SENATE RESOLUTION NO.113

Senators Bayer, Moss, Brinks, Polehanki and Irwin offered the following resolution:

A resolution to memorialize the Congress of the United States
to fully fund affordable and consistent internet access for all
communities and households across the state of Michigan and the
entire country.

Whereas, The spread of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has
resulted in a global pandemic spreading across 213 countries,
areas, and territories, including the United States; and

Whereas, To combat the rapid dispersion of the virus, drastic

measures have been taken in Michigan, including issuing an order

for residents to stay at home. For many of us, this means taking

our daily activities — school, work, and medical care — online; and

- 2 care in everyday life, but it is even more urgently needed during
- 3 this pandemic crisis. Without affordable and consistent internet
- 4 access, individuals and families across the state are at an
- 5 educational and economic disadvantage compared to those with
- 6 access; and
- 7 Whereas, The forced closure of all Michigan school buildings
- 8 due to COVID-19 and the transition to online learning makes it
- 9 crystal clear that access to the internet is an absolute
- 10 requirement to continued education in Michigan. Yet, over 500,000
- 11 Michigan students do not currently have any internet service; and
- 12 Whereas, Under the stay-at-home order, accessing health care
- 13 in person is discouraged and possibly even detrimental to an
- 14 individual's health. Yet, lack of internet access makes it
- 15 impossible for many Michigan residents to participate in
- 16 telemedicine opportunities with their doctors. This lack of
- 17 internet access is increasing healthcare disparities in the state;

- 19 Whereas, The internet is an important and ever-increasing
- 20 source of information and has become more essential in providing a
- 21 means for Americans to connect with work, school, and health care.
- 22 Ensuring that all Americans have access to broadband services at
- 23 speeds they need to fully participate in our society is imperative;
- 24 now, therefore, be it
- 25 Resolved by the Senate, That we memorialize the Congress of
- 26 the United States to fully fund affordable and consistent internet
- 27 access for all communities and households across the state of
- 28 Michigan and the entire country; and be it further
- 29 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the

- 1 President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United
- 2 States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan
- 3 congressional delegation.
