throughout Michigan met at
- 7 Michigan Agricultural College (now Michigan State University) to
- 8 officially form what was then called the Michigan State Farm
- 9 Bureau; and
- 10 Whereas, One month later, the newly formed Michigan State Farm
- 11 Bureau adopted its mission statement, which read: "Its purposes are
- 12 to unite under a definite head of all other farm organizations. The
- 13 Farm Bureau should not be considered just another farmers'
- 14 organization added to the list but as THE ONE which may assist all
- 15 others to better accomplish their purposes."; and
- 16 Whereas, In 1944 the organization dropped the word "State"
- 17 from its name to officially become the Michigan Farm Bureau; and
- 18 Whereas, Today, The Michigan Farm Bureau ensures the growth of
- 19 Michigan food and farms, such as advocating for good government
- 20 policy, developing opportunities for young farmers, providing
- 21 student scholarships and grants, supporting local food efforts,
- 22 creating food literacy programs for kids, hosting community
- 23 building events and funding efforts to protect the environment,
- 24 water quality, farmland preservation, and more; and
- 25 Whereas, The Michigan Farm Bureau is involved in numerous
- 26 annual charitable contributions and volunteerism, including
- 27 Michigan Easter Seals, Harvest for All, Future Farmers of America
- 28 (FFA), 4-H, the Michigan Livestock Expo, and the Upper Peninsula
- 29 State Fair, among many others; and

- 1 Whereas, Annually, Michigan Farm Bureau recognizes and honors
- 2 its deserving Farm Bureau members and individuals from outside the
- 3 organization for their contributions and achievements in supporting
- 4 and advancing the state's agriculture industry, including bestowing
- 5 the Young Farmer Achievement Award, the Young Farmer Agricultural
- 6 Employee Award, the Educator of the Year Award, and the
- 7 Distinguished Service to Agriculture Award, among others; now,
- 8 therefore, be it
- 9 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 10 body commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the founding of the
- 11 Michigan Farm Bureau; and be it further
- 12 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 13 Michigan Farm Bureau as evidence of our esteem for being Michigan's
- 14 voice for agriculture over the last century.
