## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.125

Senators Runestad, Lucido, Theis, Nesbitt, Bizon and VanderWall offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to denounce the Governor's policy placing COVID-

2 19 positive residents with uninfected residents in nursing homes.3 Whereas, Older adults are particularly vulnerable to COVID-19

4 and its most serious complications, including death. More than 87

5 percent of Michigan deaths from the disease have occurred among

6 Michiganders who were 60 years of age or older; and

7 Whereas, Nursing homes are high-risk environments for disease

transmission because residents live in close proximity to one

another, have underlying medical conditions, and are cared for by

 ${f 10}$  staff who care for many other residents; and

11 Whereas, On April 15, 2020, Governor Whitmer issued Executive

12 Order 2020-50, requiring nursing homes with a census below 80

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- 1 percent to create a dedicated unit for the care of COVID-19-
- 2 affected residents. This led to COVID-19-affected residents being
- 3 placed in the same facilities as residents without the disease,
- 4 increasing the risk of disease spread in an already vulnerable
- 5 population. The order also required facilities without dedicated
- 6 units to transfer COVID-19-affected residents to regional hubs,
- 7 which are dedicated exclusively to the care of COVID-19-affected
- 8 residents; and
- 9 Whereas, Particularly in the early days of the COVID-19
- 10 Pandemic, the Governor's policies placed COVID-19-affected
- 11 residents in nursing homes that were ill-prepared to both care for
- 12 them and prevent the spread of the disease to other residents.
- 13 Understaffing and a lack of testing and personal protective
- 14 equipment (PPE) compounded the enormous challenges facilities
- 15 already faced; and
- 16 Whereas, COVID-19 has ravaged Michigan nursing homes with more
- 17 than 1,200 deaths occurring in these settings, which makes up about
- 18 23 percent of all Michigan deaths from COVID-19. The Whitmer
- 19 administration has been slow to release nursing home data, and the
- 20 available data continues to be woefully inadequate, making it
- 21 difficult to see the full impact of these detrimental policies; and
- 22 Whereas, Despite evidence of the significant flaws in the
- 23 initial nursing home policies, Executive Order 2020-95, issued May
- 24 20, 2020, continues to put nursing home residents in harm's way by
- 25 placing COVID-19-affected residents in the same facilities as other
- 26 residents; and
- Whereas, Ensuring the health and well-being of the state's
- 28 most vulnerable residents during the COVID-19 Pandemic is of the
- 29 upmost importance. The Whitmer administration must be held

- 1 accountable for these decisions. It is imperative that Michigan's
- 2 flawed nursing home policies are replaced by policies that will
- 3 protect nursing home residents today and in the future; now,
- 4 therefore, be it
- 5 Resolved by the Senate, That we denounce the Governor's policy
- 6 placing COVID-19 positive residents with uninfected residents in
- 7 nursing homes; and be it further
- 8 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 9 Governor.
