## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 101

Senators Geiss, McCann, Brinks, Alexander, Bullock, Wojno, Lucido, McMorrow, Zorn, Polehanki, McBroom, Chang, Moss, Bayer, Irwin and Hollier offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize February 2020 as Black History
- 2 Month.
- 3 Whereas, The origins of Black History Month began in 1915
- 4 after the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution
- 5 abolished slavery in the United States. Since 1976, every U.S.
- 6 President has adopted the month of February as Black History Month,
- 7 an annual celebration of African-American achievements and roles in
- 8 our history; and
- 9 Whereas, As a result of the Civil Rights Movement and a
- 10 growing awareness of black identity, Black History Month is a time

- 1 to reflect on the burdens of racial prejudice and explore,
- 2 understand, and appreciate the identities and cultures across and
- 3 within the African diaspora; and
- 4 Whereas, We pay tribute to Dr. Carter G. Woodson who organized
- 5 a national Negro History Week as an initiative to bring national
- 6 attention to the contributions of black people throughout American
- 7 history, evolving into a month-long celebration of black progress
- 8 and power; and
- 9 Whereas, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black
- 10 History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to "seize the
- 11 opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of
- 12 black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history";

- 14 Whereas, Michigan recognizes the injustices that African-
- 15 Americans have endured and commends the African-American community
- 16 for the continuous pursuit of overcoming those injustices while
- 17 changing the course and nature of history. We honor the prominent
- 18 leaders and activists who have paved the way for equality and
- 19 justice; now, therefore, be it
- 20 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 21 body recognize February 2020 as Black History Month; and be it
- 22 further
- 23 Resolved, That we honor the contributions and sacrifices made
- 24 toward building pride in black history and educating all Americans;
- 25 and be it further
- 26 Resolved, That we join other organizations throughout the
- 27 state of Michigan and this country to use this occasion to raise
- 28 awareness about the hardships African-Americans have endured,
- 29 celebrate the milestones achieved, and to continue the unrelenting
