Senator Ananich offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to commemorate April 28, 2019, as Workers' 2 Memorial Day. 3 Whereas, Every year on April 28, in cities, towns, at 4 worksites, and memorials in communities around the world, we gather to honor friends, family members, and colleagues who have been 5 6 killed or injured on the job; and 7 Whereas, More than 579,000 workers' lives have been saved 8 since the passage of the Occupational Safety and Health Act in 9 1970, but many workers remain in serious danger; and Whereas, The Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that 10 5,190 fatal work injuries were recorded in the United States in 11 2016 and an estimated 50,000-60,000 died from occupational 12

- 2 Whereas, In 2017, 153 workers were lost through fatal
- 3 workplace accidents in Michigan and 93,900 injuries and illnesses
- 4 were reported in Michigan; and
- 5 Whereas, It is appropriate to honor the memory of the
- 6 courageous and dedicated members of Michigan's labor force who have
- 7 been injured, disabled, or have died as a result of workplace
- 8 accidents; and
- 9 Whereas, We remember those who have died in workplace
- 10 catastrophes, suffered occupation-related diseases, or have been
- 11 injured due to dangerous conditions; and
- 12 Whereas, Recognition of the integrity of Michigan's work force
- 13 and its achievements on behalf of the economic growth of our state
- 14 is necessary; and
- 15 Whereas, The Senate wishes to pay tribute to the workers who
- 16 have died, been injured, or disabled in workplace accidents; now,
- 17 therefore, be it
- 18 Resolved by the Senate, That members of this legislative body
- 19 commemorate April 28, 2019, as Workers' Memorial Day; and be it
- 20 further
- 21 Resolved, That we honor the contributions of Michigan's work
- 22 force and call for increased workplace safety in our state.
